GIRL SCOUT'S DAFFODIL PLANTING AT VETERANS PARK

Saturday, November 10th, 2018 marked Rahway Garden Club's fifth annual daffodil planting by local Girl Scouts. This year 15 scouts from Troops 40979, 40745, and 41415 participated.

The all-volunteer Rahway Garden Club created this event and each year donates 200 spring blooming daffodil bulbs to this planting. Ten members of the club helped and oversaw the planting this year providing the scouts with hands-on "how to plant" knowledge.

The Garden Club reached out earlier this year to Rahway American Legion Post #5 and offered to have the annual planting event at Veterans Memorial Park. Post Commander Bob Horsch graciously and enthusiastically accepted the offer. Veterans Memorial Park is located at the corner of St. Georges Avenue and West Grand Avenue.

On the morning of the planting, heavy rains from the previous night had passed, and a brilliant sun and clear skies created a perfect planting day for the Rahway Girl Scouts and their families.

Garden Club President Debra Stewart noted "as we have in the past, we first meet with the Scouts inside the Merchants and Drovers building, which coincidentally is the building which was once the Rahway Girl Scout Headquarters. We choose the same date each year to plant daffodils: Saturday before Veterans Day. The daffodil bulbs will produce beautiful spring flowers, which will continue to bloom year after year. The annual blooms will offer a lovely tribute to those who have served in the Armed Forces of our country."



PINE CONES

Pine cones are everywhere this time of year. We see them on wreaths, in baskets, door-swags, and of course on trees and lying on the ground. Pine cones are painted, scented and sprinkled with glitter. My favorite way to decorate them is in their natural brown state. A collection of different pine cones displays their incredible structural designs and differences.

Pine cones date back to prehistoric times and scientists believe dinosaurs ate pine cones. The dinosaurs would then help spread the seeds throughout the environment as modern day critters and birds do today.

Although all conifers (Evergreen trees) produce cones, pine cones only come from pine trees. The pine cones come from a group of plants known as 'Gymnosperms'. These are plants which have exposed seeds, not enclosed like an apple.

Pine cones play an important role in nature. The main function of a pine cone is to keep a pine tree's seeds safe. When we pick up a pine cone it is impossible to grasp what an incredible propagation system they have.

Pine trees have both male and female cones. The males are much smaller and most people don't notice them. The cones we use for decorating are the larger female cones. The male cone releases its pollen and the wind blows it into the female's cone to pollinate it. Pine cones can stay on the tree for ten years before dropping to the ground.

After the female cone drops to the ground it continues to open and close its scales to protect the seeds from cold temperatures, wind and even animals that might try to eat them. When conditions are perfect for germination, the cone opens and releases the seeds on the ground. Pines need sunlight to germinate so burying a pine cone will not produce a tree.

Some pine cones, like that of Redwoods, need a fast hot fire to open and release their seeds. This is called the 'Jack Pine' ecosystem. In dense forests, sunlight cannot reach the young saplings on the ground, so fire opens the canopy. This thinning allows sunlight in, permitting the young trees to become established.

Only 20 species of pine trees worldwide produce cones with large enough pine nuts for harvesting. The tasty seeds are produced in clusters on very mature trees. Pine nuts are a


good source of thiamine (B1), vitamin K, magnesium, and protein. They are also one of the best natural sources for manganese, phosphorus and zinc.

Pinyon Pines which grow between 6,000 and 9,000 foot altitudes, offer the finest pine nuts in North America. Pinyon Pines are native to the desert mountains of California, east to New Mexico and Texas, and north to Wyoming.

CHRISTMAS IN THE 50S

The holiday season is upon us once again. Neighborhood homes are being decorated, joyous seasonal music is in the air, stores are promoting sales, and families are trying to figure out what to buy one another. It's been going on like this for as long as one can remember and yet, as the decades have rolled on, this special time of year doesn't quite measure up to the ones we remember from the past. Somehow, life seemed simpler back then. Things didn't cost as much. Time moved more slowly. Everything was better. Ever wish we could go back to the Christmas seasons of the 1950s? Let's reminisce.

The Rahway Businessmen's Association kicked-off the holiday shopping season on the Monday following Thanksgiving by welcoming Santa at the Lewis Street parking lot where old St. Nick greeted children and handed out bags of candy. The Christmas lights, the kind that were hung across the streets, were turned on that same evening creating a festive glow on Main, Irving, and Cherry Streets. The stores would stay open until 9:00 p.m., Monday to Friday until Christmas Eve. For the next four weeks downtown Rahway was bustling. Remember some of the stores and their Christmas ads?

Marks Harris "Holiday Fashion Excitement," Sadye Cooper "Surprise Her With a Beaded Sweater," the Camera Center "Now Featuring New 8mm Movie Film Projectors," Joe's Pet Shop "Give a Pet for Christmas," Goldblatt Jewelers "Silverware the Gift of Gifts," Oxman's Gift Shop "Luggage Packed with Christmas Cheer," S and A Hardware "Put Christmas in Lights," Jack Hunter "Hit Parade of Boys' Gifts," Rahway Fur Shop "Christmas Wishes Come True," Miller's Men's Shop "Arrow and Wings Shirts for Christmas," Cliff's Hardware "Come to Cliff's for Christmas Tools," Vogel's Record Center "Give Records for Holiday Listening Pleasure," Bell's Drugs "Christmas Specials for Every Member of the Family," Rahway Book Shop "Give Books for Christmas," Sidney's Men's Shop "Man Sized Christmas," Em-bee Jewelers "Christmas Gift

Specials," Bauers "Sweeten Her Christmas with Candy," Loft's "For Christmas Candies and Gifts," Meinzer's Men's Wear "He'd Like a Mallory Hat," Amorelli's Sport Shop "Give Sports Gifts this Christmas."

The anchor stores, Grant's, Robinson's, Green's, McCrory's, and Woolworth's, offered just about everything to fill a shopper's gift list.

The Acme Super Market on Main Street was selling turkeys at 55¢ lb. and as an extra bonus shoppers were given S & H Green Stamps. J. and A. Market advertised holiday hams at 49¢ lb. and a dozen eggs for 39¢. The A & P on Irving Street had legs of lamb for 53¢ lb. and featured their Eight O'Clock Coffee at 95¢ for a one pound bag. For "Strictly Fresh Killed Turkeys" a shopper would go to the Milton Meat Market. Holiday wines and liquors could be bought at Basher's Delicatessen, Sander's Liquor Store, or the Grade A Dairy. The Rahway Public Market on Cherry Street was the place to go for holiday fruit baskets.

Just about every club and church group was holding Christmas parties. Quinn & Boden hosted a children's party at their Cue-Bee Club, the Masons had a children's party at their Irving Street temple, and the Ladies Auxiliary of the Rahway Yacht Club invited youngsters to their riverside clubhouse. The Italian-American Club,

the Maoami Club, the women of the Zion Lutheran Church and the Women's Association of the First Presbyterian Church held Christmas programs. The Koos Brothers furniture showplace converted a room into a winter wonderland for their Santa Claus. Thousands of youngsters would visit the jolly old elf while their mothers shopped in the many elegant showrooms. Even City Hall set up a nativity scene on its front lawn.

An editorial in the Rahway News Record wished everyone a Merry Christmas and a New Year filled with good health and happiness. It was their hope that the Christmas spirit would become part of our daily lives. The paper suggested all persons should take time from their busy days to attend at least one of the special services to be held in the Rahway churches. The editorial closed with its most important wish-a wish for peace on earth for all.

That's still a good wish at any time in history. Have a Peaceful Christmas!

the New Jersey School Public Relations Association (NJSPRA), it represented the first time in the history of the award that anyone from Rahway had been so honored. On Thursday, October 11, 2018, Mr. Kinch and Mr. Mudrak did not merely repeat their earlier performance but improved on their previous accomplishment, winning not one but two awards at last month's ceremony. For those counting, the media duo are now three-for-three for contest submissions and awards won.

The NJSPRA is the state chapter of the National School Public Relations Association, an organization that represents school districts and public relations agencies in an effort to improve school public relations, to provide training to schools and other academic communities in the fields of media and communications, and to cultivate continuing conversations between schools and the communities they represent and serve.

The School Communications Awards competition that Mr. Kinch and Mr. Mudrak entered recognizes media accomplishments in a wide range of areas broadly related to public relations and communication in schools and other educational arenas. Both electronic and print materials are considered among the hundreds of entries received each year. Submissions fall within one of a select number of competition categories, covering topics and media forms as diverse as marketing and branding, social media, videos, websites, special interest publications, and articles with a human

interest component. This year's distinguished panel of judges comprised a select group of experts and academics specializing in media and communication studies.

The awards Rahway earned in this most recent competition included a third-place finish in the "Special Interest Publication" category for its coverage of a student protest against gun violence that took place at Rahway High School in March. The student-run event was held in solidarity with the March 14 National School Walkout in response to the Stoneman Douglas High School shooting. Second place in the category went to Montville Public Schools, while Union Township Schools in Hunterdon County earned the top

For their second award, Mr. Kinch and Mr. Mudrak earned recognition in the same category in which they competed in June, the "Media Relations-Human Interest" field, improving on their earlier third-place finish with a second place win. Their submission was an article written about the Rahway Public Schools' inaugural fulltime Pre-K program that began last year. The preschool initiative became a reality when the school district secured a prestigious grant from the New Jersey Department of Education worth over \$2.7 million in its first year alone. The funding allowed the district to expand its half-day program of 150 students to a full school day serving over 260. Rahway beat out Westfield Public School District in the category, which finished in third place. The first place position went to West Orange.


