MIKE APRILE PREPS FOR NATIURAL BODY BUILDING EVENT

When it comes to building his body, Warren's Mike Aprile is a natural.

Aprile, at the age of 46, is training for his first men's physique show competition for 100 percent natural athletes in November.

"Being a natural athlete at 46 was important to me as many men my age take performance enhancing drugs and testosterone replacement therapy in untested competitions," Aprile said. "Since this will be my first show and I'm already nervous enough, I just wanted it to be an even playing field knowing everyone was also a one hundred percent natural athlete."

Aprile works out at Crunch Fitness on South Avenue in Garwood. He expects to compete in the masters and novice divisions, and possibly the open division, at the Bloomfield competition, hosted by the National Gym Association.

"Men's physique competitions are somewhat different then men's body building competitions," Aprile said. "One of the differences is that you have to wear knee-length board shorts, while in body building you wear a Speedo. You must pose in front of judges for pre-judging in the early afternoon, then in front of the judges and an audience later in the evening. ...

Judges will weigh more on overall stage presence and personality in men's physique than in bodybuilding."

Personality counts, but so does diet, exercise and technique. Enter professional trainer Robb Capponeto from South Jersey.

"Coach Robb gets my diet right and teaches me how to pose on stage in front of the judges while trying to build my confidence up and fat levels down," Aprile said.


"I have never been on a stage in my life and that aspect of it is probably the scariest part for me."

This lifestyle change introduced Aprile and his wife, Donna, to what they call meal prepping.

"We basically prepare two days' worth of meals at a time, which consists of about 12 containers of food that have to be consumed every two-and-a-half hours, six times a day," Aprile said. "You are basically eating chicken/fish, green veggies, sweet potatoes, egg whites and oats for 12 to 13 weeks without anything else entering your body. Add a full gallon of water every day and trust me, you're ready for a rubber room."

Still, Aprile wouldn't have it any other way.

"My first child, Gianna, was born in February of 1999 and after six months of paying gym dues and not going even once, I canceled my membership at 27 years old," Aprile said. "I always planned on getting back to the gym and revisit

my 'Glory Days' but life got in the way."

Now Aprile is back, smarter and fitter than ever.

"I've learned it's never too late to accomplish anything," he said. "If you put one hundred percent of your heart and effort into it, your body will follow."

FREE DOCUMENT SHREDDING EVENT IN OCTOBER

The next "Operation Secure Shred," the free document-shredding program for Somerset County residents will be held on October 20, 2018 at Green Brook Middle School, 132 Jefferson Ave.

The Somerset County Public Works Department invite residents to take advantage of the drop-off program for easy, no-hassle shredding of personal documents.

The events are held rain or shine, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., or until the trucks are filled to capacity, at which time they leave and the event is over for that day. A valid New Jersey driver's license to confirm Somerset County residency is required. Pre-registration is not required. No businesses are allowed

Residents from all 21 Somerset County municipalities are invited to have personal documents shredded at as many free, on-site mobile paper-shredding events as they wish to attend. Residents do not have to reside in the town hosting an event to participate.

Documents will be commercially shredded safely, privately and properly by trained, licensed and bonded document-destruction specialists. Staples and paperclips do not have to be removed. Residents may bring documents in up to six boxes, containers or bags per visit and will be asked to take back their receptacles. Residents may stay and watch as their documents are shredded.

Junk mail, magazines, and newspapers will not be accepted. This shredding opportunity is not open to businesses.

U-19 RAPTORS COMPLETE THE PERFECT SOCCER SEASON

Perfection is not easily attained, but it is doesn't get much better than that." something the Watchung Hills Soccer Association U-19 Raptors can lay claim to following an unblemished spring season.

Compiling a 10-0 record in the regular season, the Raptors' road to the U-19 Mid NJ Championship in June included a 4-1 semifinal victory over Woodbridge Barccelona and a 3-1 triumph over Cranford Rush in the final.

"Perfect seasons do not come around very often, and they are never products of luck," said Matthew Murphy, the team's trainer from the United Soccer Academy. "We went 12-0, we won our flight, and we won the MNJ title. We scored over 50 goals and conceded only 5. It really

The Raptors are comprised of soccer players from the Watchung Hills sending district towns of Warren, Watchung, Long Hill and Green Brook. Many of the players were active on the Watchung Hills Regional High School varsity soccer squad, though the team also includes players from Rutgers Prep and Morris Catholic. Many of the members graduated in the WHRHS 2018 class, and are attending colleges such as Cornell, Rensselaer Polytechnic, UCal-Berkeley and Michigan in the fall.

"We started with a solid group of players who really love the game, but needed to quickly learn to work together to play at a very high level,"

said Michael Cantone, the head coach and a longtime WHSA volunteer. "I'm proud that the values of the team – respect, teamwork and focus - were apparent in every game and training session. ... They play soccer like the beautiful game it is meant to be."

"They are winners, and I have no doubt that success will follow them wherever they go in life," Murphy said.



"HOW VOLUNTEERING TRANSFORMED ME:" AN INTERVIEW WITH CARING CONTACT VOLUNTEER

Each year approximately 45,000 people die by suicide in the United States, 120 people each day, one person every 12 minutes. Though this tragically large number continues to increase annually, there is work being done to reverse this trajectory.

Caring Contact is an award-winning, volunteer-staffed crisis hotline and listening community. We compassionately serve those in emotional distress and educate our communities about the power of personal connection. In 2017, our volunteers responded to over 10,000 calls

through our caring and crisis line. Contact Listeners are volunteers who listen to people in crisis over the phone. They receive 52 hours of listening and suicide awareness and intervention training before assisting people in need of support. Even after this rigorous training, most listeners are surprised by how volunteering transforms them. To give you a sense of their experience, here is an interview with a current Caring Contact volunteer listener (whose name is being withheld).

What is your professional background?

I am a recent college graduate. I studied Sociology and Psychology.

How would you describe your listening skills? I would regard myself as a quiet listener. I know that probably sounds weird or maybe even obvious. But, after the training I realized how much talking I was doing when people were venting to me. Before I became a trained listener I don't think I realized how powerful the act of listening can be or how difficult it is sometimes. I used to be distracted when listening to people and I missed a lot. Through the training I've attached a real purpose to listening and listening well, which has made me better in a variety of

aspects in my life.
Tell me about your training.

The training struck this balance between easing the volunteers into the material and also challenging people in ways that were a bit nerveracking. I remember my first practice session where I was acting as the Listener. All I was supposed to do was listen and reflect on a feeling or two. This, honestly, turned out to be one of the most difficult role plays because all I wanted to do was solve what seemed like an obvious problem to me, rather than just really listen to what the person was saying.

I found that the training applied to both the hotline and also my everyday life. I think everyone's family members and friends are grateful when a person takes this training. I also loved the growth of each volunteer, it is so clearly visible because of the practice sessions and utilization of the skills we learned - there is a lot of development throughout those 12 weeks.

Do you ever feel like you get a call you can't handle? How do you cope?

The first few crisis calls were really scary. I remember that I decided on those few phone calls to just be there and to sit with the person in this dark, dark hole. By the end of the call we had developed a safety plan and the person was safe in that moment. After these types of calls, I usually debrief with someone in the office or another volunteer who is working at the same time as me.

Also, there is a bell in the phone room which lets someone in the office know you need help. There was one instance when my phone call got disconnected because I was so shaken up and didn't know what to do. Janet Sarkos, the Executive Director at Caring Contact and a volunteer listener, came in and talked me through the call. It's things like that that make the

overwhelming calls easier. It's really helpful to be surrounded by people who have had similar calls, speaking to them is a huge way of coping for me.

What types of calls are most challenging?

Any call that involves someone being really down, feeling stuck and alone. Those are hard calls. They aren't necessarily difficult to manage, but so many of these calls stick with me and I want to do more, to change their living situations and that's just not possible. I think the most difficult calls are those that end before it seems like we have reached a safe plan, or have made enough progress - this has happened before and it's really hard to let those calls go.

Which call was really memorable for you?

One of the most memorable calls was from a college student. We talked for about 45 minutes. He told me that he's never told anyone the things that he's told me during our phone call. He disclosed that if he had not picked up the phone and talked to me, that he was planning on running in front of a truck on the highway. Knowing that someone called and just by speaking to me for an hour felt like they could go on for one more day, that's very powerful.

How did becoming a listener change you?

Being a listener has opened my eyes to how many people are struggling, how many people think about suicide but don't tell those they are close to. I now feel comfortable asking those I am close to if they are struggling or thinking of suicide. That's something I never would have done if it hadn't been for this training and experience. I now know how powerful listening can be, just listening to another person. It can change their life.



"In April my good friend Bob passed away from ALS," he says. "That's how I got hooked up with Team ALS."




"Bob Stilson was a high school teacher of mine," Gedbaw says. "He was a mentor and really the first adult who showed me there was a


