The hard work of nineteen current and former Green Brook students has paid off in the recent New Jersey MathCounts competition. MathCounts is a national competition that was started back in the early 1980s. Every year for over 30 years students across the country have practiced quick thinking skills through a setting that emphasizes fun, math-based competition. The Green Brook students competed against each other over several months of practice. Ultimately, nine students from Green Brook Middle School were selected for the regional competition at the New Jersey Institute of Technology on Saturday, February 16, 2019.

The MathCounts competition at GBMS was sponsored by the Green Brook Education and Athletic Foundation. GBMS students involved in the contest were coached by Vivian Zhang and Jagdeep Bhatia. Vivian and Jagdeep are former students at GBMS and are currently attending Watchung Hills Regional High School. Every week for the last five months Vivian and Jagdeep have spent time coaching the team. GBMS was represented by Mihika Naik, Sara Liu, Ben Liu, Anmol Bhatia, Bryan Zhang, Sravan Desu, Arya Reddy, Shanmuka Sadhu and Ryan Wang. All of their collective hard work paid off. The Green Brook students won the regional competition at NJIT in February!

After their win at the regional competition, the Green Brook students were represented by Anmol Bhatia, Ben Liu, Sara Liu and Bryan Zhang in the state finals at Rutgers University. Green Brook's four finalists ended up in sixth place overall. While their final team results were admirable, it wasn't high enough as a group for the team to move on.







estimated 53,260 New Jerseyans will learn they have cancer this year and getting to their scheduled treatment will be their greatest concern. Every day thousands of cancer patients need a ride to treatment here in the Garden State, but some may not have a way to get there.

For the last six years Meg Wilkens has been helping so many of her neighbors during the toughest times of their lives. She has been driving New Jersey residents to their cancer treatments through the American Cancer Society's volunteer Road To Recovery program, which provides free transportation to and from treatment for people with cancer who do not have a ride or are unable to drive themselves.

"Transportation shouldn't be a roadblock to cancer treatment," said Wilkens. "Even with help from family and friends, sometimes patients have trouble getting every ride they need. I am a second-generation Road To Recovery driver, my

Would you drive a mile to save a life? An father did it when I was growing up. I knew when I retired I wanted to give back and help people."

> For those who cannot drive themselves or have no other means of getting to their treatment, Road To Recovery volunteers donate their spare time and the use of their cars to give cancer patients a much-needed lift. Patients can then receive the life-saving treatments they need.

> "When you drive, you learn about people's hopes and fears," she said. "None of them are quitters; they all want to beat cancer. I have made some lifelong friends and have enjoyed every ride."

SOMERSET COUNTY LIBRARY SYSTEM PARTNERS WITH ROLLING THUNDER TO HELP PRESERVE VETERAN MEMORIES

The Somerset County Library System of New Jersey partnered with Rolling Thunder®, Inc., an organization that focuses on advocacy for prisoners of war and persons missing in action, to help preserve the collective memories of veterans and their families through a digitization event made possible through a grant from National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH).


"We have been honored to work with Artie and Elaine Muller to preserve the history of Rolling Thunder®, Inc., the organization, and of the members of their community," said Rebecca Sandoval Sloat, grant coordinator and SCLSNJ technical services manager. "In preserving the history of our veterans we are bringing honor to their memories and paving a way for their stories to live on for future generations."

Thirty-two items were digitized or photographed during the meeting including: an award from the French president, an oversized group shot of Rolling Thunder®, Inc. members in front of the Lincoln Memorial, and the Taekwondo gi (uniform) of a veteran who was awarded for his skill in the martial art. The digitized items will be integrated into SCLSNJ's common heritage initiative which will make the contributed items available for research and use by future generations by adding these items to Rutgers University's New Jersey Digital Highway, by making them available in our Library's online catalog, and by submitting them to the Digital Public Library of America (DPLA).

In addition to partnering with Rolling Thunder®, Inc. for this special event, the Library will continue to host monthly digitization days. During the digitization days Somerset County residents are encouraged to add their family's most prized possessions to the Library System's catalog including: historic photographs, letters, or documents; sketches, paintings, or other artwork; family heirlooms including recipes; jewelry or decorative arts; textiles such as quilts, samplers, flags, or uniforms; antique toys; or something uniquely your own.
