

BREAST CENTER AT TRINITAS NAMED FOR SUMMIT RESIDENT CONNIE DWYER

Trinitas Regional Medical Center and The Connie Dwyer Breast Cancer Foundation recently joined forces to open the doors of the new Connie Dwyer Breast Center at Trinitas, 225 Williamson St., Elizabeth, NJ, on Monday, Oct. 1, 2018 the first day of Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Donors, local officials, and guests joined in the festive ribbon-cutting and dedication ceremony and toured the center before Grammy Award-Winning artist Gloria Gaynor sang her hit single, "I Will Survive."

Connie Dwyer's story is certainly one of

survival. When the Summit resident was diagnosed with breast cancer in 1999 and had a double mastectomy, she became mindful of the fact that many women who are uninsured or underinsured and low-income often have limited or no access to critical care. She and a dedicated group of friends began a tireless grassroots effort to create awareness and raise funds. In December 2017, Dwyer was re-diagnosed at Trinitas with metastasized breast cancer, yet continues to work for the cause.

Dwyer expressed her enthusiasm for working

with Trinitas on the \$3.4 million project. "... Your presence validates your understanding of just how important this center is to women of the greater Elizabeth community," she said. "Thanks to the dedication of my board members and our donors, many of whom are with us here this evening, we embarked on the partnership with Trinitas to build a breast center that would provide access to the best science has to offer by way of breast cancer screening, diagnosis and treatment."

Dwyer added, "We are so delighted to join the Trinitas family led by Gary Horan and his exceptional leadership team including Nadine Brechner and Nancy DiLiegro. We knew from the start that our missions were so very similar: to serve the poor and vulnerable in a compassionate, healing environment. We have accomplished that. From the moment a woman enters our breast center she will encounter a totally different experience. Our aim is not only detection and healing, but the whole experience of caring for the patient. As we turn over this beautiful breast center to an exceptional, bilingual medical team, our mission carries on as we are laser focused on continuing our lifesaving work to bring healing and hope to the women of Elizabeth and beyond."



The Breast Center, staffed with board-certified bilingual specialists, offers the most up-to-date equipment and services available, such as 3D imaging, which allows radiologists to view the breast tissue in several layers. This breakthrough technology can detect 41 percent more invasive breast cancers and can reduce false positive results by up to 40 percent.

The mission of the Connie Dwyer Breast Center is to bring a highly empathic approach to screening, diagnosis, treatment, and community outreach and education to all women, regardless of financial status, in a brand new facility that evokes comfort and a sense of well-being.

Suzanne and Wim both went through emotionally wrenching divorces, and they decided to found the group when they realized no such organization existed in the area.

The group meets every first and third Tuesday of the month from 7:30 - 9 p.m. at the Beacon congregation in Summit. The group is not formally affiliated with the congregation and just uses their space. The mission of the group is to provide members with a caring, thoughtful, and informative place to discuss issues they are facing in their divorce. The group provides a safe and

MONUMENT FOR TWO SUMMIT MEDAL OF HONOR HEROES APPROVED

Council, approved installation of a monument to the two soldiers from Summit who were awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor, the highest award for Valor the United States confers. The monument will be erected in the memorial section of the Summit Village Green. It will be funded through public, tax-deductible contributions.

The monument is a project of Summit's American Legion Post. Henry Bassman, Post Commander said, "When I first learned that two men from Summit were awarded the Medal of Honor, I began asking about them, but very few people even knew about the award. I felt it was important that these two men and their bravery be remembered, so our Post took on this project to insure the heroes from Summit will never be forgotten. But we can't do it alone; we need help from the community to fund the project." Contributions will be used to fund the Medal of Honor monument and to maintain other veteran monuments in Summit. The Medal of Honor was awarded to Sergeant Alan Eggers and Corporal Thomas O'Shea from Summit and Sergeant John Latham of Rutherford, NJ for their action during the Battle of San Quentin Canal on September 29, 1918. This pivotal battle was the first assault on the Hindenburg line, which was the heavily fortified border between Belgium and Germany. Breaking through this line hastened the Armistice, ending World War 1 just 43 days later.

The Battle of San Quentin Canal was fierce. The Americans were the first to go over the top. They were to advance 5,000 yards against the most heavily defended area of the German line. The 107th Regiment, in which the men served, suffered the most casualties sustained in a single day by any U.S. regiment during the war.


When the first-day's assault failed, Sergeant

were stranded in front of the American lines. Hearing cries for help from a disabled tank, the three men crawled to the tank under heavy enemy fire. Corporal O'Shea was immediately killed, but the two surviving men rescued an officer and two wounded men and brought them back to a bend in a nearby trench. They then

On October 16, 2018, the Summit Common Eggers, Corporal O'Shea and Sergeant Latham returned to the tank through heavy rifle and mortar fire, dismounted a Hotchkiss machine gun, returned again to their trench and held off the Germans until nightfall, when they made their way back to friendly lines.
