



### **VISIT THE SALT BOX MUSEUM DURING** "FOUR CENTURIES IN A WEEKEND" PROGRAM

The New Providence Historical Society's Salt which salt used to be stored. Box Museum will once again participate in Union County's annual program, "Four Centuries in a Weekend". The museum will be open Saturday, October 20, 2018 from 10:00 a.m. -5:00 p.m. and Sunday, October 21 from 12:00 noon - 5:00 p.m.

If weather permits we will have on display several early American tools. We have a few American Red Cross uniforms from WWII. These uniforms were worn by local residents who volunteered their time during the war. A favorite of our members is our Ballot box with the ballots. This was used for 2 elections in 1912 and 1916 while New Providence was a Township, which at that time included parts of Berkeley Heights and Summit.

Our Salt Box Museum consists of two houses constructed at different locations during the 1800's. They were joined in the mid-19th century. The building, now known as the Salt Box Museum, was created. The house's shape, with its steep, sloping rear roof, resembles the box in call 908-665-1034.

In 1967, the entire house was moved across Springfield Avenue to its present site. Today the first floor is furnished to represent a typical New Jersey farmhouse of the mid-19th century, featuring 1840's furnishings, dresses of the 1800s and 1900s, hand-woven coverlet, Brewster clock, and a hay wagon on the lawn.


