SUMMIT VOLUNTEER FIRST AID SQUAD AWARDED \$20K GRANT FROM INVESTORS FOUNDATION

The Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad has received a \$20,000 grant from Investors Foundation for the purchase of digital radios that will be compatible with other communications systems used by first responders in Summit and the surrounding area.

The First Aid Squad applied to Investors Foundation for a grant to help offset the total cost of a necessary \$140K upgrade from analog to digital radio equipment. Digital radio equipment provides first responders with added features and functionality, improved coverage, and critical interoperability with other agencies.





The Fortnightly Club of Summit, formed by the wife of Summit's first mayor, was established in 1893 and met on a fortnight (every fourteen nights, two weeks). The Fortnightly Club purchased their clubhouse "Twin Maples" in 1949 for \$27,000. Numerous celebrations will take place this year to celebrate the club's commitment to charitable causes since its inception and to recognize the millions of dollars contributed to the community, and multiplemillions of volunteer hours and in-kind donations over the course of its existence. The Fortnightly Club is dedicated to fundraising for scholarships for Summit's young women, preservation of its historic clubhouse, community service, volunteerism and providing outreach to other organizations.

A Proclamation was recently presented by Mayor Nora Radest deeming March 6, 2019 be "The Fortnightly Club's 125thAnniversary Celebration Day" followed by a ribbon-cutting ceremony. Afterwards, more than 50 community and club attendees enjoyed an Afternoon Tea served by club members and catered by What A Dish. The clubhouse sparkled and the silver, donated by members over the years, was, of course polished. The Fortnightly Club is a lively group of women of all ages who contribute to the club's goals while enjoying social comradery.

Many of the current members progressed from the Summit Junior Fortnightly Club, originally established by The Fortnightly Club for younger women, and which focuses on supporting activities for children from birth through middle school.

The Fortnightly Club offers its membership volunteer opportunities, book groups, theater trips, day-trips, comradery, and monthly general meetings with guest speakers held the second Wednesday of the month, open for free to the general public and new members, who are always welcome!

CITY OF SUMMIT'S 13TH ANNUAL EARTH DAY CLEAN-UP - SATURDAY, APRIL 27

The City of Summit will be holding its annual Earth Day Clean-Up on Saturday, April 27, 2019 from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. Last year, 193 volunteers of all ages collected an estimated 1660 pounds of trash and debris from city parks and open spaces and spread 25 cubic yards of wood chips on trails

Members of the community, individuals and groups, are encouraged to participate and help to beautify city parks and open spaces. The Earth Day Clean-Up is sponsored by the Summit Environmental Commission and is conducted in partnership with the Washington Area Association.

City sites that will be part of the Earth Day Clean-Up include Briant Park, portions of Wilson Park, Martin's Brook Park, Passaic River Park and open spaces surrounding the Transfer Station near New Providence Avenue, Constantine Place and Risk Avenue. Individuals and walk-ins are welcome at Briant Park at the Springfield Avenue entrance, and at Martin's Brook Park on Butler Parkway.

Participants are asked to bring work gloves and a beverage in a reusable container. Other necessary supplies will be provided. Community service hours are available for eighth grade and high school students. Children ages 12 or younger must be accompanied by a parent or other adult. For students in grades 8 to 12 attending without an adult, please email summitearthdaycleanup@gmail.com for a permission form.
