# **WESTFIELD ROBOTICS FINISHES SEASON ON A HIGH NOTE**

Westfield Robotics concluded its season on February 17, 2019 with its most successful results of the year. The team, WR That Hertz, competed in the semifinals of the first Tech Challenge New Jersey Competition and was chosen as a partner team by the third highest scoring team. In the best out of three matches to move to the finals, That Hertz and its partner battled it out for all three matches. While That Hertz did not make it into the finals leading into the state championships, the team is immensely proud of all the progress made this season.

"At the beginning of the season, our robot was having a lot of issues," says Jacob Rock, the team captain. "The autonomous programming didn't work at all in our first competition in November, and we had a few malfunctions disconnecting when we couldn't control the robot. However, we were able to overcome these challenges and our robot performed consistently well during this tournament."

WR That Hertz also won second place for the Collins Aerospace Innovation Award for its unique design. The robot uses a rack and pinion extendable lift to pull itself six inches off the ground onto a lander, and the team created a mechanism to collect balls and blocks out of zip ties and duct tape. Additionally, the robot had Mecanum wheels which allowed it to move in any direction: forwards, backwards, sideways, diagonally, and even spin in a circle.

The team worked hard this season. Members were presented with the challenge (or game) to be followed throughout the season. The team worked through the design process to create a brand new robot, and to continuously perfect their design.

Westfield Robotics also has been doing a lot to educate its newer members, with 18 new club members joining this season, ranging from 7th grade through 12th grade. The Westfield Robotics Club is designing and creating an additional robot that does not compete, so new members can get hands-on experience designing and building. Rock is also teaching the basics of Java to the team to ensure that interested members can learn how to code.

The Westfield Robotics Club will continue working on its second robot, practicing skills, and fundraising through the off-season. The team will not be competing in state championships, but is hosting a scrimmage at Westfield High School on May 19, 2019. This is a non-judged workshop where students will be challenged to create new designs on the fly to compete. The public is encouraged to attend.

# WESTFIELD SCHOOL BUSINESS ADMINISTRATOR RECEIVES DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

Westfield Public School District Business Administrator (BA) and Board Secretary Dana Sullivan has been honored by the New Jersey Association of School Business Officials (NJASBO) with a 2019 Distinguished Service Award for her long-term, continuous exemplary service.

As part of the award, Sullivan will have the honor of presenting a \$1,000 scholarship from NJASBO to a student in the Westfield Public School District.

Among just four 2019 Distinguished Service Award recipients statewide, Sullivan has served as BA/Board Secretary for Westfield Public Schools since 2012. Previously, she served in the same role for Montclair Public Schools from 1997 to 2012.

"I am pleased, but not at all surprised, that Mrs. Sullivan has received this prestigious recognition," said Superintendent Dr. Margaret Dolan. "Her fiscal stewardship, sage advice and steady hand have been at the forefront of many of the district's most successful initiatives."

Westfield Board of Education President Peggy Oster praised Sullivan as a leader who consistently provides "sound and seasoned guidance."

"The fact that Mrs. Sullivan's colleagues have honored her with this award speaks volumes about her experience and impeccable character," said Oster.

Sullivan currently serves as the Chairman of the Education Committee for NJASBO and as a trustee for the New Jersey Schools Insurance Group (NJSIG), a joint insurance fund provided to member school districts.

NJASBO is a professional association that promotes the highest standards of ethics and efficiency, provides its membership with professional development and support, and collaborates with entities that affect public education. The organization comprises

individuals who administer or supervise a variety of operations within the school district. Examples include accounting, budgeting, data processing, environmental issues, food service management, maintenance, negotiations, payroll, purchasing and transportation.










## SPRING CONCERT BY THE WESTFIELD COMMUNITY CONCERT BAND

The Westfield Community Concert band will present its annual Spring Concert on Thursday, April 4, 2019 at 7:30 p.m. at Edison Intermediate School, 800 Rahway Avenue in Westfield, free admission. Dr. Thomas Connors, conductor and music director of the band, has prepared a program which is highlighted by popular, traditional and contemporary selections for wind band

The program will feature the band's premier performance of the complete Autobiography by composer and arranger, Robert Russell Bennett. A series of seven, two-minute musical "snapshots" of significant events from his own life, Bennett wrote this composition in 1976 for a performance by the world famous Goldman Band. This tribute to his life and musical

development stands as the last of Bennett's major compositions.

The program will also include Walter Piston's 1950 contemporary classic, Tunbridge Fair. Piston received his musical training at Harvard University and taught music at Harvard for many years. Among his many well-known students was the legendary Leonard Bernstein.

The band also performs First Suite in E-flat, written in 1909 by Gustav Holst, which is a three movement composition that has become an international staple of wind band repertoire. Another program selection, Variations on a Shaker Melody, written in 1960 by renowned American composer, Aaron Copland, has become one of the most familiar melodies through its frequent appearance in film, television and other settings.

The band's final selection will be New London Pictures, by Nigel Hess. New London Pictures represents modern elements of London in the 21st Century, in three "scenes": Millennium Bridge, London Eye and Congestion Charge. "The music will bring to life the landmark bridge, giant Ferris wheel and hectic traffic that London is now best known for" says Dr. Connors.

The band, in its 107th concert season, will also be presenting its annual Summer Concert Series on Thursdays, June 20, June 27, July 4, July 11 and July 18 in Westfield's Mindowaskin Park.







A graduate of Eastern Illinois University in Charleston, IL, she worked as a Foreign Service National at the American Consulate in Munich, and after a stint as a stay-at-home mom and substitute teacher, is currently Attendance Secretary at Franklin School in Westfield.

## HALL OF FAME COMMITTEE ANNOUNCES 2019 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

The votes are in! The Westfield Hall of Fame Committee can now announce the twelve 2019 Hall of Fame Honorees to be inducted during a gala ceremony in September. Candidates were chosen by the eleven member Hall of Fame Selection Committee, in conjunction with Westfield Historical Society members and the general public. Joan Lowell Smith, chair of the Hall of Fame Committee, said that this is the largest number of new entrants into the Hall of Fame since the Westfield Hall of Fame inception in 2008. Of the 71 individuals considered this year, those who did not earn enough points for induction will still be eligible for the next Hall of Fame Awards.

Candidates, representing a wide spectrum of occupations, must be current or previous residents of Westfield who have made significant impacts on the town, state and often, the nation, for their accomplishments. The Committee reviews all submitted contenders before all votes are tallied to arrive at the twelve inductees, listed with brief descriptions of their achievements which will be expanded at the awards ceremony. Details of the special guest presenters, ticket prices, location and program will be released in the months ahead.

Rabbi Charles Kroloff served Temple Emanuel for 59 years, 36 as senior rabbi, transforming it into the largest Reform congregation in New Jersey. In addition to leading several major Jewish organizations, he was president of the Westfield Foundation and remains active in Temple Emanuel.

Bill Shepherd has served as Chairman of Chemical Bank NJ and President/CEO of Horizon Bancorp. He was President of the Chamber of Commerce and has served on boards of the United Fund, Fairview Cemetery and Westfield Foundation.

Gail Cassidy, author of numerous motivational books, taught high school English in Roselle and North Plainfield before serving as president of seven Westfield organizations, including the Board of Education, the Foundation, and Rotary. She was co-creator and instructor of mentoring and anti-bullying programs locally and in innercity schools. She co-writes a monthly electronic newsletter Retired-Next Phase.com.

Betty List (1926-2017) served three terms as Councilwoman. At the Presbyterian Church of Westfield she was deacon, trustee, usher, Sunday school teacher and on the worship committee. She chaired Westfield's Public Safety Council and served boards of the town Republican Committee, Women's Republican Club, Union County Republican Committee, and League of Women Voters.

Robert Brewster (1929-2010), a star athlete named UNICO Man of the Year, was recognized twice as a "model citizen" by the New Jersey Senate and Assembly. He founded and managed the Westfield Basketball Clinic and served on the Town Recreation board for ten years.

Saul Drittel, owner of Milady's store for 40 years, has been in commercial real estate with Coldwell Banker for many years. He was

Volunteer Promotions Chairman of the Downtown Westfield Corp. He's devoted 30 Journal for 54 years, served as deputy Editor, years to the Westfield Area Chamber of Commerce as board member, retail chair, and president.

Melloan, editor and columnist for the Wall Street Journal for 54 years, served as deputy Editor, International, and editor of the editorial page where his weekly column, "Global View", appeared. He continues to write op-ed pieces for

The Farley Family: Katherine Farley is board chair of Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts. She was named the "12th Most powerful women in New York" by Crain's New York Business. She has also served on the board of the New York Philharmonic. Currently she is senior managing director of Tishman Speyer. Thomas Farley, a pediatrician, was Health Commissioner of New York City. Prior to that post, he served the Centers for Disease Control's Epidemic Intelligence Service. His articles on Legionnaires' disease, prevention of HIV/STDs, infant mortality and obesity have been published widely. Three additional Farleys will share the award.

Charles H. Darsh (1869-1939) was an architect who designed the Westfield Firehouse and Mindowaskin Park. He gained international prominence for designing the Montreal railway station, the Frontenac hotel and elaborate private homes.

Paul Robeson (1898-1976), athlete, singer, lawyer, actor and activist, lived his formative years in Westfield, attending McKinley School. His father was pastor of St. Thomas A.M.E. Zion Church before the family moved to Somerville where Paul graduated from high school. He earned a full scholarship to Rutgers where he became an All American in both football and track, graduating as valedictorian. This year Rutgers celebrates the 100th anniversary of his graduation.

George & Joan "Jody" Melloan: Joan "Jody" Melloan (1926-2017) wrote for magazines, Horizon, Americana, American Way and newspapers: San Francisco Chronicle, Miami Herald and The New York Times. She also taught management training at Kean University. She was as a master gardener as well. George

Melloan, editor and columnist for the Wall Street Journal for 54 years, served as deputy Editor, International, and editor of the editorial page where his weekly column, "Global View", appeared. He continues to write op-ed pieces for the Journal. He and his wife co-authored Carter Economy. George also authored the Great Money Binge, Advantage of Supplyside Economics and last year, Free People, Free Markets. George has earned numerous writing awards.

Lawrence G. Foster (1925-2013) was a reporter for the Newark News, then bureau chief and night editor before heading public relations for Johnson & Johnson, retiring 33 years later as corporate Vice President of Public Relations. His expert handling of the infamous Tylenol tragedy in 1982 set the "gold standard" in crisis management. Lawrence was named one of the "Ten most influential Public Relations Executives of the 20th Century" by PR Week.

Betty Pate (1926-1983), was Director of Union County Cultural and Heritage Advisory board. She chaired Westfield's Bicentennial Committee and was active in the Miller-Cory Museum restoration. She won the New Jersey Historical Commission's 1981 award for distinguished service to state history. Betty was also known for sharing "ghost" tales of alleged haunted houses in the area.

Inductees receive a framed certificate and are permanently honored at the Reeve History and Cultural Resource Center with an engraved Westfield Hall of Fame plaque listing major achievements and a photo image.



Recognizing the cultural significance of Westfield's historic and architectural heritage, the Historic Preservation Commission was established by municipal ordinance in 1985. The commission considers potential sites for historic designation and sponsors outreach programs, including the speaker series and Devlin preservation awards, to foster an appreciation of historic preservation. 


