U-19 RAPTORS COMPLETE THE PERFECT SOCCER SEASON

Perfection is not easily attained, but it is something the Watchung Hills Soccer Association U-19 Raptors can lay claim to following an unblemished spring season.

Compiling a 10-0 record in the regular season, the Raptors' road to the U-19 Mid NJ Championship in June included a 4-1 semifinal victory over Woodbridge Barccelona and a 3-1 triumph over Cranford Rush in the final.

"Perfect seasons do not come around very often, and they are never products of luck," said Matthew Murphy, the team's trainer from the United Soccer Academy. "We went 12-0, we won our flight, and we won the MNJ title. We scored over 50 goals and conceded only 5. It really doesn't get much better than that."

The Raptors are comprised of soccer players from the Watchung Hills sending district towns of Warren, Watchung, Long Hill and Green Brook. Many of the players were active on the Watchung Hills Regional High School varsity soccer squad, though the team also includes players from Rutgers

Prep and Morris Catholic. Many of the members graduated in the WHRHS 2018 class, and are attending colleges such as Cornell, Rensselaer Polytechnic, UCal-Berkeley and Michigan in the fall.

"We started with a solid group of players who really love the game, but needed to quickly learn to work together to play at a very high level," said Michael Cantone, the head coach and a longtime WHSA volunteer. "I'm proud that the values of the team – respect, teamwork and focus – were apparent in every game and training session. ... They play soccer like the beautiful game it is meant to be."

"They are winners, and I have no doubt that success will follow them wherever they go in life," Murphy said.

The Watchung Hills Soccer Association provides recreational, travel and elite soccer programs primarily for children in Warren, Watchung, Green Brook and Long Hill. There are more than 1,200 children in the program.



JOURNEY THROUGH THE PAST

Well here we are, October already. Therefore it is time for the 12th annual Somerset County Journey Through the Past. In Green Brook we display the same two historic sites as we have in recent years. Obviously most of you have gone to Washington Rock for the view and even taken guests from out of town there. But the Journey provides you the chance to interact with historians that will tell you more, answer you questions and point out places on the landscape that you never have noticed before. If we have a clear day, a view of 31 miles can be seen that is unrivaled.

Or you can visit us at the Dr. John Vermeule House on Rock Avenue. Very few of you have had the opportunity to see the progress in the restoration of that future Living Historic House Museum from the late 1700's through the 1900's. The first floor will be open and artifacts displayed outside, weather permitting and our limited new herb garden kindly provided to us as an Eagle Scout project.

The County has thirty historic sites provided free of charge and an opportunity to see many sites seldom open or only open at limited times. Start with any site and you will receive a booklet with sites and a map to follow to all the sites. The sites in our neighboring communities are The Vermeule Mansion in North Plainfield, The Texier House Museum in Watchung, and the Codington Farmhouse, and the Kirch-Ford-Terrill House and the Mt. Bethel Baptist meeting House all in Warren.

For a video go to Somerset County Journey -2018. The hours of the Journey are 10 a.m. - 5 p.m. on Saturday the October 14 and noon to 4 p.m. on Sunday October 15.



RHEA KALYANPUR RECEIVES GIRL SCOUT'S HIGHEST HONOR

Rhea Kalyanpur, a Girl Scout with troop 65469, completed her Gold Award project in April 2018 by creating study aides for children in India. The Gold Award is the highest achievement a Girl Scout can earn. Rhea is the daughter of Arti and Rajesh Kalyanpur. She is currently a senior at Watchung Hills Regional High School. Below she writes about her project.

Study Aides for Students Project Submitted by Rhea Kalyanpur

Education has always been a great blessing to me. Since a young age, I have loved to learn and also to teach others. I remember after school, I used to run home to tell my parents what I had learned that day. As I grew older, I knew that I wanted to share my love for education with other students. After traveling to India, I decided that I wanted to help the students there. At the same time, I wondered how this would be possible, since I am just a sixteen year old who lives halfway across the world.

In high school, I have been taking a child development class where we work in a preschool and learn how to teach children. Here, we are taught many techniques that would help the children learn. I learnt that many children learn better when doing hands-on activities. By using these activities, children are able to grasp concepts faster and enjoy learning more! With this new knowledge, I knew exactly how I would be able to spread my love for learning to the students in India, I decided to create study aides to send to the school. The study aides would be able to help engage the students by reinforcing the topics they have learnt or are learning now.

I created study aides that would not only act

as study mechanisms but also as toys for the cards at the end wins! children to have fun, at the same time. I was so excited to create these study aides and contacted a non-profit organization that builds schools in India. I talked to the principal of the school and she gave me many useful tips on what to include in the aides. I obtained advice from my child development teacher and finalized the study aides. I made four types of study aides: Book Discussion kits, Puzzles, Spinner Games, and a Learning Binder.

To fund my project, I presented my ideas during cultural gatherings and was met with great generosity. Lots of families donated to support my study aides project. I was also amazed when some of the 8-10 year old girls from this group were inspired by my project and organized a lemonade stand and collected money for the study aides. I also raised money by doing henna tattoos for my friends as well as at birthday parties.

After raising money for the project, I got right to work. Here are the details of the study aides that I created:

Puzzles - I chose colorful and interesting pictures for the puzzles so it would be enjoyable for the children. I printed questions on back of each puzzle piece and answers were written on the backboard of the puzzle, students would need to match questions with the right answers and in the process build the entire puzzle board.

Spinner Games - I created a spinner with a variety of questions including topics from math, science, English, history and geography. The children will play this game by spinning the spinner and answering the question that it points to. The child keeps the card if the question is answered correctly. The child with the most

Book Discussion kits - I love to read so this was my favorite one to create! This includes many copies of books with worksheets and activities. The children can read the books in groups or by themselves and complete the activities.

Learning Binder - I made laminated learning activities covering many topics, like the alphabet, numbers, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division and body parts. The children will have to complete the learning activity by matching or solving the question on the placemat to detachable smaller pieces. For example, a child will have to match the word "nose" to the picture of the nose.

I also laminated all paper in the study aides to make sure they were durable. I really loved working on the study aides as I got to showcase some of my favorite subjects like math and reading. My family helped me a lot through this journey. I am very grateful and thankful for all their help. I am also very grateful for the support of my supervisors, Mrs. Van Arsdale and Mrs. Potter, without their help I wouldn't have been able to complete this project.

After sending the study aides to India, I knew that I had been able to spread my love for education to the students there. I achieved my Gold Award in June and was honored by Mayor Boccio as well. Although I had been afraid that it would not be possible, with a strong team, many generous people and hard work my project was all a success. I want to encourage everyone to help others in any way possible. Any action is not too small and can change someone's life. I hope that the students enjoy the study aides and develop a strong love for education.



FREE DOCUMENT SHREDDING EVENT IN OCTOBER

The next "Operation Secure Shred," the free document-shredding program for Somerset County residents will be held on October 20, 2018 at Green Brook Middle School, 132 Jefferson Ave.

The Somerset County Public Works Department invite residents to take advantage of the drop-off program for easy, no-hassle shredding of personal documents.

The events are held rain or shine, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., or until the trucks are filled to capacity, at which time they leave and the event is over for that day. A valid New Jersey driver's license to confirm Somerset County residency is required. Pre-registration is not required. No businesses are allowed.

Residents from all 21 Somerset County municipalities are invited to have personal documents shredded at as many free, on-site mobile paper-shredding events as they wish to attend. Residents do not have to reside in the town hosting an event to participate.

Documents will be commercially shredded safely, privately and properly by trained, licensed and bonded document-destruction specialists. Staples and paperclips do not have to be removed. Residents may bring documents in up to six boxes, containers or bags per visit and will be asked to take back their receptacles. Residents may stay and watch as their documents are shredded.

Junk mail, magazines, and newspapers will not be accepted. This shredding opportunity is not open to businesses.

For more information about locations of the municipal shredding events, contact the towns directly. A listing of towns in Somerset County can be found on the county's website, co.somerset.nj.us. A schedule of shredding events and more also is available.
