STUDENTS START WITH HELLO IN PROMISE PROGRAM

As part of Scotch Plains-Fanwood Schools' participation in Sandy Hook Promise, our schools participated in Start with Hello Week. This week was dedicated to creating a more connected and inclusive school community so that students who feel isolated or alone know that they have people in their school who care about them and want them to be included.

The fourth-grade students in Christine Mill's classroom at School One took part in a concentric circle activity where they rotated around to different partners and learned something new about that person. Questions were asked such as, "Do you play any sports?" "What's your favorite food and why?" "If you could travel anywhere, where would you go and why?" "Would you rather be a bird or a dog, why?" Students then had the chance to ask a question of their own to a student in the class. The elementary schools posted "Start With Hello" signs throughout their buildings. Scotch Plains Mayor Al Smith, along with Al Mirabella, Margaret Heisey and School Superintendent Dr. Margaret Hayes participated in the activities along with Mrs. Mill's students.

Brunner third grade students loved learning about ways to help people that may feel socially isolated. The third-grade students in Charlene Hall's classroom read the book, The Invisible

Boy. Students identified with the young boy that was isolated from his peers and came up with strategies to help a student like the one in the story they read.

Students at the middle schools were reminded of the importance of saying hello to one another and how each one of us can make a difference in someone else's life. At Terrill Middle School, the Health and Physical Education Department kicked off the "Start With Hello" program by conducting the "Start With Hello" introductory lesson. Throughout the course of the past week, students in physical education classes, discussed the benefits of sharing a "hello" with someone else. In the same lesson, students also participated in a concentric circles activity that prompted the students to ask getting-to-know-you questions of one another. In the process, students were encouraged and made aware of how to say "hello" in fifteen different languages. Teachers and students reported a high level of engagement and insight with and about one another.

The students at Park Middle School were reminded every morning and afternoon of the importance of saying "Hello" to one another and how each one of us can make a difference in someone else's life. "Hello my name is..." name tags were given to both the Park students and staff and were worn through the day. During lunch time, the students sat with different students doing a get to know you activity. On Friday, September 28, everyone at Park was invited to wear green to show their support for our school community and once again recognize the importance of starting with "Hello."

MILESTONE AWARDS FOR THREE SCOTCH PLAINS STUDENTS IN THE CIVIL AIR PATROL

On September 18, 2018, several U.S. Air Force Auxiliary Civil Air Patrol (C.A.P.) cadets from the Capt. "Bud" Jackson Composite Squadron were promoted to their next rank by Colonel Joe H. Abegg Sr., the New Jersey Wing Commander. These cadets are Middle School and High School students from various local communities including Scotch Plains.

Cadet Technical Sergeant Manali Shah was given her Wright Brothers Award. Cadet Shah is a Scotch Plains Junior at UCVTS. During the Summer months, she participated in the C.A.P. New York Emergency Services Training School, with the goal of being able to participate in search and rescue missions.

Cadet Master Sergeant Kiana McQuade, a Senior at Kent Place School in Summit and a Scotch Plains resident received her Solo CAP Wings for successfully demonstrating the skills required to pilot a Cessna 172 aircraft alone. She earned this award after attending the C.A.P. 2018 Falcon Flight Academy. She may not be able to drive a car, but she can fly a plane and

dominate the sky above.

To conclude the evening ceremony, Cadet Captain Veronica Vergara, a Senior at UCVTS and Scotch Plains resident, received the Amelia Earhart Award, placing her among the top 5% of all cadets nation-wide and promoting her to the rank of Cadet Captain. In her role as the Cadet Commander of the "Bud" Jackson Composite Squadron, her responsibility is to command, lead, manage, train and be a role model to over 50 cadets. During the summer, she graduated from the Cyber Defense Training Academy's Cyber Familiarization Course, an intensive course on Cyber-Security given by CAP personnel and Air Force personnel from Cyber-Command.



RESCUE SQUAD TIP OF THE MONTH AVOIDING FALL DRIVING HAZARDS

Everyone knows that winter can bring driving challenges, with snow and ice sometimes covering the roadways. But did you know that fall can be just as hazardous?

Those beautiful colorful leaves that we all admire can cause slippery roads, especially after a rainfall. Wheels can easily lose traction when driving over them, especially if you're going at a high rate of speed. Those leaves can also cover up traffic lines and mask potholes and other hazards. Children also like to play in leaf piles, so don't ever drive over one.

In addition, fall means that kids are back in school and playing sports, so there are more cars and buses on the roads. Keep in mind that it's not only illegal, but dangerous to pass a school bus when its lights are flashing. Being later for work or an appointment isn't worth risking a child's safety. Open schools bring more pedestrian traffic as well, especially in the mornings and early afternoons.

Fall is also deer mating season, and those

gentle creatures can cause major accidents when running out into the roads. Keep your eyes open, especially around dawn and dusk. The Insurance Institute for Highway Safety cautions that you're 3.5 times more likely to hit an animal especially a deer - in November than at any other time of the year.

Another important thing to do is to check your tire pressure. According to www.AARP.org, "since fall weather rapidly changes from warm to cold, your tires will often expand and contract. This can lead to a loss of pressure." Improperly inflated tires can lead to loss of control if you need to make a sudden stop and even cause blowouts. Also make sure the treads on your tires are sufficient to maintain traction on the road.

So, what can you do to keep yourself and others on the road safe this season and all year long? Drive a little slower, keep your distance from the car in front of you, maintain your vehicle properly, including keeping the windshields clean, and, as always, pay attention

to your driving and environment, whether it be road conditions, other drivers, pedestrians or wildlife.

The Scotch Plains Rescue Squad is a volunteer organization of Neighbors Helping Neighbors. With over 90 volunteers, we answer emergency calls not only in Scotch Plains but in surrounding towns as well when needed. Besides answering calls, you will see our ambulances at many special events held in town, such as Scotch Plains Day, the Memorial Day Parade, high school football games, and the summer concerts on the Village Green. We are also available to provide demonstrations for Boys and Girls Scout troops, clubs, and any other group that may be interested in what we do. In addition, we lend out wheelchairs, crutches, canes and other assorted medical equipment free of charge. Our Auxiliary Group holds fund raisers and provides other much needed support for our members.



2018 Kristallnacht program to be held on Sunday, November 4 at 7:00 p.m. Dr. Magdelena Wrobel, Project Manager for the Leo Baeck Institute of New York and Berlin, will present "Posts from the Past: Personal Stories on the 80th Anniversary of Kristallnacht and the Events of 1938." These personal stories are reports from Jews from 1938. The Leo Baeck Institute is the premier repository for archival materials from German and German speaking countries in Europe. Eighty years ago, on November 9, 1938, the

Nazi party escalated its anti-Semitic campaign against the Jews through a pogrom in Germany, Austria and part of Czechoslovakia. Prior to that, in March 1938, Nazi Germany annexed Austria (the Anschluss); at the end of September 1938, England, France, Italy and Germany signed the infamous Munich Agreement which allowed Nazi Germany to annex parts of Czechoslovakia and eventually led to the dismemberment of that country. And on December 2, 1938, the kindertransport began, eventually sending 10,000 from Germany, Austria Czechoslovakia to safety in England and elsewhere, most of whom never saw their parents again.

Dr. Wrobel earned her Ph.D. from the Ludwig-Maximilians University in Munich in 2013 and has served as a visiting scholar at the University of Haifa, University College London and Columbia University. Before coming to the Leo Baeck Institute in New York, she worked at the Jewish Foundation for the Righteous in their Rescuer Support Program and served as Assistant to the Ambassador at the Permanent Mission of the Republic of Poland to the United Nations.


