JIM RHATICAN IS HONOREE AT 2019 DONATE LIFE ROSE PARADE FLOAT

On January 1, 2019 Berkeley Heights resident Jim Rhatican served as a float rider honoree at the 2019 Donate Life Rose Parade Float held in Pasadena, CA. He joined approximately 70 honorees who have been touched by organ, eye and tissue donations, they rode or walked beside the float.

Jim is a liver recipient who flew to Pasadena on the day of his 10th transplant anniversary. The Donate Life Rose Parade Float serves as a memorial to organ and tissue donors and a platform for donor families, living donors and transplant recipients to inspire the world to save and heal those in need through the gift of life.

Jim was sponsored by the NJ Sharing Network, located in New Providence, NJ. The NJ Sharing Network annually sponsors about 2-3 families to participate on the Donate Life Rose Parade Float, and they hold send-off events to honor them. On Monday, November 26, 2018 they held an event to honor Jim at their office.

A retired teacher, Jim got involved with NJ Sharing Network's High School Program and has spoken to hundreds of students about the importance of organ and tissue donation. He has also told his story at health fairs and to doctors, nurses and other hospital staff throughout New

Jersey. His 5K Celebration of Life team, The Rhat Pack, has participated in the annual event since 2012. Jim says that he is continuously moved by students, teachers and parents who tell him their stories and thank him for his communications efforts.

NJ Sharing Network is the non-profit organization responsible for the recovery and placement of donated organs and tissue for those in need of a life-saving transplant. Nearly 4,000 New Jersey residents are currently awaiting transplantation. We are also part of the national recovery system, which is in place for the 115,000 people on the national waiting list.

We operate 24/7/365 with a team of over 150 highly trained and dedicated members on staff. Our Governing and Foundation Boards are made up of a diverse group of individuals from both public and private sectors, across a variety of disciplines, and many of whom have been touched by donation including donor families and recipients. 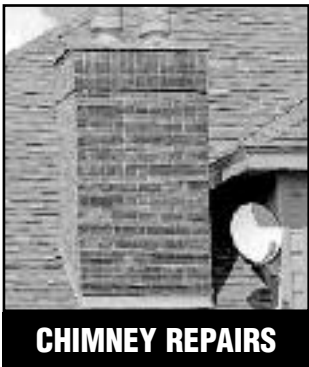

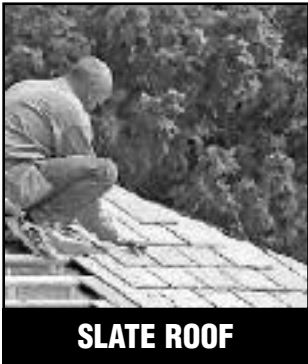

THE SUMMIT OLD GUARD CELEBRATES 4000TH WEEKLY MEETING

On December 4, 2018 The Summit Old Guard celebrated their 4000th weekly meeting in a room filled to capacity with over 140 in attendance including Summit Mayor Nora Radest, and New Providence Mayor Al Morgan.

The Summit Old Guard has managed to maintain their vibrancy through the years. There were 6 fraternal organizations in New Jersey including Summit, Westfield, Elizabeth, Plainfield, Ramsey, Nutley, Toms River, and ten out of state chapters. Their members consist of retired men who join together to share common bonds, information and companionship through weekly meetings and many various activities which over the years included: Chess, Bridge, Bocci Ball, Fishing, Canoeing, Mathamatics, Computer Technology, and most recently Walking. The organization has also taken many trips together to New York City Museums, Broadway Shows, and to historic sites in Philladelphia, West Point, and Trenton. They cruised to Bermuda and New England seaports and held annual events including picnics and "Ladies Day."

The Summit group draws its members regionally. It was founded in 1930 and used to meet at the Summit YMCA, however when the 3-story walk up became an issue for members meetings were moved to the council room of the New Providence Municipal Center. A program was presented which reviewed the history of the organization, and celebrated their many successes as a vibrant fraternal organization. Internet and keep it vibrant into the future. Members are encouraged to invite retired friends to attend a meeting.

Joking that their 100th anniversary would be in 12 years "I don't think many of us will be around at that time." a slide show of the past 88 years was presented and members were encouraged to call out names of those remembered, lots of memories and chuckles ensued.

Twenty-year members were presented with pins, and many former Directors who were in attendance shared a few words about their experiences. Some that couldn't attend sent notes to be shared with the group. All comments and notes had a common theme, the organization had a profound effect on members' lives, and all were grateful for the experiences and friendships. Art Bauer, a former Director stated in part "Congratulations on your 4000 gifts to Summit area members. Keep it up!"

JANUARY PROGRAMS

Jan. 8 "Nice Presidents Finish Last" - Dr. Dan Cassino, Professor of Political Science, Fairleigh Dickinson University and author. CONCERT BENEFITS KEYS 2 SUCCESS

On December 1, 2018, The Sustainers of the Junior League of Summit presented a benefit concert for Keys 2 Success (K2S) at Christ Church in Summit. The performance of Rachmaninoff Variations on a Theme of Corelli, Op. 42 by pianist and K2S founder Jee-Hoon Krska featured The Keys 2 Success Piano Ensemble. The benefit was attended by members and sustainers of the Junior League, families whose children K2S serves, and other supporters of K2S.

Attendees echoed Tara Charvat, President Elect of the Junior League of Summit's, sentiment: "Really loved being part of tonight. The work you are doing is special!"

Keys 2 Success is a not-for-profit organization that provides music education to children in public elementary school and project housing in Newark, New Jersey. K2S is the first children's music program to target the lowest socio-economic group in Newark, for whom the effects of generations of poverty include lack of access to cultural institutions and social networks that are readily available to children in more privileged communities. K2S seeks to close this gap.


Keys was founded in 2016 by Jee-Hoon Krska of New Providence, a Julliard-trained classical pianist, MIT-educated engineer, wife and mother of three who wanted to provide these children

with the same opportunities available to her and our children. She believes that music education is a vehicle for kids to tap into their inherent capabilities and develop the discipline, strategies and confidence to thrive not just in music but in academics, social situations and the world, enhancing their lives and the communities in which those lives are lived. Modeled on the El Sistema program, Keys provides individualized training on the piano, coupled with percussion work to strengthen rhythmic skills, and ensemble work to enhance collaborative ability and peer learning skills.

Through its faculty and volunteers, K2S teaches piano every day during school hours at a public elementary school and out of school year-round at a public housing project. Starting with Pre-K, students receive lessons multiple days a week. The diverse community of adults, young adults and teenagers drawn from the surrounding communities forms a robust network of coaches and mentors for each student.

Since its launch in 2016 with 12 students, K2S has expanded and now teaches 76 children in school and over 100 in the summer program. The program instills discipline, leadership and other life skills, providing pathways to full, productive lives.
