Exhibitors are members of B.I.G., a women empowerment organization founded by Tara Gilvar, that exists to help women unlock their true potential and that has touched the lives of more than 3,000 women across 75 different towns in NJ, NY, CT and MA since 2009.

After the success of its first Chatham Expo, the organization plans to continue to offer this event annually, as a way to support its members in their efforts to network and expand their business opportunities.


CHATHAM HIGH PRESENTS RADIUM GIRLS



SEPTUAGENARIAN PUBLISHES BOOK OF BLOGS

Helene Shalotsky has just published her first book, "The Sunny Side." A Chatham resident for 42 years, Shalotsky had the great joy of teaching sixth grade in Madison's Kings Road School for 26 of those 42 years. Both of these experiences were especially wonderful and are now reflected in her book.

The book addresses Parents, Children, Teachers, Thankfulness, Blessings, Word Power, Friendships and many more topics that aim to shine a light on life's sunnier side. This was Helene Shalotsky's aim as a wife, mother, teacher, and friend, and it is now her aim as a writer.

The author graduated Cum Laude from Queens College and taught for four years in Brooklyn, New York. By the 1970's, she was a New Jersey resident and began her career as a sixth grade teacher in Madison.




