Last year was both a winning year and the start of a new athletic career for Kenilworth resident Marissa Scalzo. She competed in The Mason-Dixon Challenge, a two-day mounted archery competition held in Pennsylvania and Virginia in September and December. Scalzo won all three courses in her division over the two days and was named her division's overall High Point Mounted Archer.

"I went into my first mounted archery tournament with one goal: be competitive," says Scalzo "I'm elated to have walked away the high point archer in my division, and I think it's safe to say I'm hooked!"

Scalzo began her archery career while in high school and has ridden horses off-and-on since she was 10. Mounted archery seemed like a natural progression for her athletically. "When I found out about mounted archery as a competitive sport, I just had to try it. Fusing two of my favorite sports and passions into one- it was a perfect fit." Scalzo began training for mounted archery at the end of 2017, and 2018 was her first year competing.

WHAT, WHERE, AND WHEN IN OLD KENILWORTH - THE BARRICADES

If you take a trip to the ends of Columbia Ave., Locust Dr., and Arbor St. you'll be confronted by sets of barricades, with a narrow passageway at the center. They block motor vehicles from crossing the border between Kenilworth and Cranford while permitting pedestrian access through the center. Why are the barricades there? How long have they been there?

A border war of sorts broke out between the two towns in 1940. That's when 350 houses in Kenilworth's Blue Ridge section began to be built from S. 17th St. to Columbia Ave.

Cranford residents on Columbia Ave. petitioned their government to block off their street at the border in fear of traffic from the Boulevard taking short cuts to get to Orange Ave. The concern spread to Cranford residents on Locust Dr. and Arbor St. As a result, Cranford officials authorized the barricades to go up. Once up, Kenilworth residents demanded that they come down. The mini-border war was on.

Kenilworth residents were jubilant when the borough took down the barricades when it was discovered that a Cranford contractor had erected them on the Kenilworth side of the border. Cranford remedied this to their residents' delight by reinstalling them on the Cranford side.

In time, Kenilworth residents realized that they, too, benefited from not having their streets become short cuts and asked their mayor and council to install barricades in case Cranford took theirs down. Over time there was sporadic debate as to whether or not to keep the barricades in place, but now, 79 years later, they're still in place, although rebuilt several times.

When I was a young boy, Mrs. Katherine

Hogaboom of Columbia Ave., had a small Crosley mini-subcompact car -4 ft. wide, 12 ft. long. When her and other kids wanted to go to the Cranford movies or her daughters and friends to the Cranford Girl Scout House, she would pack us into her teeny car, and drive it straight through the narrow pedestrian break in the center of the barricade. Eventually the passageway was made narrower and the Crosley no longer fit. We then walked or took the old Beviano red bus to get to our Cranford destinations.

A SAFETY REMINDER FROM THE KENILWORTH VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPT

Submitted by Shawn Kelly Let's all remember to check in on our elderly neighbors.

Often it's a next door neighbor, Meals on Wheels delivery volunteer or even a postal carrier who first discovers a senior may need more help. As a neighbor, you've probably noticed that seniors tend to have regular routines. Does the elderly gentleman next door always pick up his newspaper from the front stoop by 8 a.m.? Why is it still outside at noon? If lights-out is usually at 9 p.m., why are the lights still on at 11 p.m.? Could someone be sick or hurt? If your dog is uncharacteristically barking, has someone fallen out in the yard? When something seems a little off, it may be time to take a careful look outside, call your neighbor or knock on the door.

Here are some tips for staying vigilant, but not intrusive, when looking out for your neighbor's well-being:

1. Write down his or her full name and phone number. You can always call the house to check

say hello.

2. Get a phone number for your neighbor's closest friend or family member. This can be as easy as introducing yourself to her as she gets out of the car on a regular visit and saying, "If I'm ever concerned about your mom (or dad or aunt), it would be nice to have your number." Offer your name and number, too.

3. If you are able, offer to help unload groceries, cook a meal, pick up prescriptions, shovel snow or mow the lawn. This is a great

on your neighbor, and if everything is fine, just opportunity for young people to pitch in and help an elder. Your kids will puff up with pride when they do a good job, and a short visit from a polite young person has the potential to make your neighbor's day.

> 4. Set boundaries. Remember you are not completely responsible for your neighbor's health and well-being, but your observations and helpful interactions can be an additional layer of safety. Contact family members, Police or Fire if you have concerns. Always call 911 if there is an emergency.
