### **WORLD WAR I LECTURE SERIES AT LIBERTY HALL MUSEUM**

Liberty Hall Museum at Kean University's popular World War I exhibit, Brothers in Arms: Memories of the Great War, will draw to a close with a series of lectures exploring the impact of the war on New Jersey and the United States.

Funded by a grant from the Union County Office of Cultural and Heritage Affairs, the lecture series will feature three World War I historians who will elaborate on and bring additional context to the Brothers in Arms exhibition. The exhibition opened last year on the 100th anniversary of the U.S. entering World War I and will close on November 15, a few days after the centennial anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended the war.

The first lecture, Good War, Great Men, was held on Thursday, September 27 at 3 p.m., featuring author Andrew Capets.

The second lecture in the series, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, and World War I, will be held on Thursday, October 25 at 3 p.m. and will feature Professor Melissa Ziobro of Monmouth University. Ziobro's talk will share the significant breakthroughs created at Fort Monmouth and the important contributions made not only by the fort, but the military men and women stationed there during the war.

The final lecture, Uncle Sam Wants You: World War I and the Making of the Modern American Citizen, will be held on Thursday, November 15 at 3 p.m., and will feature Christopher Capozzola of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Capozzola will discuss his book, Uncle Sam Wants You and the history of citizenship, war and the military in modern American history.

The Brothers in Arms exhibition shares the

story of the Kean brothers — Captain John Kean

and First Lt. Robert W. Kean — and their experiences of the war from boot camp to the front lines. Using firsthand accounts from letters and postcards, as well as photographs and personal objects, the exhibition allows visitors to walk in their footsteps. The collection at Liberty Hall Museum contains over 300 letters from John and Robert as well as their uniforms, military handbooks, maps, pictures and commemorative pins, all of which are on display. Admission to each lecture is free with an





### RESCUE SQUAD MEDICAL MYSTERY – WHAT IS ALL THAT NOISE I HEAR?

The world can be a noisy place. Sometimes you just have to get away from it all, find a quiet place and relax.

However, what if the noise was coming from inside your own head? What if you could not get away from it, ever? For people who suffer from Superior Canal Dehiscence Syndrome (SCDS), it can make everyday living a nightmare.

As reported on Hopkinsmedicine.org, "Researchers at Johns Hopkins identified superior canal dehiscence syndrome (SCDS) in 1995. This condition involves an abnormal opening in the uppermost canal of the vestibule of the inner ear. SCDS may be caused by the bony surface of the canal not growing to its normal thickness during development."

Common bodily functions, such as chewing or swallowing appear very loud. Those afflicted can even sometimes hear their own heartbeats or the blood coursing through their veins. And any external noises, such as coughing, speaking or a telephone ringing can cause vertigo, blurred vision, headaches, anxiety and nausea since every sound is amplified. Flying, head trauma, or any straining, such as giving birth or heavy lifting, can cause symptoms to appear. Some people also notice it as they grow older.

According to rarediseases.info.nih.gov, others with SCDS may experience an echo when speaking or chewing, and/or think that items that are stationary are actually moving. Until recently, these complaints were considered psychosomatic and patients were often referred to psychiatrists.

Once diagnosed, the only way to fix the condition is through surgery. Additional physical therapy may be needed to overcome any lingering dizziness. For more information, go to the SCDS Society website at scdssociety.com/scds/.





STEM stands for the academic disciplines of science, technology, engineering mathematics.

"The purpose of the Governor's STEM Scholars is to take New Jersey's best and brightest STEM students and introduce them to what New Jersey has to offer in terms of higher education, internships and careers," says David Hodges, director of the program.

Admission is highly selective. Of nearly 500 applicants from all over the state, only 80 were chosen. The selection process uses a rigorous criteria including character, leadership ability and STEM aptitude.

Founded in 2013, the Governor's STEM Scholars program is a statewide STEM education initiative for New Jersey students in grades 10 through the PhD level. The goal is to educate students about STEM opportunities within the state, as well as to encourage New Jersey's economic development by further developing the state's STEM talent pipeline.

The program offers four themed conferences throughout the school year and work in a STEM-related research project. There are field trips to research and development facilities and face-to-face meetings with STEM professionals and state policymakers.

### SCOTCH PLAINS' JUDY STURM NAMED ADVOCATE FOR FOSTER YOUTH

Scotch Plains is among 11 Union County towns represented recently by volunteers sworn in as court appointed special advocates (CASAs), thanks to resident Judy Sturm, who says, "I decided to become a CASA after spending many years as an officer for a local non-profit board. I wanted an opportunity to work directly with those who needed help the most. I am looking forward to making a positive difference in the life of a child."

Superior Court Judge James Hely administered oaths to Sturm and others from Cranford, Elizabeth, Fanwood, Hillside, Linden, Plainfield, Rahway, Roselle, Summit and Westfield, before they were matched to a foster youth or sibling set ranging from birth to age 21. After court observation of experienced CASA volunteers in action, the new advocates will meet their assigned youth.

Volunteers with Court Appointed Special Advocates of Union County are extra eyes and ears for family law judges hearing cases involving abused, neglected or abandoned children removed from home and placed in foster care. With court-ordered access to such parties as

foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers, the advocates incorporate findings into court reports for the judge and work to ensure the youth's needs are met and best interests are protected. CASA volunteers serve another important role for their youth: being a constant amid a flurry of unknowns and changes, including multiple caseworkers, foster homes and schools.

This class ranges from age 23 to 70 and includes parents, non-parents, business and medical professionals, county employees, retirees and homemakers. One was adopted from foster care and another has guardianship of nieces from the system. Most had no prior knowledge of the foster system.

It's crucial that each of the more than 500 Union County foster youth have an advocate. As the only organization filling this role, community volunteers are still needed, and are encouraged to join one of the fall training sessions that begin September 17 (evenings) and October 12 (daytime).
