SENIOR CITIZEN HEALTH FAIR - MAY 15

the New Providence Senior Citizens Club will host the annual Senior Citizen Health Fair on Wednesday, May 15, 2019, from 8 - 11 a.m. at the DeCorso Community Center, located at 15 East Fourth Street, New Providence.

All New Providence residents, 55 years or older, are invited to attend the Health Fair which will host a comprehensive list of health screenings and medical information at no cost to participants. Pre-registration is required for some screenings.

The focus for the Health Fair is to provide screenings relevant to senior health and wellbeing. One of the free central Health Fair screenings offered is a Stroke Health Risk Assessment conducted by the Community Health Department of Atlantic Health System's Overlook Medical Center. This screening is an assessment of significant stroke risk factors with follow-up counseling and is available to the first

The New Providence Health Department and 30 registrants, Although the aging process alone is not a risk factor for Stroke, contributing risk factors such as the development of Hypertension, Diabetes, and Heart Disease can increase the incidence of Stroke and other related illnesses. Pre-registration for this screening is required.

> There is also free fasting blood chemistry screenings available for all New Providence residents who have reached the age of 55 years, and who have completed the required in-person pre-registration prior to the Fair.

> The pre-registration will begin on Monday, April 22nd, through Friday, May 3rd, between the hours of 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. at the DeCorso Community Center.

SHROVE TUESDAY SUPPER AND WEDNESDAY LENTEN SERVICES AT FAITH LUTHERAN

On March 5, 2019, the evening before Ash Wednesday, members of Faith Lutheran Church in New Providence shared in a traditional Shrove Tuesday Supper of pancakes, ham and berries, which included Mardi Gras decorations.

Shrove Tuesday derives its name from the ritual of shriving that Christians undertook many years ago. In shriving, Christians confess their sins and receive absolution for the sins. Since Lent is a time of abstinence, Shrove Tuesday was viewed by Christians as their last chance in forty days to indulge themselves. They would eat the foods that were not allowed in Lent and particularly the foods that would spoil. Pancakes were often chosen as they were a dish that could use up all the eggs, fats and milk in the house with just the addition of flour.

The chairperson of Faith's Shrove Tuesday Supper, for the fourth consecutive year, was Jessica Short of New Providence.

During each Wednesday of Lent, Faith Lutheran is conducting two Eucharistic Services. One is at 12 noon and is a spoken service of twenty to twenty-five minutes in length. The second is at 7:30 p.m. and is a service of hymns and prayer. The theme of the services is "My Hope is Built on Nothing Less."

Faith Lutheran conducts an open communion table. All visitors, who are baptized members of the Christian church, are welcome to the Lord's Table.



Would you drive a mile to save a life? An estimated 53,260 New Jerseyans will learn they have cancer this year and getting to their scheduled treatment will be their greatest concern. Every day thousands of cancer patients need a ride to treatment here in the Garden State, but some may not have a way to get there.

For the last six years Meg Wilkens has been helping so many of her neighbors during the toughest times of their lives. She has been driving New Jersey residents to their cancer treatments through the American Cancer Society's volunteer Road To Recovery program, which provides free transportation to and from treatment for people with cancer who do not have a ride or are unable to drive themselves.

"Transportation shouldn't be a roadblock to cancer treatment," said Wilkens. "Even with help from family and friends, sometimes patients have trouble getting every ride they need. I am a second-generation Road To Recovery driver, my

"When you drive, you learn about people's hopes and fears," she said. "None of them are quitters; they all want to beat cancer. I have made some lifelong friends and have enjoyed every ride."



CLIMATE CHANGE IN THE GARDEN STATE

The League of Women Voters of Berkeley Heights, New Providence & Summit is celebrating Earth Day with a program on "Climate Change in the Garden State". The program will be held on Thursday, April 11, 2019 at 7:30 p.m. at the De Corso Community Center, 15 East 4th Street, New Providence.

Our speaker, Dr. David Robinson, NJ Climatologist, has conducted research that focuses on the diverse weather and climate of the Garden State. This includes topics such as climate change, drought, flooding and issues involving agriculture, transportation, public safety and commerce. Dr. Robinson has served on national committees and occasionally publishes on issues related to his collection and archiving of accurate climatic data.





Thousands of people have lost millions of dollars and their personal information to tax scams. Scammers use the regular mail, telephone, or email to set up individuals, businesses, payroll, and tax professionals.

Scammers and cyberthieves continue to use the IRS as bait. The most common tax scams are phone calls and emails from thieves who pretend to be from the IRS. Scammers use the IRS name, logo, fake employee names and badge numbers

taxpayers.

Taxpayers need to be wary of phone calls or automated messages from someone who claims to be from the IRS. Often, these criminals will say taxpayers owe money and demand payment right away. Other times, scammers will lie to taxpayers and say they're due a refund. The thieves ask for bank account information over the phone. The IRS warns taxpayers not to fall for these scams.

Below are several tips that will help filers avoid becoming a scam victim.

IRS employees will not:

- Call demanding an immediate payment. The IRS won't call taxpayers if they owe taxes without first sending a bill in the mail.
- Demand payment without allowing taxpayers to question or appeal the amount owed.
- Demand that taxpayers pay their taxes in a specific way, such as with a prepaid debit card.
- Ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.
- Threaten to contact local police or similar agencies to arrest taxpayers for nonpayment of taxes.
- Threaten legal action, such as a lawsuit. If taxpayers don't owe or don't think they owe any tax, and they receive an inquiry like this, they should:
 - Contact the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration. Use TIGTA's "IRS Impersonation Scam Reporting" web page to report the incident.
 - Report the incident to the Federal Trade Commission. Use the "FTC Complaint Assistant" on FTC.gov. Add "IRS Telephone Scam" to the comments of your report.

In most cases, an IRS phishing scam is an unsolicited, fake email that claims to come from the IRS. Some emails link to sham websites that look real. The scammers' goal is to lure victims to give up their personal and financial information. If the thieves get what they're after, they use it to steal a victim's money and identity.

For those taxpayers who get a phishing email, the IRS offers this advice:

- Don't reply to the message.
- Don't give out your personal or financial information.
- Forward the email to phishing@irs.gov. Then delete it.
- Don't open any attachments or click on any links. They may have malicious code that will infect your computer.
