TED-ED LIVE AT WARREN MIDDLE SCHOOL

TED, an acronym for Technology, Entertainment and Design is a nonprofit organization devoted to spreading ideas globally in the form of short, powerful talks. TED Talks are generally between 5 to 18 minutes in length and cover topics related to any discipline, genre, culture, self-motivation strategies, etc. Often times those delivering Ted Talks are experts within their field.

Prior to the start of the 2018 school year, Mrs. Christine Cirrotti, Warren Middle School (WMS) Language Arts Teacher collaborated with Dr. Susan Cooper, WMS E2 Teacher about the idea of bringing TED-Ed, a program for students, to WMS. Cirrotti met with Mr. George Villar, WMS Principal and Mr. William Kimmick, WMS Curriculum Director, to propose the idea of adding TED-Ed as a grade 8 elective. The new elective would follow a progression of already-established classes that Cirrotti teaches: Public Speaking for grade 7 students and Information Technology for grade 6 students.

TED-Ed supports students in identifying their passion, encourages public speaking, connects a global network of classrooms and shares student ideas in the form of short, Ted-style talks. Cirrotti felt that students having the ability to create their own Ted Talks would really be the culminating point of the progression of electives. Villar and Kimmick approved the idea and Cirrotti was off to the races

During the summer of 2018, Cirrotti applied and became a TED-Ed club leader, a club dedicated to spark and celebrate the ideas of every young person in the word. Cirrotti worked throughout the summer to create a curriculum that leads students through the steps of creating ideas, researching, writing, revising, adding visuals, practicing and finally presenting the Ted Talk.

In September 2018, the first 6 week cycle of TED-Ed was completed and students greatly excelled in the class. Within a month and half, students were able to develop an idea worth sharing, research and gather data, create a presentation and deliver that presentation while being video recorded.

As the program grew stronger, Cirrotti, with the help of Mrs. Cynthia Cassidy, WMS Library Media Specialist, decided to take things a step further. During the week of February 25, 2019, the first WMS TED-Ed Live was delivered by five grade 8 students in front of an audience of their peers, teachers, parents and various visitors.

These five students were extremely poised, articulate, well prepared and passionate about their presentations. Within 45 minutes the audience learned about the art of cursive writing, the importance of learning to code, the Affirmative Action policy and related controversy, how to be a friend to someone suffering from depression and the effects of bullying, and lastly creative writing.

Cirrotti was extremely proud of the five students who volunteered to present their Ted talk in front of a live audience. As the presentation came to a close, Cirrotti spoke directly to the students in the audience encouraging them to consider signing up for TED-Ed in the future.



WARREN TOWNSHIP EARNS TWO GRANTS FOR ELECTRIC CAR CHARGING STATION

The Township Committee is pleased to announce that they have received two grants to support their effort in providing an electric car plug-in station at The Municipal Complex. The Township has received a \$10,000 grant from Sustainable NJ, funded by the Gardinier Environmental Fund. The Township has also received a \$6,000 grant from NJ Department of Environmental Protection, funded by the Volkswagen Environmental Mitigation Trust.

The \$16,000 in grants will be utilized to fund the installation of the Level II EV electric car charging station that the Township had previously purchased for \$3,284.

Deputy Mayor and liaison Environmental Commission, Mick Marion, stated that "the installation of the electric charging station continues the Township's commitment to energy conservation in order to provide for an environmental-friendly Warren Township."

Mayor Gary DiNardo welcomes the receipt of the grants as the funds will provide a costeffective way to enable Warren Township residents to have a local site to charge their


WARREN SENIOR IS CANDIDATE IN U.S. PRESIDENTIAL SCHOLARS PROGRAM



WARREN TOWNSHIP SCHOOLS START WITH HELLO

Students in each of the Warren Township Schools participated in "Start with Hello" week held in February. Sandy Hook Promise, a national non-profit organization based out of Newtown, Connecticut created this program in an effort to protect children and reduce social isolation.

"Start with Hello" is a program that teaches children and teens how to be more socially inclusive and connected to each other. The program follows three simple steps - if you see someone alone, 'reach out' and help, 'start with hello'. The program provides tools for students, teachers and school leaders to break the ice, break down barriers and get to know one another.

Students and staff at Woodland School, Mt. Horeb School, Central School and Angelo L. Tomaso School began their week with a simple exercise of wearing name tags for "Say Hey" day. The purpose of this activity was to encourage students to simply say hello to one another. Students and staff happily greeted each other throughout the day, creating a chain reaction of smiling faces.


On Tuesday, elementary students and staff were encouraged to wear neon colors as a reminder to brighten someone's day. In addition to the fluorescent reminder, students were asked to fill out pledge cards. The central question of the pledge card being "why do I start with hello?" Cards were filled with responses like, "I start with hello to make people feel included" and "I start with hello to let the person know that I care about them."

Mid-week, students at Warren Middle School (WMS) viewed a special presentation given by the WMS School Counselors on simple ways to reach out to someone who might need help.

School Counselors helped students think about where social isolation can be found, what social isolation might look like and what can be done to help someone who is feeling alone. On the same day, students throughout the district participated in an ice breaker activity during their lunch periods. Small pieces of paper with varying topics were spread out on the lunch tables in each school to prompt conversation. The lunch rooms were filled with smiles and laughter as students, teachers and visitors learned new and interesting facts about each other.

On Thursday, positive messages were displayed throughout each of the five Warren Township Schools for everyone to enjoy and on Friday, students were encouraged to "Disconnect to Connect." School Counselors asked students to stay off of their electronic devices to connect with those around them.

Warren Township Schools are among as many as 15,000 schools nationwide that have

participated in "Start with Hello Week." Director of Special Services, Mrs. Candie Hengemuhle stated "Start with Hello Week' was a district-wide initiative this year to highlight the importance of our students connecting with all of their peers and promoting an inclusive culture in our schools. Our students learned they have the power to make a difference in the life of others, simply by saying hello, making a connection and, thereby planting the seeds to eliminate social isolation in their schools."


