





ROTARY CLUB LUMINARIES SALE

During the month of December, the Fanwood-Scotch Plains Rotary club will sell Luminaries at the Fanwood Department of Public Works on Manfra Way off of North Avenue (across from the Fanwood Public Library). The sale dates are December 1, December 8-9, December 15-16, December 22-23 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. and December 24 – 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. The luminary kits cost 75 cents apiece in all quantities and include paper bags, candles and sand. Customers are encouraged to bring buckets, boxes or plastic bags to transport the sand.

Luminaries are traditionally used to illuminate the streets on Christmas Eve. A candle is nestled in sand at the bottom of a paper bag and placed along sidewalks to create a beautiful walkway. The candles are then lit at dusk on Christmas Eve. Some neighborhoods in the area get together and buy hundreds of kits to create an amazing display.

All proceeds from the sale will be used to fund the various charitable and humanitarian projects that Rotary supports, both locally and internationally.

The Fanwood-Scotch Plains Rotary Club has been serving the community since 1938. The club meets on Wednesdays at noon at the Stage House Restaurant. Guests are invited to attend and learn about the good that Rotary is doing worldwide. 





The book also relates V.'s struggles to cope with, and ultimately accept, her own feminine health issues that led to her loss of motherhood, including endometriosis, infertility, failed adoption and hysterectomy.

BRUNNER SCHOOL THIRD GRADERS PARTICIPATE IN BALI BOOK PROJECT

Last academic year, third graders in Cristina Sardo's classroom at Brunner School partnered with the Street Kid Center in Bali, Indonesia for one of their Service Learning Projects. The families at the Street Kid Center come to the

center to find resource alternatives to street begging. The moms are taught sustainable skills such as beading, bag making and sewing, while the children are provided with meals and schooling. It is a transition place for street families to have a chance for a dignified and sustainable life.

The Brunner students learned about the Balinese culture, as well as their geography and ways of life. Students from the Street Kid Center exchanged videos with their new friends at Brunner and got to know each other despite the language barrier. The Brunner students asked their new friends what types of book they liked to read and they immediately got to work writing books about the ocean, friendship, hygiene and superheroes. They illustrated each book and personalized a message. They also made positive affirmation rocks and wrote letters to local shelters.

Ms. Sardo traveled to Bali over the summer to deliver these books personally during an entire volunteer day organized around reading these books, building a vegetable garden and decorating it with their own Balinese positive affirmation rocks.



"RAIDERS DON'T RISK IT" DRIVING SIMULATION SPFHS SENIORS SEE THE CONSEQUENCES OF DISTRACTED AND DESTRUCTIVE DRIVING

Scotch Plains—Fanwood High School seniors gathered on Happel Court during their physical education class and saw a car crashed into a tree. Luckily, this was a simulation, part of the "Raiders Don't Risk It" program presented by SPF DECA ,the District Student Assistance Coordinator, the Scotch Plains Police and Fire Departments, the Fanwood Police and Rescue Squads, Resolve Counseling Center and the Municipal Alliance.

The program is designed to show the aftermath of distracted and destructive driving. In the simulation, actors from the class of 2019 presented a scenario where the students had "just one drink." The scene played out where the driver was arrested and one of the occupants of the car did not survive the crash. The rescue squad and fire department simulated the life saving measures that are taken at the scene. In addition

to the students and emergency services, parents and teachers took on the roles of parents of the victims. This was done in order to reinforce the idea that many people are impacted by the decisions that one makes.

After the presentation, police officers explained the realities of distracted and destructive driving. According to the CDC, the leading cause of death amongst 15-19 year olds is car crash related injuries. Officers expressed how one simple poor decision can have lifelong consequences.

The program was presented to seniors during their physical education classes. This smaller setting allowed the students to be able to ask questions of the officers and emergency personnel. After the presentation, students were able to debrief with their physical education teachers.






