### **HISTORIC SITE MARKER PLACED AT MILLINGTON STATION**


A dedication ceremony was held on September 28, 2018, at the Millington Railroad Station in Long Hill Township unveiling a Morris County Heritage Commission historic site marker. The Commission received an application for the marker from the Long Hill Township Historic Preservation Advisory Committee (HPAC).

HPAC Chairman Fred Rossi opened the ceremony by thanking the County Freeholders and the County Heritage Commission members and staff for approving the application and installing the marker between Division Avenue and the railroad station.

The marker outlines the significance of the Millington Railroad Station. Built in 1901 by the Delaware, Lackawanna & Western Railroad, the station's exterior and interior architectural integrity remains intact. The interior has retained the beautiful original woodwork and ticket window.

Larry Fast, Vice Chairman of the County's Heritage Commission said this was the first historical marker approved by the County in Long Hill Township for more than a decade.

Township Committeeman Brendan Rae, also the liaison to the HPAC, thanked the County Freeholders, County Heritage Commission, and

the HPAC members for all the hard work required to justify this attractive and informative historic site marker.

Barbara Grillo of the Long Hill Township Historical Society said, "History is very important to our Township's heritage and must be remembered. This historical marker is an excellent example of preserving our rich history and heritage."

Fred Rossi introduced Frank Reilly of the HPAC, who wrote the historical marker application and gave a brief history of the railroad station. He noted the station was 117 years old and continues to operate as an active railroad station which serves over 500 people a day. For the last twenty-five years, the station building has been adaptively repurposed as a café that serves light refreshments in an atmosphere of the early 1900s. Vintage photographs depicting the Delaware, Lackawanna & Western Railroad are on display in the stations interior.

Reilly also noted the stone to build the station came from the nearby Millington stone quarry and is of high-quality granite. He also noted that before railroads came to a town, the average resident during their entire life did not travel more than 20 miles from their home. So having a railroad station in your town was really big news and was historically very significant.

On hand for the ceremony, in addition to the above were MCHC Archivist/Acting Director Peg Shultz, MCHC commissioners Marty Kane, Kathy Fisher, and MCHC Archives Technician Amanda Hefferan. Also in attendance were Carol Prasa of the HPAC, and Phyllis Fast of the Township Historical Society.






