

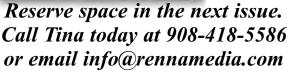



LOCAL YOUTH IS THANKFUL FOR THE GIFT OF A CAR AT THANKSGIVING

As families gathered for Thanksgiving and celebrated all they have, one 20-year-old who is an Elizabeth resident who works in Summit, was grateful for something most people take for granted – her car.

Nicole Jenkins has not had an easy life, living within the state child welfare system and looking for a place to call home until she became a member of Community Access Unlimited (CAU) in 2016. CAU is a Union County-based, statewide nonprofit that strives to integrate people with disabilities and at-risk youth into the general community through housing, vocational and life-skills training, education, advocacy, recreation and more.

The agency's Transitional Opportunities Program (TOP), of which Jenkins is a member, provides at-risk youth aged 13-21 with a variety of residential support and life-skills and employment training. Youth enrolled in TOP participate in an employment training workshop and receive interviewing and job training to prepare them to seek and find employment.

For Jenkins, this training paid off when she landed a job at a restaurant in Summit. But without a car, she had to rely on multiple bus rides to get to work and her classes at Essex County College. But thanks to one donor's generosity, Jenkins is now getting around in a Sebring convertible.

CAU's Vehicle Donation Program allows people to donate their cars and receive a tax credit while helping an at-risk youth or person with disabilities attain the freedom of personal transportation. Unlike other vehicle donation programs, which sell the donated cars for only a portion of their value, CAU's program transfers the full value of the car to the receiving member, according to Howard Wingard, supported housing coordinator at the agency.

"Our car donation program impacts their lives

tremendously by giving them more independence and the freedom to travel where they need to go," Wingard said. "It also gives them the opportunity to job seek in other areas and to be able to visit family and friends and reconnect with them."

Jenkins is thankful for the donation -- and newfound freedom -- she has received from the program and its donors.

"It makes it much easier to get where I need to go and much faster," Jenkins said. "I don't have to wait for the bus. It's like having a whole new level of independence. I'm grateful that I have the car because there are a lot of people who don't and who don't have the opportunities I have at CAU."

CITY OF SUMMIT IMPLEMENTS TWO NEW RECYCLING PROGRAMS

Community Services and the Recycling Advisory Committee are implementing two new programs to help reduce items from entering the waste stream and utilize recycling and reuse initiatives.

The soft plastics recycling program will be implemented with a collection bin at the Transfer Station next to the commingled recycling area.



(above) The soft plastics recycling bin, one of Summit's new recycling programs. If 500 pounds of soft plastics are collected within a six-month period, the town will receive a donated bench.

The City of Summit Department of Soft, stretch plastics resulting from household waste will be sent to the Trex Company. If 500 pounds of soft plastics are collected within a sixmonth period, the Trex Company will donate a bench made from recycled plastic for use in a Summit area green space or park.

> Soft plastic items that can be recycled include: grocery bags, ziplock and other reclosable food storage bags, produce bags, bubble wrap and air pillows, bread bags, cereal bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, case overwrap, wood pellet bags, industrial pallet wrap and stretch film.

All bags must be clean, dry, and free of food

Items that cannot be used for this program include: garbage bags, frozen food bags, candy bar wrappers, chip bags, six-pack rings, prewashed salad mix bags, degradable/compostable bags or film packaging.

The second recycling program is for used tennis balls. Collection bins are located at Memorial Field adjacent to the tennis courts on Ashland Road and at the Summit Tennis Club on 45 Sunset Drive. Two additional collection bins will be added near the Tatlock Field tennis courts at 80 Butler Pkwy.

Collected tennis balls will be submitted to RecycleBalls to repurpose into other green products. It is estimated that 125 million tennis balls enter the waste stream each year.



SUMMIT POLICE ADDS NEW HARLEY DAVIDSON ELECTRA GLIDE MOTORCYCLE TO PATROL UNIT

The Summit Police Department has added a bonus." 2019 Harley Davidson Electra Glide motorcycle to its fleet of Traffic Unit vehicles though a generous donation from a local foundation. The motorcycle will be used for specific traffic enforcement and control, parades and escorts and not for general patrol specific duties such as answering calls.

"Motorcycles are highly maneuverable and the high acceleration response capabilities make it an excellent tool for traffic law enforcement," explains Summit Police Chief Robert Weck. "These capabilities will allow the Traffic Unit to carry out its duties with less hindrance by traffic and narrow city streets."

The mission of the Traffic Unit is to keep Summit roadways safe. Each day, the unit uses proactive enforcement, community education and outreach, and traffic safety engineering to reduce traffic-related injuries and fatalities. It routinely analyzes traffic crash and moving violation data, and reviews citizen complaints in the formation of traffic safety plans.

Weck continues: "The purchase of a highmobility motorcycle increases the ability of the patrol unit to conduct traffic enforcement in a variety of ways. It also increases the visibility of officers in the community, which is an added

Summit Police officers must complete a rigorous police motorcycle rider training course and receive certification before being assigned to motorcycle patrol duties. Officer Christopher Eriksen recently completed the two week course and will be the first current Summit Police officer to conduct motorcycle patrols.

Each Fall, the Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad launches an annual fund drive to help pay for the services it provides. Kevin Valle. St. Teresa of Avila encourages all Summit residents to consider a donation to the Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad, which is comprised of volunteers who give of their time and knowledge to help our community every day at our most vulnerable moments.

The all-volunteer First Aid Squad is entirely funded through private donations and does not bill for service. The Squad has 90 members, including 20 junior members, and is always looking for new volunteers to join its ranks. All needed training, uniforms and equipment is provided. 

It was quite a day at the Union County Family Courthouse, as 28 youth gathered to celebrate their adoptions and an end to foster care. The morning of Friday, Nov. 16, 2018, Union County's observation of the national awareness day held each year the Saturday before Thanksgiving, 16 children entered courtrooms as foster youth but exited as part of a forever family. In addition, 12 others adopted in recent months returned to celebrate.

National Adoption Day raises awareness of children in foster care awaiting adoption. Since its inception 19 years ago, approximately 60,000 children have left foster care and entered forever families. In the United States, more than 100,000 such youth need a permanent home, and the average wait time for each is nearly four years. Unfortunately, more than 20,000 age out without a permanent home or family.

In addition to adoption hearings officiated by Superior Court Judges James C. Wischusen and James Hely, festivities included guest speakers, entertainment, gifts for the children and families, and well-wishes from all. All adoptions ended
