## **RAHWAY'S OWN REFLECT RAHWAY 'TOUGH'**

"Don't let anyone put a ceiling on you," warns Joe Giacobbe, Strength and Conditioning Coach for the NFL's NY Jets, and one of five inductees into the 2018 class of "Rahway's Own." "Being tough," he advises the students, "is important in chasing a dream." He gives credit for this drive and persistence to achieve his dreams to the strength instilled in him by his hometown, the community of Rahway.

On Tuesday, November 27, Principal John Farinella opened the doors of Rahway High School once again to host this year's "Rahway's Own" ceremony, celebrating the induction of 2018's candidates Joe Giacobbe, European basketball star Louis Campbell, jazz musicians (and brothers) Allan and Warren Vaché, and Rahway historian Alex Shipley. The event, now in its 5th year, organized by Amy Garcia Phillips and Ann Marie Williams of the Rahway Arts and Business Partnership along with RHS Vice Principal Patricia Volino-Reinoso and assistant football coach and teacher Dan Garay, honors members from the Rahway community who have achieved excellence in their field, who have impacted and elevated Rahway, and who will represent their city as a place for innovation, creativity, and

community.

The celebratory opening comments for this year's program were proudly presented (and enthusiastically received by the high school students in attendance) by "Rahway's Own" alumnus Coach Fred Stueber who emphasized "how much talent we have in this town." As the 2018 inductees were recognized one by one for their achievements, Coach Stueber's sentiment was clearly incontrovertible.

Son of the late bassist Warren Vaché and elder brother of clarinetist Allan Vaché, cornetist Warren Vaché Jr. has defied being labeled as a swing musician, having listened to and absorbed all styles of music. He has spent years playing with such music greats as Rosemary Clooney, Benny Goodman, and Woody Herman and has performed at major jazz festivals such as the Newport Jazz Festival and fistivals in France, Italy, Japan, Australia, and Hong Kong. Although Mr. Vaché could not be present due to a prior engagement in India, his brother and famed clarinetist Allan appeared via video to address the RHS students on a personal level. Having graduated RHS in 1971, Allan Varché went on to perform with the Jim Cullum Jazz Band of San Antonio, Texas for (continued on page 2)

seventeen years, to tour Mexico for the US State Dept., and to perform at NYC's Carnegie Hall and Lincoln Center and The Kennedy Center in Washington D.C. He has recordings as a soloist and has also performed in Europe, Asia, Australia, and South America. Reassuring the students that, "Confusion is not unique to you," Mr. Varché encouraged them to "concentrate on what it is you love to do and develop it."

Louis Campbell, professional basketball player and currently point guard/shooting guard for the Antibes Sharks of the LNB Pro A., was honored with induction into "Rahway's Own" by Rahway Recreation Building Supervisor and Coach Gil Chandler and was represented at the event by his very proud mom, Ms. Sharon Mc Collins. Mr. Campbell, also an RHS graduate, played college basketball with the Buffalo Bulls, later playing most of his career in Germany. From August 2012-2016, he played with Strasbourg IG and was named the 2014-15 French Basketball Cup MVP.

Beginning his second season in the NFL after joining the NY Jets strength and conditioning staff in 2017, RHS and Rutgers graduate Joe Giacobbe was now welcomed as one of "Rahway's Own" by his brother and current Rahway mayor, Raymond Giacobbe. Exemplifying to students the value of remaining Rahway 'tough' on the road to achieving their goals, Joe has faced and has successfully overcome the many obstacles which lay in his

path to fulfilling his own personal dreams, thus clearly demonstrating the rewards of staying strong.










# PINCHING HOUSEPLANTS & ZEBRINA (WANDERING JEW)

As the day light hours lengthen houseplants begin to come out of their winter slumber and spur new growth. In February you will already notice your plants beginning to require water more often.

All plants reach for the sun, growing new leaves mostly on top. In the case of trailing houseplants, especially vines, this leaves the stems bare and leggy. These plants benefit from being 'pinched backed'. Pinching is a form of pruning that only removes a few leaves from the top of the plant. This technique encourages the plants to branch out on top. Then splitting in two, growing more lower leaves along the stem at the base, and often more flowers resulting in bushier healthier plants.

Pinching takes the least amount of energy away from the plants, removing only small young growth so it can refocus that energy on new leaves and roots.

#### **ZEBRINA (WANDERING JEW)**

Some popular houseplants such as 'Wandering Jew' benefit from a more aggressive pruning. For these a combination of pruning and propagation works best.

Zebrina are native to Mexico and are usually grown in hanging baskets which best show off their leaves. Wandering Jew is hardy and easy to grow indoors. Its variegated leaves are either white and green or purple and silver.

Zebrina should get bright light to help maintain color and tight leaves. They like warm temperatures and growth will slow down if it is too cold. Don't allow temperature to drop below 55 degrees. Water moderately allowing the top to dry out between watering to prevent root rot.

When the stems reach one to two feet it is time

to renovate them. This will keep the whole plants looking better.

Take a 3" cutting from the top, remove the lower leaves and root the stems. This can easily be done in a glass of water. When the roots are one inch long it is time to pot them up. At this point you can either plant cuttings in a fresh pot or you can poke holes in the soil of the original parent plants, then put in the cutting and tap fresh soil around them. Soon they will fill in and make your plants look as good as new.

In early spring remove discolored leaves and dispose of them. They will not regain color.

When taking cuttings remember to put a few aside to share with family and friends.



## AMBO'S GRAVE MARKER SHEDS LIGHT ON SLAVERY IN NEW JERSEY

In the Rahway Cemetery, not far back from the steady din of traffic emanating from St. Georges Avenue, one can find the grave of Ambo, a slave woman, who died on September 21, 1847. One of only a scant number of marked slave graves to be found in cemeteries throughout Union County, the inscription on Ambo's stone gives insight into the harsh reality of slavery as it was practiced even here in New Jersey. Her marker reads:

Ambo Died September 21, 1847 Aged 100 years Born of African parents In the family of Abraham Terrill

She remained a faithful servant to him, his children, and grand-children, until her death.

Slavery in New Jersey goes far back into the Colonial period, as early as the 1630s according to some sources, and becomes a firmly established system in 1664 after the English take control of the colony. By 1704 there was a large enough slave population in the Jersey colony that it was deemed necessary to enact a so-called slave code which formally reduced the liberties of the enslaved. It should be noted that there was lower percentage of slaves in the Rahway/Plainfield area largely on account of the presence of a substantial Quaker population whose members were staunch abolitionists.

In the two decades following Revolutionary War, most northern states ended the practice of slavery within their borders. New Jersey, which by 1790 had a slave population of over 11,000, was the last northern state to abolish the institution, but it was not done without a cruel stipulation. In 1804, the state legislature passed "An Act for the Gradual Abolition of Slavery" which in actuality allowed slavery to continue well into the mid-nineteenth century. The statute provided that African Americans born to slave mothers after July 4, 1804 had to serve lengthy apprenticeships to the owners of their mothers. Females would be freed upon reaching 21 years of age, and males upon reaching 25. Slaves born before the law was passed were considered

indentured servants who were apprenticed for life.

In the case of Ambo, the law did nothing to change her situation. Having been born before the 1804 Act, she literally remained in servitude until her death in 1847. In fact, having been born sometime in the 1740s as a child of slaves, she was destined to be a slave her entire life.

The origin of Ambo's name is not known for certain, but it could possibly come from Ambo Point (now Perth Amboy), a city that was a major port of entry for the importation of slaves. She was born into the family of Abraham Terrill, a prominent man in Rahway who owned the Terrill Tavern, a popular meeting place located just north of the Robinson Branch of the Rahway

River on the west side of St. Georges Avenue. Following the death of Mr. Terrill and his wife Mary, Ambo became the property of their son Thomas.

Ambo's duties in the Terrill home and inn would have been varied, but basically, she would best be described as a household domestic. If the legend be true that General George Washington stopped at the Terrill Tavern on his way through Rahway during the Revolutionary War, it is possible that Ambo might have seen the general and perhaps might have even served him.

The United States Census of 1840 lists the household of Sylvanie Terrill, wife of Thomas, to include a free Negro woman between the ages of 55 and 100. If this reference was to Ambo, and she was freed in her old age, it would have been very difficult for her to start a new, independent life. It is more probable that she stayed with the Terrill's and continued serving the family she had known all her life.

Over the course of the three generations of working for the Terrills, Ambo's grave marker suggests that she was truly perceived as a member of the family. In the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries (and to some degree to this day), cemetery plots were purchased as the final resting place for all members of the family where they would be together forever. Family plots were exclusively for the mortal remains of family members only. The fact that Ambo's grave lies in the Terrill family plot amongst the Terrill relations, shows the strong relationship that must have been built between her and the Terrills. Also, the fact that a headstone was placed on her grave, a tribute almost never given to slaves, is another indication of the love and respect the family felt towards this special woman and family member named Ambo.

# **AMANDA COCCIA AND MARYGRACE PURYEAR** PLAYING VOLLEYBALL AT FELICIAN

Amanda Coccia (Rahway, N.J./Roselle champion Holy Family University. Catholic) and MaryGrace Puryear (Cranford, N.J./Cranford High School) were members of the 2018 women's volleyball team at Felician University.


Felician is affiliated with NCAA Division II and competes in the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference (CACC). The 2018 Golden Falcons posted an overall won-lost record of 13-18, nearly doubling the previous school record for victories, and finished in fourth place in the CACC North Division with an 8-11 league mark.

Felician reached the CACC Tournament for the first time since 2013. The Golden Falcons bowed out in the quarterfinals, 3-2, to eventual

Coccia, a senior defensive specialist and team co-captain, played in 27 matches. In 80 sets, she accumulated 136 digs (1.70 per set) and six aces (0.07). Coccia will conclude her four-year Felician career with 697 digs in 106 matches, both totals among the top 10 in school history. She is a 2015 graduate of Roselle Catholic.

Puryear, a sophomore defensive specialist, amassed 241 digs, 50 assists, and 27 aces in 2018 after posting just 69 digs, 10 assists and nine aces as a freshman. Starting at libero, she recorded 30 digs in a four-set home win over Concordia College on September 14. Puryear is a 2017 graduate of Cranford High.
