HEIGHTS HEAT 8U SOFTBALL TEAM WINS COLONIAL CHAMPIONSHIP


The Heights Heat 8U softball team swept a three-game playoff series to win the Fall 2018 Colonial Championship against the Warren Wolverines. Two of the games ended in dramatic walk-off fashion with big hits by a pair of the team's third-grade sluggers.

Heights Heat veterans Alexandra Duryee, Ava Garcia, Allison Nelson, Alyson Sayre, Annie Young and Lucia Xhelo stepped on the field in September ready to defend their 8U Parkway League championship over the summer. Heights Heat regulars, Analise Javier and Hallie Stein, and a very strong Heat rookie class featuring Emilyn Anderson, Mia Bussin, Ellis Duff, Carly Figlar and Emma Mulroy, joined them for the fall season hosted by Long Hill.

In Game One, the Heat battled against a great defensive effort by Warren in the early innings, and was down 12-6 after four innings. In the top of the fifth, two great catches by Nelson at third base, one on a grounder to Duryee for the second out and one on a grounder to left field, featuring a great stop and throw by Anderson, helped the Heat hold Warren to just a single run. With that momentum, the Heat racked up a total of 10 hits as the girls rallied in their final at-bat to erase a seven-run deficit and win the game 14-13 to take a 1-0 lead in the series. Duryee crushed a double beyond the reach of the Warren shortstop to drive in the tying run, scoring Young from second base, before Sayre singled home Anderson on the first pitch of her at-bat for the walk-off win.

Strong defense and their best offensive performance of the season sent the Heat out to a

10-3 lead after two innings in Game Two; a lead they would not relinquish. At catcher, Xhelo made multiple outs at the plate, including a great catch on a force out in the first inning to help stifle a Warren rally. At pitcher, Duryee stopped countless ground balls and had four assists. For good measure, the right side of the infield combined to make one of the defensive highlights of the season in the final inning as Young stopped a tough grounder at second base and got the ball to Sayre at first, who made an impressive backhanded stretch catch to secure the out. The final score was 17-9.

Game Three was a nail biter with both teams combining to score 33 runs. At pitcher, second graders Anderson and Duff stopped multiple balls, and Javier snared a catch that made the crowd of family and friends cheer. Extra-base hits were slugged by Duryee, Sayre and Stein.

With the Heat down one run heading into the final inning, a one-out rally was sparked by the speedy combination of Garcia and Duff, who scored the winning run on a double crushed into the outfield by Stein. The final score was 17-16.



Volunteers are sworn in by a judge and given court-ordered access to a child and report findings to the judge, working to ensure the youth's best interests remain a priority while working toward establishing a safe, stable and permanent home for each child.



FALL 2018 LEAF AND YARD DEBRIS COLLECTION PROGRAM

The Fall Leaf and Yard Debris Collection process more efficient for everyone. Program commenced the second week of October. The Town will be divided into five (5) sections and each section will have a brush pickup on the first day of the scheduled week for that area, weather permitting. Leaves and brush will be picked up concurrently.

FOR BRUSH COLLECTION:

All brush must be out for pick-up on the first day of the scheduled week for the section. Absolutely no brush will be collected once a section is marked as completed. Residents are advised that there will be no more than one brush pick-up per household. If for some reason you are missed you MUST contact the Department of Works via publicworks@bhtwp.com or telephone 464-0427 within 24 hours. This is assumed that your neighbor's debris is gone but yours is not. Sections will be marked completed by crew lead men and double checked by department foremen; we ask that you kindly do not put out additional brush after the Department has cleaned your neighborhood, as it will not be picked up.

The only accepted brush will be sticks and branches less than four inches (4") in diameter, five feet (5') in length, tied and bundled with twine. We will be going through sections streetby-street with a large machine and a bucket that can grab multiple pieces of debris- having them bundled together means we can move more brush with fewer movements and make the entire

Piles will be rejected for the presence of lumber, building materials, leaves, roots, stumps, briars, vines, badly decayed branches, dirt, rocks and metal. They will also be rejected if they are bundled with anything other than twine. Please be advised that including these items can cause damage to equipment and physical harm to personnel. If your pile is rejected you can call within 24 hours of that rejection and we will return when you have removed the offending materials.

FOR LEAF COLLECTION:

Leaves should be put into paper bags and left curb side, accessible by machine. We use a process of loading the leaves into a compacting truck body in order to clean an area safely and efficiently. Please do not include any other type of debris in your leaf bags.

Leaf collection will continue across all sections for the duration of the cleanup program, we understand that volume can be intermittent and that one week you may have no leaves and the next everything is ready to be cleaned up. The program is scheduled to end on Friday, December 19th. Please anticipate having your leaves bagged and placed curb side at least two weeks before this date so that we are able to pick them up in a timely fashion.

The Special Children's Committee sponsors several functions a year for special children and




