UNION PUBLIC LIBRARY OFFERS FREE WI-FI AND CHROMEBOOKS FOR JOB SEEKERS THROUGH NJ CAREER CONNECTIONS GRANT

Union Public Library (UPL) patrons who would like a connection to the internet and are seeking employment and professional development opportunities can now take home Chromebooks and mobile hotspots through a new Connect2Success library initiative. Mobile hotspots tap into nearby Wifi networks enabling users to connect to the Internet for free, while Chromebooks allow patrons to access online resources.


According to a Pew Research Center survey, "Among Americans who have looked for work in the last two years, 79% utilized online resources in their most recent job search."

"We are hoping this new initiative helps provide important access to online information for all of our library patrons, whenever and wherever they need it most," said John Daquino, Head of Adult Services at UPL.

Connect2Success is funded through a partnership grant from the New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development's Career Connections program and the New Jersey State Library. Through the Career Connections program, a career coach is available to UPL library patrons seeking one-on-one personalized career coaching. There are also

monthly workshops on interviewing skills, networking, and a variety of other topics held at UPL.

Chromebooks and mobile hotspots are available to library cardholders, 18 years or older, without internet at home, for the sole purpose of conducting employment or professional development online. 

KEAN STUDENTS STUDY BRAIN REACTIONS TO IMPROVE CYBERSECURITY

Three Kean computer science students are studying the brains of high schoolers to determine the best way to teach cybersecurity awareness.

Using Brain-Computer Interface (BCI) technology, Isabel Morais of Union and Manuel Condado and Kingberli Capellan, both of Perth Amboy, will record the brain activity of high school students as they answer questions such as, "Do you think you are safe on the web?" and, "What are the risks associated with using public Wi-Fi?"

"We noticed that big-tech companies like Facebook and Instagram were being hacked, so we targeted the demographics of high school students because they need to learn cybersecurity awareness," Condado said.

The ninth and 10th graders participating through Kean's Project Adelante, a pre-college program for Latino high school students, will wear special noninvasive headgear as they respond to the confidential questions about internet use, cyber threats and personal practices. Information is transmitted to a computer, where their brain activity is then categorized.

"There are a lot of interesting things that go along with using BCI," Morais said. "When the user is categorized as stressed or focused, we can see that, and we can figure out how we can use that information to help them better understand the concepts being taught."

The students received a \$10,500 grant from the highly selective Computing Research Association Collaborative Research Experience Undergraduates (CRA-CREU) program to conduct the research. They are working with Patricia Morreale, Ph.D., executive director of the Kean University School of Computer Science.

"We have always taught students about stranger danger, but we are going to see a lot more cybersecurity awareness in the curriculum," Morreale said. "We want them to know how easy it is to be phished, hacked or be vulnerable. By having lessons that they are interested in, we hope to increase the overall cybersecurity awareness of young students."

The students will collect data over 10 weeks this semester and start analyzing the data in the Spring 2019 semester.

"I think this research is a great start for grad school because I want to go into the field of cybersecurity," said Capellan, who is applying now for master's programs in computer science.

They will publish and share their findings at conferences and Kean's Research Days.

CAU HELPS STUDENTS AND ADULTS WITH DISABILITIES PREPARE FOR EMPLOYMENT

them excellent candidates, people with disabilities experience increased rates of discrimination and difficulty finding employment, according to local nonprofit Community Access Unlimited (CAU).

There are nearly 40 million Americans with disabilities, according to the Pew Research Center. In 2017, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported that the unemployment rate for this sector was 9.2 percent, more than double the 4.2 percent rate for people without disabilities.

CAU, which supports people with disabilities, has long worked to address this problem by preparing its members for employment. In October 2017, the Kessler Foundation awarded CAU its \$35,000 Community Employment Grant to assist the nonprofit in its efforts.

The grant is subsidizing a job-readiness program aimed at high school students with disabilities to empower them to transition into employment upon graduation, as well as adults with disabilities who would like to enter the workforce. Funds were used to create and implement a curriculum and develop partnerships with local high schools supporting students with disabilities, including introduction of the program at Roselle Park High School this fall.

Recently, six CAU members reaped the rewards of the Kessler Foundation's assistance when they received certificates following completion of one phase of the program, preparing them for employment. Classes focused on resume building, applying for a job, interviewing skills and professional dress and behavior. The classes also allowed for an assessment of participants' skills and interests to help CAU custom-design a plan for each member that ultimately will lead to employment.

"The program includes all the basic steps to have a successful employment search, even how to shake hands," said Onieka Grier, director of employment services at CAU. "The assessment allows us to help them focus on a career path."

Roselle residents Joshua Alves, 27, and Alphonse Cervone, 37, and 22-year-old Marcus

Despite possessing work habits that make Barnesof Elizabeth were among the six CAU members who earned certificates.

> Alves is adept at computers, even helping staff with problems, according to Grier, and wants to pursue a career in information technology.

> "I never had a real job before," he said. "I'm looking forward to it. I like to help people."

> Cervone previously worked in a senior living center helping to prepare and serve meals and looks forward to working again in a similar environment.

> "You have to know what people want," he said. "So I want to get a job cooking."

Barnes also worked in the past, including at a café, but said he thinks retail is a better fit for

"I want a job that will help me stay focused, maybe at Marshall's," he said. "I'd like to learn how to display the clothes."

CAU is well-positioned to implement the goals of the Kessler Foundation grant. The agency has a robust employment services department, including job skills training, adaptive equipment/assistive technology and a broad array of partnerships with businesses. More than 50 CAU members are employed at more than 30 local businesses through CAU, according to Fredia McKinnie, assistant executive director of employment and day habilitation services.


