## **WORLD WAR I LECTURE SERIES AT LIBERTY HALL MUSEUM TALKS EXPAND ON BROTHERS IN ARMS EXHIBITION**

Liberty Hall Museum at Kean University's popular World War I exhibit, Brothers in Arms: Memories of the Great War, will draw to a close with a series of lectures exploring the impact of the war on New Jersey and the United States.

Funded by a grant from the Union County Office of Cultural and Heritage Affairs, the lecture series will feature three World War I historians who will elaborate on and bring additional context to the Brothers in Arms exhibition. The exhibition opened last year on the 100th anniversary of the U.S. entering World War I and will close on November 15, a few days after the centennial anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended the war.

The first lecture, Good War, Great Men, was held on Thursday, September 27 at 3 p.m., featuring author Andrew Capets.


The second lecture in the series, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, and World War I, will be held on Thursday, October 25 at 3 p.m. and will feature Professor Melissa Ziobro of Monmouth University. Ziobro's talk will share the significant breakthroughs created at Fort Monmouth and the important contributions made not only by the fort, but the military men and women stationed there during the war.

The final lecture, Uncle Sam Wants You: World War I and the Making of the Modern American Citizen, will be held on Thursday, November 15 at 3 p.m., and will feature Christopher Capozzola of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Capozzola will discuss his book, Uncle Sam Wants You and the history of citizenship, war and the military in modern American history.

The Brothers in Arms exhibition shares the story of the Kean brothers - Captain John Kean and First Lt. Robert W. Kean — and their experiences of the war from boot camp to the front lines. Using firsthand accounts from letters and postcards, as well as photographs and personal objects, the exhibition allows visitors to walk in their footsteps. The collection at Liberty Hall Museum contains over 300 letters from John and Robert as well as their uniforms, military handbooks, maps, pictures and commemorative pins, all of which are on display.

Admission to each lecture is free with an optional tour of Brothers in Arms at 2 p.m. for a discounted price of \$8. Light refreshments will be served. Liberty Hall Museum at Kean University is located at 1003 Morris Avenue, Union, New Jersey.





## \*October 2018 "FOUR CENTURIES IN A WEEKEND" PROGRAM AT THE OSWALD J. NITSCHKE HOUSE TO PROVIDE GLIMPSES OF LIFE DURING WORLD WAR I

Living History Program Set in 1918 to Feature installed paved path that makes the site's World War I Victory Garden, Colorful Characters from the Past and More -- "teaching gardens" accessible to everyone, including those with physical

Visitors to Kenilworth's historic Oswald J. Nitschke House (c. 1880) at 49 South 21 Street on October 20 and October 21, 2018 will experience life during World War I through an enlightening and entertaining "living history" program featuring colorful characters from the past.

The program, set in the year 1918, when the war was drawing to a close, will highlight a guided tour of the site that additionally will feature a World War I Victory Garden, a related garden-to-table culinary demonstration and a presentation of World War I recollections compiled by David Brearley Middle/High School student Michael Naya, Jr. as part of an oral history project that he undertook to learn about and honor veterans of various wars. A new exhibition, "The Allure and Challenges of Life in an Early 20th-Century Suburb," will be open for viewing in the Nitschke House exhibition center.

Visitors also will be able to view the site's new "Kenilworth Heritage Walkway" featuring numerous engraved commemorative pavers that have been donated by local residents and businesses. The walkway is part of a newly

"teaching gardens" accessible to everyone, including those with physical challenges/disabilities. The paved path, together with a recently constructed pergola and fencing, are part of a major garden construction project made possible through funding generously provided by the Merck Foundation. The project significantly supports and enhances the site's multicultural garden-to-table foodways program, which shows the importance of home food gardens in the lifeways of the Nitschkes and other late 19th-century immigrants and which additionally demonstrates the continued benefit of gardening in promoting good health, an appreciation of nature and a sense of environmental stewardship.

The October 20-21 weekend activities at the Nitschke House will be presented for the general public from 12 to 5 p.m. during Union County's annual historic sites tour, "Four Centuries in a Weekend." Admission is free. Union County Across the Centuries History Trading Cards for David Brearley (1745-1790), Hannah Sayre Caldwell (1737-1780) and Tin Kettle Hill (1780-1906) will be available at the Nitschke House. The site is equipped with an elevator and is fully accessible. For further information, please call 908-709-0434.

The featured exhibition at the Nitschke House is being made possible in part by a 2018 HEART (History, Education, Arts Reaching Thousands) Grant from Union County. Funding for other aspects of the site's weekend program is being provided, in part, by the Kenilworth Municipal Alliance Against Alcohol and Drug Abuse/GCADA.

The Nitschke House, home of former Kenilworth Mayor Oswald J. Nitschke (1867-1934), features five historic rooms, which are authentically furnished in late 19th-/early 20th-century style and interpreted primarily in the 1905-1934 period (the time of Kenilworth's first wave of suburban development when Oswald Nitschke made his greatest contributions to its growth), an exhibition center and a cultural arts

center.

The Kenilworth Historical Society saved the Nitschke House by moving it in 2003, following Dr. Jerome Forman's donation of the building to the Society, to its present location (land acquired with the help of the Kenilworth Veterans Center and a New Jersey DEP Green Acres grant).

The Society's project to restore and transform the Nitschke House into Kenilworth's first "living history" museum and cultural arts center has been funded, in large part, by historic preservation/rehabilitation grants awarded by the New Jersey Historic Trust, New Jersey Cultural Trust, Preserve Union County Grant Program, Union County Community Development Block Grant program, E.J. Grassmann Trust, The Hyde and Watson Foundation, 1772 Foundation, Schering-Plough Corporation, the Merck Foundation, and numerous individual, corporate and institutional donors and grant makers. Connolly & Hickey Historical Architects (Cranford) designed the elevator addition, as well as the plans for the building's exterior and interior restoration, and Wagner Construction (Kenilworth) carried out the extensive interior restoration.

The Nitschke House project was recognized by the State of New Jersey with a 2008 New Jersey Historic Preservation Award and was cited as one of six "success stories" statewide in the 2011-2016 New Jersey Historic Preservation Plan, "Preserving New Jersey's Heritage: A Statewide Plan."

The Kenilworth Historical Society (www.kenilworthhistoricalsociety.org) is an independent, volunteer-based, non-profit, taxexempt, 501(c)(3) organization dedicated to the research, preservation and interpretation of the historic Oswald J. Nitschke House, local history and culture. 





# WHAT, WHERE, AND WHEN IN OLD KENILWORTH HARDING SCHOOL TURNS 94 YEARS OLD

Ninety-four years ago, on Saturday, October 4, 1924, Kenilworth's Harding Elementary School was dedicated with considerable fanfare. The McKinley School which opened in 1902, which held a grade level of children from kindergarten through grade eight, was over capacity. The school board determined to erect a new school rather than to expand McKinley. Upon completion of the new school a dedication ceremony was held.

Resident Helen Dellar, the Borough's first woman board of education member and one of the first in New Jersey, chaired the festivities. Board president W. K. Mergott and County school superintendent Dr. Arthur L. Johnson, presented remarks. Local businessman and philanthropist Joseph Shallcross, board vice president, accepted gifts for the school including an American flag from the Volunteer Fire Department. Pastor Homer Henderson of the Methodist Church provided prayers. William J. Deans, popular principal, accepted the keys from the architect. A 20-piece orchestra entertained the

full-house crowd in the new 495 seat auditorium. system was ballyhooed as assuring a pleasant The school was heralded as being "of the most modern design" and "one of which every citizen can well be proud." It was boasted as being a

"fireproof structure." The school had nine classrooms, indoor lavatories, offices, and separate teacher lounges for male and female teachers. The auditorium balcony had a motion picture projection booth and films during off school hours were shown for an admission of ten cents. The stage doubled as the gymnasium which itself featured locker rooms and showers. A mechanical ventilation learning environment for all seasons.

The land was acquired for \$5,000; furniture, equipment, and sidewalks were budgeted at \$10,131; and construction was \$102,710. Total cost came to the sum of \$117,841. In the 1950s and 1960s additions were constructed which housed an enrollment of nearly 1,300 students.
