CHATHAM TOWNSHIP VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT RECEIVES LARGEST DONATION IN ITS HISTORY

The Woman's Club of Chatham presented the Chatham Township Volunteer Fire Department (CTFD) with a very generous donation of \$25,000. The donation will be used towards the purchase of an Incident Command Vehicle (ICV).

This most recent donation continues over 100 years of educational and civic enrichment of the Chatham community by The Woman's Club of Chatham through humanitarian activities and charitable grants. The Club has recently made substantial donations to the Chatham Emergency Squad, Chatham Borough Fire and Police Departments and the Chatham Township Police Department.

Vital to the successful and safe operations on the fireground, the ICV is used to transport the Chief directly to the incident and contains mobile radios, a mobile data terminal, command whiteboard, accountability board and structural preplans for various larger buildings.

CTFD President John Robertson and Chief Matthew Lemons noted, "As one of the largest donations in CTFD history, this generous gift will greatly improve our department's ability to respond to and manage significant or

simultaneous emergencies in Chatham Township and its Mutual Aid partners. The vehicle will also enhance our ability to better protect and preserve life and property." On behalf of the entire department, President John Robertson and Chief Matthew Lemons extend CTFD's deep appreciation to the Woman's Club of Chatham.

Additional money is still needed for the purchase of the vehicle. The CTFD is a nonprofit 501 (c) 3 and relies on donations to fund its operations and to purchase equipment. RECLAIMING OUR VOICE: NEW JERSEY'S CENTRAL ROLE IN THE FIGHT FOR WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE

The Chatham Historical Society and the Chatham Township Historical Society are providing a presentation on the women's suffrage movement in New Jersey on Sunday, April 14, 2019 at 2:30 p.m. at the Library of the Chathams. The event is free and open to the public.

Carol Simon Levin portrays Lillian Feickert, president of the New Jersey Woman Suffrage Association from 1912-1920, to tell the story of the role of New Jersey women in the long struggle for women's suffrage.

Not many know that for 225 years women had the right to vote in only one state, New Jersey, a right they would lose in 1807 and not win back for more than five generations. New Jersey's role in the struggle to regain that right is largely overlooked.

Levin portrays a role played by New Jersey women in the suffrage movement. Among those is Elizabeth Cady Stanton, who proclaimed "all men and women are created equal" at the Women's Rights Convention of 1848 in Seneca Falls, NY. She lived in Tenafly, NJ in 1869 when she and Susan B. Anthony founded the National Woman Suffrage Association and were writing the first three volumes of their History of

Woman Suffrage.

Not many are aware that Lucy Stone was a resident of South Orange in 1858 when she refused to pay taxes, stating "No Taxation without Representation," and was still there in 1869 when she and her husband founded the American Woman Suffrage Organization. The previous year, Portia Gage and 171 other Vineland women brought their own ballot box to the polls in order to cast their votes for president. Victoria Woodhull, the first woman to run for president, launched her candidacy in Vineland three years later.

Levin's presentation includes stories of the Grimke sisters (who spoke out against slavery and for women's rights from their home in Shrewsbury), Dr. Florence Spearing Randolph (chairwoman of the NJ Association of Colored Women's Clubs and executive board member on the NJ Woman Suffrage Association), Alice Low Turnbull Hopkins (who supported Alice Paul's Washington pickets), and lastly, Alice Paul, who re-energized the movement for a federal amendment. Together their tireless efforts propelled women's suffrage past reluctant male voters and through state and national legislatures to the final success of the 19th Amendment.

MARK SPINNER HONORED FOR 40 YRS OF SERVICE TO EMERGENCY SQUAD

On Saturday, February 9, 2019, at a reception to install the newly elected officers of the Chatham Emergency Squad, the evening quickly turned to one of celebration, stories of heroism and profound admiration and gratitude for Mark Spinner, aka “Spanky,” who had recently retired following a record-setting 40 years serving as an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) with the Chatham Emergency Squad.

A true fixture of the Chatham community and lifelong resident, Spinner had worked for the United States Postal Service delivering mail throughout the Chathams, before serving as a crossing guard, stationed at the corner of Main Street and Lafayette, helping middle school students safely cross the street.

But it was his 40 years of devotion and dedication every Saturday night from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. to help those in need which defines the legacy of Spinner, who was recognized among a grateful audience of past and present EMTs and members of the Chatham Borough and Chatham Township committees. Accepting his first award of the evening, Spinner recalled the time when a patient later tracked him down, stopped him on his postal route and gave him a hug for saving his life. “This is what has motivated me for 40 years, and I have to say – there is no greater joy in life,” said Spinner, holding back tears.

When not saving lives, Spinner is revered for bringing smiles to thousands of children of all ages with the advent of the Chatham Emergency Squad “Snow Village”. For 15 years, Spinner has been running an impressive display of model houses and figurines with a working model train, which takes up a holiday-themed room at the Squad building. Spinner has agreed to loan the equipment to the Squad for future generations to enjoy.

DICK RICHARDS AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE

Named after Dick Richards who served as the President of the Chatham Emergency Squad in 1966 and was a member for 37 years (a previous record), the Dick Richards Award for Excellence is given out to an exceptional EMT who is considered a role model for others to follow, someone who exemplifies leadership and greatly contributes to the collegial atmosphere of the Squad. Established in 2012, only three members have received this award, including Jerry Medina (2012), Marty Secheyay (2014) and Sam Francis (2016). The nominating committee and the Board of Trustees unanimously voted to award Spinner with the Squad’s highest honor.

“Mark is a living legend throughout Chatham, and his record of service and an abundant love for helping others exemplifies the best of the Chatham Emergency Squad,” said Steve Davenport, Captain of the Chatham Emergency Squad. “His spirit of teamwork is contagious, and he is someone we all greatly admire. It was an emotional evening filled with abundant recognition befitting a man of his stature.”

ADDITIONAL HONORS

Spinner’s wife of 36 years, Judy Spinner, was also thanked for her service to the squad and for sharing so much of Mark’s time. Following numerous standing ovations, the evening was further capped by Chatham Borough Mayor Bruce Harris, who issued a proclamation commending Spinner for his years of service to the people of Chatham.

Lastly, to commemorate the occasion, the Chatham Emergency Squad “retired” number 3907 - Spinner’s radio call signal. This was fittingly marked by the “hoisting” of Spinner’s uniform to the ceiling, as is done upon the retirement of famous sports heroes.






