STUDENTS TAKE A STAND AGAINST MODERN-DAY SLAVERY

World history students at Linden High School recently took action to spread awareness about the problem of human trafficking, and in the process raised their own social consciousness.

On Friday, January 25, 2019, about 90 freshmen in Derrick Potts' classes went around the school putting magnets on lockers with messages from the New Jersey Coalition Against Human Trafficking. The goal of the "Locker Slam" is to shine a spotlight on a problem that is often hidden in the shadows.

Human trafficking is the exploitation of a person through force, fraud or coercion, and can include sex trafficking, forced labor or domestic servitude.

The students took photos of the magnets and shared them on social media with the hashtag #NJStudentsForFreedom.

"Combining the locker magnets with social media was a great way to engage students on this critical topic," said Superintendent Danny A. Robertozzi. "Of course, they are all familiar with social media, but this project helped to show them the power it has to spread important messages. So they learn about the problem of human trafficking, but also learn about their own capability to bring about change."

The magnets came in seven colors, each with a different message, including "Be a Voice for the Voiceless," "Slavery Still Exists," and "Your Voice Can Change the World." They also have the organization's website njhumantrafficking.org so students will know where to go for more information, and a number to text for help or to report human trafficking.

Potts said it's an important message to get out and that the "Locker Slam" is a great way to engage his students in a way that goes beyond classroom lessons.

"We talked about the African slave trade, then to put a more modern connection to it, we went over human trafficking," he said. "What is it? What are the signs of it? What are different types?

"But kids like to move around, so they're out of the room doing something different. And they get to use social media in class, so that really helps it as well."

Potts said the magnets also made an impact on other students who saw them around the building.

"I was in the cafeteria and I had a girl ask me, 'Are you Mr. Potts? What is this?' So I told her about it, and she said, 'This is really cool.' I don't know who this girl was, but the goal is to get other students to take a picture of this and use the hashtag. So not only my classes but other students put it out there.

"The more people who see it, the more interest, and it brings more awareness of the issue."





RETIRED POLICE OFFICER RETURNS TO SERVICE AT LINDEN HIGH SCHOOL

Keith Aslin retired from the Linden Police Department three years ago, but now he's back on patrol at Linden High School.

Aslin took his post on Tuesday, January 22, 2019 as a Special Law Enforcement Officer (SLEO) Class III providing security at the LHS Academy of Science and Technology.

Aslin served for 28 years with the Linden Police, retiring as a detective lieutenant in charge of the Juvenile Aid Bureau in 2016.

The Board of Education and City of Linden agreed in October to hire retired law enforcement officers to provide security at the city's largest schools. Aslin is the first to begin working.

"We couldn't have asked for a better candidate than Officer Aslin," said Superintendent Danny A. Robertozzi. "As an LHS graduate and former head of the Juvenile Aid Bureau, he knows our schools, he's familiar with the security procedures, and he's experienced at working with students. It's reassuring to have someone so knowledgeable and experienced watching over our students and staff. Welcome back to the Linden Public Schools family!"

The Board of Education began discussing the possibility of hiring retired officers after a shooting at a high school in Parkland, Florida, last year. That was also a galvanizing moment for Aslin.

"I had so much training in this that after the incident in Parkland I wanted to give back a little bit," he said. "When this came along, it was a good opportunity to come back. I like working in the schools and I like the kids. I'm excited to come back."

Aslin grew up in Linden, attending School No. 8 and McManus Junior High School, and graduating from Linden High School in 1983. He graduated from Rutgers University-Newark in 1987 and joined the LPD in 1988.

"As the former commander of our Juvenile Aid Bureau, Keith has a comprehensive understanding of our schools, and I am confident he will do a tremendous job," said Police Chief

David Hart. "We are very pleased that he decided to use his considerable experience to once again serve our community."

Before heading the Juvenile Bureau, Aslin was in charge of the Community Policing Unit and taught DARE to elementary school students. He later was instrumental in starting the "Pass the Message On" anti-bias program at LHS, in which older students design creative ways to teach younger students about fighting bias and bullying.

"I've always cared about Linden," he said. "I enjoyed working for the city. I had a great career, and this was just a great opportunity to come back and do what I like."

New Jersey established the Class III Special Law Enforcement Officer position in 2016. Only retired law enforcement officers are eligible for the position, which authorizes them, on a parttime basis, to provide security on school premises during normal school hours or when occupied by students or staff.

These officers operate under the authority of the local chief of police, and while they have the same authority and duties as regular, full-time police officers while providing school security, they cannot replace regular law enforcement officers or school resource officers currently employed in schools.

Aslin will be working closely with LHS Resource Officer Detective Leon Pastor, a member of the Juvenile Aid Bureau, who works with students on various initiatives in addition to providing security.

"He's not leaving," Aslin said. "He's there for good, and I'm here to help."

Considering his background, he would also like to be heavily involved with the school.

"Along with the obvious security part, walking around the building, talking with the kids, Dr. Robertozzi's hope was that I would get involved," Aslin said. "I told them I'd be willing to teach or whatever they want me to do.

"I missed working with the schools. That was one of the things I enjoyed the most in policing."




DON'T FALL FOR SCAM CALLS AND EMAILS IMPERSONATING IRS

suspicious individuals claiming to be from the IRS.

Thousands of people have lost millions of dollars and their personal information to tax scams. Scammers use the regular mail, telephone, or email to set up individuals, businesses, payroll, and tax professionals.

Scammers and cyberthieves continue to use the IRS as bait. The most common tax scams are

The IRS is urging the public to be aware of phone calls and emails from thieves who pretend to be from the IRS. Scammers use the IRS name. logo, fake employee names and badge numbers to try to steal money and identities from

> Taxpayers need to be wary of phone calls or automated messages from someone who claims to be from the IRS. Often, these criminals will say taxpayers owe money and demand payment right away. Other times, scammers will lie to taxpayers and say they're due a refund. The thieves ask for bank account information over the phone. The IRS warns taxpayers not to fall for these scams.

> Below are several tips that will help filers avoid becoming a scam victim.

IRS employees will not:

- Call demanding an immediate payment. The IRS won't call taxpayers if they owe taxes without first sending a bill in the mail.
- Demand payment without allowing taxpayers to question or appeal the amount owed.
- Demand that taxpayers pay their taxes in a specific way, such as with a prepaid debit card.
- Ask for credit or debit card numbers over the
- Threaten to contact local police or similar agencies to arrest taxpayers for non-payment
- Threaten legal action, such as a lawsuit.

If taxpayers don't owe or don't think they owe any tax, and they receive an inquiry like this, they should:

- Contact the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration. Use TIGTA's "IRS Impersonation Scam Reporting" web page to report the incident.
- Report the incident to the Federal Trade Commission. Use the "FTC Complaint Assistant" on FTC.gov. Add "IRS Telephone Scam" to the comments of your report.

In most cases, an IRS phishing scam is an unsolicited, fake email that claims to come from the IRS. Some emails link to sham websites that look real. The scammers' goal is to lure victims to give up their personal and financial information. If the thieves get what they're after, they use it to steal a victim's money and identity.

For those taxpayers who get a phishing email, the IRS offers this advice:

- Don't reply to the message.
- Don't give out your personal or financial information.
- Forward the email to phishing@irs.gov. Then delete it.
- Don't open any attachments or click on any links. They may have malicious code that will infect your computer.

ACADEMY OF CONTINUING EDUCATION FOR ADULTS WITH DISABILITIES ENROLLING FOR MARCH-APRIL CLASSES

The Academy of Continuing Education (ACE) in Cranford is accepting applications for its March 4-April 26 semester. ACE offers adults with developmental or physical disabilities the opportunity to pursue continuing education as an alternative to traditional day programs.

"Adults with disabilities who have graduated from the public school system or specialized schools often have limited choices when planning their future," said Robin Morris-Marano, ACE director. "Their options often are limited to generic day programs that do not offer the intellectual stimulation and growth provided by our academy. Our program also is ideal for older adults with disabilities who wish to sharpen previously learned skills."

ACE's course offerings for the upcoming semester include math, reading and creative writing, history, science, jewelry design and merchandising, card making, visual arts and crafts, music, performing arts, career and financial literacy, media production and self-understanding/peer leadership.

Based on their interests, students may take as many or as few classes as they choose.

"ACE differs from a traditional day program, where the attendee's day is planned for them," Morris-Marano said. "We work with our students and their families to help them select the classes that will bring them the most enjoyment and from which they will get the most benefit."

AMBASSADORS GIVE HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS A VOICE IN ADMINISTRATION

They are the voice of the students, and the ears of the administration.

The Linden High School Student Ambassadors are a small group that acts as a conduit to allow students to voice their ideas and concerns, and allows the administration to stay in tune with the needs of the student body.

The group holds working meetings to brainstorm and develop their ideas for improvements in the school. Some of the ideas are their own, but many come from other students who talk to the ambassadors about what they want.

"We ask other students, because they are more comfortable with us, what they would like to change or if there are things we can improve in the school," said Katrina Charles, a junior member of the Student Ambassadors.

The group meets once a month with Superintendent Danny A. Robertozzi, Principal Yelena Horre, and Director of Human Resources Michele Dorney to go over an agenda developed by the students.

"Sometimes I am amazed at the ideas the Student Ambassadors bring to me," Robertozzi said. "They suggest responsible, informed initiatives that are well-reasoned and really have the best interests of the school at heart. Being with the Ambassadors allows me to feel closer to our students and lets them know that they have a place at the table in shaping the policies that affect them."

The Student Ambassadors' mission statement sums up the group:

"The Student Ambassadors' mission is to be the voice for every student. Our goal is to inform the Superintendent and Administration of our aspirations, continue to create new initiatives, and foster a positive environment for the student body of Linden High School."

Teacher Nicole Campo and school social worker Ryan Devaney, who are in their first year as advisers to the group, say the members have a great opportunity to do good for the school and for themselves.

"It gives them an opportunity to speak with their peers and gather those ideas, and at the same time it allows them to sit with the administration and have their ideas heard firsthand," Devaney said. "It allows them to understand how to work with different groups of people, whether it be students, peers, teachers, or administrators."

The group, which has been around for three years and has 17 members this year, has an impressive list of accomplishments: a year-end school picnic, a breakfast for honor roll students, a quiz bowl, and a new student code of conduct are a few.

Also, the ideas for last year's rally for gun safety were developed and implemented by the Student Ambassadors and discussed with the administration beforehand.

"Everyone was able to express themselves, and the administration was open to that," said ambassador Janee Bailey, a junior. "So that made it OK, and students loved that." Other ideas in various levels of development include "IB for a Day," which allows underclassmen to shadow International Baccalaureate students for a day to learn about the rigorous academic program; "Tiger for a Day," which would allow middle-schoolers to shadow a high school student; a Wall of Honor that would honor graduates who go on to serve in the military; and the use of debit cards in the school cafeteria.

In February the group participated in a sock drive, which it is organized with other student organizations at the school. They collected packs of new socks to donate to area shelters for those in need.

"It's a small group, but our goal is to benefit our entire school," Campo said.

Students say they feel empowered by having the ear of the superintendent on issues that are important to them.

"Dr. Robertozzi has received us great," Bailey said. "He has taken and listened to everything we've said. We know that some things can't happen overnight, or some things just can't happen. But everything we have brought to him he understands and discusses with us and Mrs. Horre."

Besides all the good the Student Ambassadors can do in improving the school culture, they also get a lot out of being in such a key role as gobetween for students and administrators.

"For me, there's more to school than just coming here for classes then going home," Bailey said. "It's an important role for me to play, where I can relay student messages to higher-ups to maybe open their minds."

Devaney and Campo say they've seen a substantial amount of growth in the students.

"Just seeing the way that they work together," Devaney said, "and their ideas ..."

"... and the way that they listen to each other and feed off each other," Campo finished. "It's amazing to see that."

The Student Ambassadors are working hard to spread the word so that more students know about them, centered on the rallying cry, "Who we are, what we do, revolves around you!"

"I want the students to know that we're here and how to recognize us," said Sarah Mostafa, a junior. "If they want to change anything about the school they can come to us to talk about it."

Students have been given orange golf shirts with the school district logo that identify them as Student Ambassadors, as well as thick orange "Student Ambassador" lanyards for their ID cards, to help them stand out to other students.

They are working with the LHS TV/Digital Media class to develop a segment for the TNT News student broadcast to help spread the word about their role.

"A lot of people don't know about us," Charles said. "So we want to get the word out. When they see big things like the picnic or the honor roll breakfast, they don't know where it comes from. So we want to let them know that it's us doing it, so that they will come to us if they want to change something."

Bailey added, "We've been given this title to relay the message, so come talk to us. We want to help."



Rahway Lodge #1075 of the Benevolent and cellular phones are used to purchase prepaid international calling cards. On average, Cell Phones For Soldiers distributes 1,500 calling cards each week to bases around the world, care package programs, deployment ceremonies and VA hospitals.

> For every donated phone, Cell Phones For Soldiers is able to provide two and a half hours of free talk time to deployed troops.

> Since 2004, more than 15 million phones have been recycled or repurposed. Approximately half of the phones processed are reconditioned and reused. Phones and components that cannot be refurbished are dismantled and responsibly recycled into reclaimed materials, including: gold, silver and platinum from circuit boards; copper wiring from phone chargers; nickel, iron, cadmium and lead from battery packs.
