




Walt Sieling was recently honored with the Melvin Jones Fellowship.

"The New Providence Lions Club is proud to recognize Walt as a Melvin Jones recipient for his more than 29 years of service. It's people like


Walt who continue to give back to our community and make a difference in so many lives." stated Ed Morgan, President of the New Providence Lions club.





STEPHANIE RIBEIRO DE SOUZA AMONG NURSING GRADUATES

One hundred and twelve students received their nursing diplomas at the Trinitas School of Nursing's 161st Convocation Ceremony held at St. Michael's Church in Cranford, New Jersey including Stephanie Ribeiro De Souza of New Providence. Surrounded by family, friends, and staff that supported their efforts every step of the way, 99 women and 13 men proudly accepted their pins and diplomas. They also became eligible to sit for the NCLEX-RN registered nurse licensing examination.

"The Trinitas School of Nursing congratulates the Class of January 2019," said Dr. Rose Santee, Dean of the Trinitas School of Nursing, a diploma in nursing program which is affiliated with Union County College that also awards the Associate in Science Degree to the graduates.

"The administration, faculty and staff continue their commitment to the success of all our nursing students using innovative strategies to promote student success. We prepare our graduates to be entry-level nurses in today's dynamic health care environment."

Graduate nurses took part in the occasion in various ways. The ceremony began with "America the Beautiful," sung by Huguette Jean, accompanied by her husband Arroll Jean on the piano. The Welcome speech was given by Anaelisa Ramirez, while the Senior Class Address was delivered by Rebecca O. Thompson and the Closing remarks were given by Pamela Santamarina.

Trinitas School of Nursing, a collaborative nursing program of Trinitas Regional Medical

Center and Union County College, currently holds full accreditation from the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN) and the New Jersey State Board of Nursing. The National League for Nursing has awarded the School of Nursing a third designation as a Center of Excellence in Nursing Education status for the years 2015 - 2020 for Creating Environments that Enhance Student Learning and Professional Development.

The majority of the full-time faculty and administration are doctorally prepared and hold certifications as NLN Certified Nurse Educators (CNE). The School holds a 25-year,

50-class national RN licensing examination (NCLEX) average pass rate of 95% on first attempt.

NEW PROVIDENCE COMMUNITY SERVICE ASSOCIATION TO HOST 6TH ANNUAL PASTA DINNER AND BASKET RAFFLE FEBRUARY 24 EVENT CELEBRATES ORGANIZATION'S 65TH YEAR

The Community Service Association of New Providence (CSA), together with the New Providence Lions Club, will host its 6th Annual Pasta & Meatball Dinner/Basket Raffle on Sunday, February 24, 2019. This fun, family-friendly event will take place at the DeCorso Community Center, 15 East Fourth Street, New Providence, NJ. Pasta, meatballs, and dessert will be served from 3 - 7 p.m. Tickets are \$12 per person; children five and under are free. Cash and checks will be accepted at the door, no credit cards, please. The snow date is Sunday, March 3, 2019.

As usual, there will be a huge basket raffle

featuring local vendors and more as well as a 50/50. The annual Pasta Dinner is the CSA's main community fundraising event of the year.

The Community Service Association of New Providence is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that provides temporary assistance to New Providence residents with financial needs while respecting the dignity and anonymity of the individuals and families. This could mean helping a family with medical bills, paying utility bills or rent, clothing assistance, transportation, and more. The CSA also works with New Providence's Boy Scouts/Cub Scouts and Faith Lutheran Church on the annual, town-

wide Scouting for Food drive and also organizes a Christmas gift drive for its client families.






