### **SCRIPT AND CUE'S ANNUAL "CABARET NIGHT" AT WHRHS**

As many as 19 student performers sang some 17 songs, including many from Broadway Musicals or from popular recording artists, at the 2018 "Cabaret Night," which was staged by the Watchung Hills Regional High School (WHRHS) Script and Cue Student Drama Troupe, on Thursday, October 18, 2018 in the school's Performing Arts Center (PAC).

As has become the practice during the last several years, the PAC was adapted into an intimate space for the Cabaret, with both the performers and audience filling the PAC's full stage, arranged sideways.

Included among the performers were many of the cast members from the Fall Drama, presented by Script and Cue. Arthur Miller's iconic Tony Award winning drama, "The Crucible," was staged by the student actors and crew of Script Broadway musical and movies, "Mama Mia." and Cue November 15-17.

The one exception to the solo and duet performers was a student band that has been tentatively named by its members "Band To Be Named Later." Band members included junior Sam Bouffard of Green Brook Township as lead singer, junior Ben Kazokowski of Green Brook on guitar, junior Thomas Dardis of Warren Township on guitar, senior Will Broder of Warren on drums, and junior Alti Kabukcu of Warren on keyboards. Sitting in with the band on bass was J.P. Bouffard, the lead singer's dad. They played two songs as the first act after intermission: "Slow Dancing in a Burning Room" by John Mayer and "While My Guitar Gently Weeps," one of Gillette, who sang "Poker Face" by Lady Gaga; and junior George Harrison's masterpieces with The Beatles.

Junior Jack Melillo of Stirling and senior Kayla Martins of from the musical "Dog Fight."

Warren acted as host and hostess for the night. They introduced the acts and also sang songs. Kayla Martins sang "When I was Your Man" by Bruno Mars. Jack Melillo sang "She Used To Be Mine" from the musical "Waitress." He also sang a duet with junior Christine Tanko of Green Brook, "Super Friend," from the musical "The Flash."

Tanko also sang solo on "My Funny Valentine" by Rodgers and Hart. That song has been performed by hundreds of artists since its debut in 1937 in the musical "Babes in Arms."

Among the other performers were: Freshman Jordan Pincus of Green Brook, who sang "Everything and More" from the musical "Twisted;" senior Claire Vickery of Millington, who sang "IDon'tWantToBeYourMan" by Billie Eilish; and senior Kaelin Churchill of Stirling who sang "Mamma Mia" by the pop group Abba and from the



# LIBRARY SYSTEM CONTINUES TO OFFER OPPORTUNITIES FOR RESIDENTS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES

One of the strategic priorities resulting from the Library's ever-evolving strategic plan is to address the needs of shifting County demographics, including individuals with developmental disabilities. As a result, the Somerset County Library System of New Jersey (SCLSNJ) is dedicated to continuing to provide and enhance volunteer and workforce development opportunities across the System.

"Individuals with developmental disabilities are a population for whom SCLSNJ can make a real difference," said Lynn Hoffman, SCLSNJ director of operations. "The public library is for everyone, and we want to provide inclusive opportunities that allow everyone to participate in the public library community."

The Library System currently offers volunteer opportunities that allows teens and adults with developmental disabilities the transitional and

training skills necessary to join the workforce, to contribute to the community, and to learn new skills. SCLSNJ currently partners with approximately 40 developmental disabled volunteers, who have collectively donated an estimated 1,000 hours through September 2018.

"It is important that our volunteer program be welcoming and accessible," said Nicole Pascoe, SCLSNJ volunteer coordinator. "Adults and teens with developmental disabilities from throughout our community are currently making contributions and gaining experience as volunteers throughout the Library System. SCLSNJ is working to create the best possible experience for all volunteers."

Cathy DeBerry, SCLSNJ adult services supervisor at the Hillsborough branch, has worked closely with adults with developmental disabilities for over two years. In 2016, she began working with then Watchung Hills Regional High School student Brian Mahon, who volunteered at the Warren Twp. branch.

"I met Brian when he was 19-years-old and a student at Watchung Hills Regional High School," said DeBerry. "He was part of the the school's Learning and/or Language Disabilities (LLD) program, which is a program that allows students with developmental disabilities to take the mandated course requirements and participate in a variety of school-to-work transition experiences through vocational courses and off-site internship opportunities. This program helps these individuals prepare for life after high school."

As a Library volunteer, Mahon was assigned a variety of projects to work on, including: crafts for storytimes, shelving and checking in books, assisting staff in programs, and more.

"Due to the combination of the LLD program at Watchung HIlls, the volunteer opportunities at the Warren Twp. branch, and the adult recreational and socialization programs at the Library, Brian acquired the communication, organizational, and independent living skills he needed to apply and interview for a staff position at the Warren Twp. branch," said DeBerry. "I am happy to report he was hired as a SCLSNJ employee in June."

In order to help connect teens and adults with developmental disabilities to job and volunteer opportunities across the County, SCLSNJ will host a job and volunteer fair on April 6, 2019 at the Bridgewater branch. During this event, developmentally-disabled attendees will have the opportunity to apply and/or interview for volunteer and job positions throughout the Somerset County area as well as throughout the 10 branch Library System.

In April 2018, SCLSNJ hosted their first job and volunteer fair for teens and adults with developmental disabilities. Fifteen area businesses and nonprofit organizations looking for employees and volunteers participated in the event, which had an attendance of approximately 170 individuals.

There are currently over 109,000 NJ youth age 0-18 who are bereaved due to the death of a parent. Imagine is currently serving 285 of those children, from 55 NJ towns every two weeks at our center.

"Imagine helps make a difference in the lives

of grieving children and families in the communities around our sites," said Paula Alston, Executive Director of Merck's NA Research Facilities.
