MEMO FROM THE MAYOR



Kenilworthians, It looks like the warmer is weather is hopefully here to stay and after April's cold snaps and unpredictable weather all I have to say is good riddance! And with the nicer weather, keep in mind that more people will be out and about in the borough. Please keep a sharp eye when driving and remember when people are crossing the Boulevard, pedestrians have the right of way. To everyone out there walking, biking and enjoying the outside please remember just because you see a driver, doesn't mean they see you! Always look both ways and cross at the designated cross walks.

This year's 2019 municipal budget is going to see an increase of \$65.65 more than last year for the average residential property assessed at \$181,401 this is a 2.4% increase (or 3.6 tax points) more in the tax rate. This large increase is mostly due to the Rahway Valley Sewer Authority hitting us with an additional \$144,056 increase or 16% more than last year. That comes to \$31.93 or 1.7 tax points of the \$65.65 increase. Without the RVSA increase the municipal portion of property taxes would have been \$33.72 or just a 1.2% increase (1.9 tax points) this year." I would like to hit home once again the fact that the RVSA bill was significant to our increase.

As the year progresses, I am hoping we will be free of any bad storms, but it's always a good idea to be prepared. Kenilworth utilizes the Swift 911 system to get information via landline phone or to cell phones if you wish. Sign up is free and is located on our Kenilworth Borough website. I'm also going to include a few links that might be helpful for preparation. These links are from PSE&G and they usually have them out prior to and during weather events. In addition, I'm also sharing the link to the outage map we use to track outages in an area. The map is interactive and is updated every 15 minutes. This is the tool that is used to provide numbers of outages and estimated time of restoration.

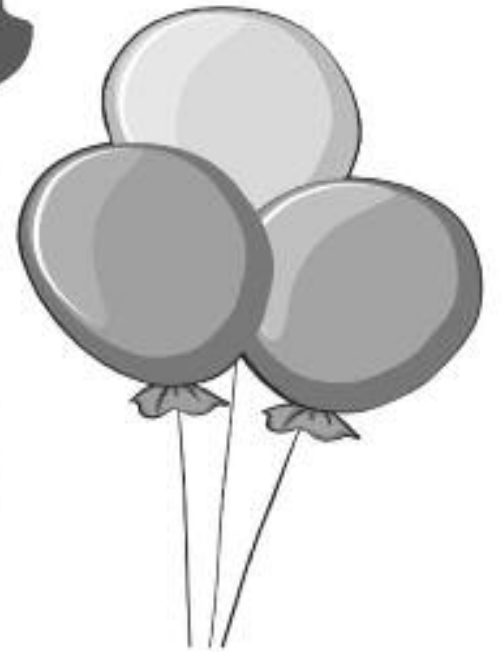

'KENILWORTH - A COMMUNITY OF FAITH' PRESENTATION - MAY 16

Distinguished historian and author Walter E. Boright, Ed.D. will highlight the history of Kenilworth's places of worship during a celebration of local history being hosted by the Kenilworth Historical Society on Thursday, May 16, 2019. All are welcome to attend the event, which will begin at 6:30 p.m. at the Oswald J. Nitschke House (49 South 21 Street, Kenilworth). Admission is free, but interested attendees should register in advance by calling 908-709-0434, as seating is limited. Light refreshments will be served. Parking is available in front of the Nitschke House and in the municipal parking lot across the street from the Kenilworth Veterans Center.

The featured presentation, "Kenilworth - A Community of Faith," will trace the history of

religious worship in Kenilworth from local farming days of the early 1890s to the present. Boright will discuss some uncovered mysteries, reveal newly found historic photographs and review the impact of social and other events that helped shape the evolution of the churches in the community. There will be a question and answer period following the presentation. Local history books and memorabilia will be available for purchase.

Boright, a native of Kenilworth who now resides elsewhere in New Jersey, has authored five popular books about Kenilworth history: A History of Kenilworth as Told Through its Streets and Street Signs; Kenilworth: Houses, People, Pictures, and Stories; Women of Kenilworth; A History of the Kenilworth Free Public Library; and Kenilworth Memories: A History of Kenilworth in Story and Pictures. He also has produced 100 historic postcards of Kenilworth and has written a series of articles about the

borough's history for Kenilworth Life and the former Cranford Chronicle. The May 16 program at the Nitschke House constitutes Boright's sixth presentation on behalf of the Kenilworth Historical Society.

Boright is a retired superintendent of schools and a retired director of Kean University. He earned his bachelor's degree at Kean and master's and doctoral degrees at Seton Hall University. He has taught New Jersey and American history. Additionally, he has held elected office as a councilman and as a member of the Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders. His father, Walter, Sr., was a Kenilworth mayor in the 1950s and 1960s.

The Kenilworth Historical Society is an independent, volunteer-based, non-profit, tax-exempt, 501 (c) 3 organization dedicated to the research, preservation and interpretation of the Oswald J. Nitschke House, local history and culture.

WHAT, WHERE, AND WHEN IN OLD KENILWORTH KENILWORTH'S GREATEST GENERATION

This is Part I of a tribute saluting ten living Kenilworth veterans who fought in World War II. They are part of Kenilworth's greatest generation. The first two veterans featured, Eugene Coppola and Pat Paterson, were classmates together and graduated from Jonathan Dayton Regional High School in 1938.

Corporal Eugene V. Coppola of the US Army, born in Kenilworth 99 years ago, still resides here. Corporal Coppola served from 1942 to 1945. He and his wife of 76 years, Evelyn, have a daughter, Evelyn, and four grandchildren. He spent much time at Camp Kilmer, Piscataway, as an instructor, handler of returning troops, and in data management. He served in Panama where he was a poisonous gas specialist. His brothers, Vincent and George, also served in WWII. At 99, Corporal Coppola is the oldest male living in Kenilworth ever born here.

2nd Lieutenant Adolf "Pat" Paterson, of the US Army, 98 years old, came to Kenilworth in 1929 at age nine. He currently lives in South Jersey. Lieutenant Paterson served from 1942 to 1946. He and his late wife, Mary Jane, had seven children: Andrea, Bruce, Nancy, Janet, Judy, Charles, and Karen. He served in the European Theater of War, mainly stationed in Austria. He was in combat along the Rhine River in Germany and was heavily decorated. Old timers remember

the family business, Charles Paterson Floors, on S. Michigan Ave

Coxswain Kenneth M. Ross (Socofsky) of the US Navy, born in Kenilworth 92 years ago, now resides at the Jersey shore. Coxswain Ross served from 1943 to 1945. He and his late wife Florence, had two children Dennis and Betsy (Scheidegger). He transported munitions aboard four different ships in the Atlantic and two in the Pacific. He was trained on big guns at gunnery school in California. His grandfather, David Stein, helped settle Kenilworth in 1898. He and his brother, Milford, owned and operated Ross Brothers' Tavern on the Boulevard.

Private first-class Pasquale "Pat" Scorese of the US Marines, 92 years old, came to Kenilworth at age nine months. Pfc Scorese served from 1943 to 1945. He now resides in Union with his wife, Jean. They have four children: Pasquale, Carmela, Jean, and Diane. A 112-pound state wrestling champion, he was rejected three times trying to enlist due to weight. A sympathetic officer finally gave him a pass. Stationed in the Pacific he saw some skirmishing in China. He is seen daily at Quality Decorators on the Boulevard with his brother Ronald.

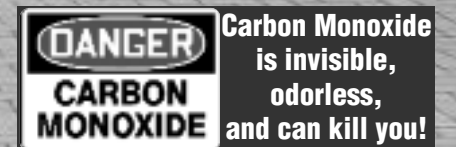

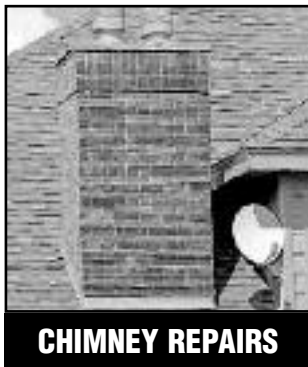

DARREN ANTOLA OF KENILWORTH PRODUCES WRESTLING DOCUMENTARY

Kenilworth resident, Darren Antola produced “350 Days,” a documentary about professional wrestling in the 1980’s. Antola is a noted boxing cut man who has worked with such champions as Kendall Holt & Yuri Foreman and acted as an agent for Riddick Bowe. Antola has moved into the wrestling world as a promoter and now filmmaker.

In “350 Days,” pro wrestling legends peel back the curtain to reveal the severe toll that working on the road 350 days a year took on their bodies, families, marriages and psyches. This compelling documentary chronicles their struggles to survive the chaos of 1980s era wrestling. Living a rock and roll lifestyle, they faced nightly temptations, battled their vices, and were absentee parents and spouses while chasing dreams of fame and fortune.

In their own words, with the cutting insight and sharp wit one would expect, these gentle giants tell their harrowing, yet often darkly

humorous, tales as marriages dissolve and relationships with their children are strained, sometimes permanently. Such is the life of the professional wrestler; such is life itself.

LETTER CARRIERS' STAMP OUT HUNGER FOOD DRIVE – MAY 11

The 27th annual Letter Carriers' Stamp Out Hunger® Food Drive is on Saturday, May 11, 2019.

The Letter Carriers' Stamp Out Hunger® Food Drive is happening on Saturday, May 11, 2019. On this day, you can set out your non-perishable food before your letter carrier's regular pick up time. The top requested non-perishable food items are: cereal, pasta, pasta sauce, rice, canned fruits and vegetables, canned meals (such as soups, chili, and/or pasta), 100 percent juice, peanut butter, macaroni & cheese, canned protein (tuna, chicken, and/or turkey), beans (canned or dry). You can also donate healthy, low-sodium, low-sugar items such as beans, oatmeal, and other whole grains, and canola or olive oil.

Please do not donate frozen food, homemade food, or home-canned items. Please do not donate items that have expired or are in glass containers. In keeping with good food-handling and food-safety procedures, food that is opened, damaged, out of code or does not have the official ingredients will be discarded by the food bank in the sorting process.

The Food Drive is primarily a people food drive, but if you also want to give pet food in addition to your regular donation, food banks may be able to distribute or direct it to pet shelters and organizations in the area that have a need.

Please do not donate any form of individual baby food products, including formula, jarred vegetables and fruits, meals, snacks, infant cereal. Baby food may be donated by the case or pallet,

but single item donations present potential contamination risks and special handling requirements.

The Food Drive is primarily a food drive, but if you also want to give personal care items (such as diapers, laundry detergent, soap, toilet paper, and household cleaning items) in addition to your regular donation, food banks may be able to distribute or put them to good use with organizations that also provide help to those in need. Please note that not all food banks will be able to accept these items.

If you would like to volunteer with food distribution and sorting, or in any other capacity, call your local post office and ask to speak to the local food drive person there. Many food banks have a great need for volunteers on Food Drive Day, as well as all throughout the year.

All donations to the Letter Carriers' Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive are tax-deductible because all the food collected on Food Drive Day is given directly to non-profit charity food agencies in the community the food was collected. Though the National Association of Letter Carriers plans the Food Drive's logistics and letter carriers provide the transportation for each donor's generous donation, the National Association of Letter Carriers is not the agency that gets listed on tax forms for claiming deductions. There are more than 10,000 food agencies throughout the country that receive these donations, so if you itemize your taxes and want to provide proper credit for your Food Drive donations, you will need to

determine the name of the agency (food pantry or other charity) that received your food, as well as the agency's address and tax I.D. number for proper reporting on your tax-filing forms. The Food Drive Coordinator at your local post office should be able to give you the name of the receiving agency, and that agency will likely have tax information handy.
