GIRL SCOUTS CELEBRATE WORLD THINKING DAY

Girl Scouts of New Providence came together to celebrate World Thinking Day on Saturday, March 23, 2019 at Our Lady of Peach Church. About 180 girls from 13 troops ranging from grades 1st through 9th were in attendance.

World Thinking Day is celebrated annually by Girl Scouts & Girl Guides in 140 countries. It's a day to promote international friendship and cooperation as well as to promote positive change in the world. This year's World Thinking Day theme was Leadership. The Girl Scout Heart of New Jersey council hosts events to celebrate World Thinking Day but this year for the first time in 7 years the Service Unit of New Providence organized this event for just the town's troops. Co-chairs Tara Cavanagh and Catherine Feuerstein, Brownie Troop 45240 leaders, put the event together. "There was a lot of interest," said Cavanagh. "We were very excited to see how many troops from our service unit participated."

The first half of the event was set up as an international showcase. Each troop chose a country to research and present. The troops made posters with facts on the country. Troops also showcased items of interest from the country like flags, money, stuffed animals native to the country, sports balls and equipment and other items. Each troop prepared an item of food from their country's cuisine to share with the participants. Food samples included Irish soda bread, spring rolls, pizzelles and Swedish meatballs. The Girl Scouts had the opportunity to represent their countries at their own display and also to "travel" from country to country. At each country, Girl Scouts received a stamp in their "passport" as well as a "SWAP". SWAPs are a Girl Scout tradition, which stands for "Special Whatchamacallits Affectionately Somewhere"; they are small tokens of friendship to be exchanged between Girl Scouts.

"I thought it was amazing to see all the different countries," said Stella Mascarina, a third grade Brownie. Another third grader Kate McClane said, "I had fun learning about all the different cultures."











For the final hour of the event, each troop put on a short performance to showcase their chosen country. The performances included dances from Sweden, Ireland and Swaziland, skits from Denmark, Chile and Bolivia as well as an Icelandic Soccer chant and a round of animal charades from

After the performances, Katherine Mera, a 5th grade Girl Scout, said, "I think it's fun to see a bunch of different cultures in one room."

The goal for the Service Unit is to make it an annual or biennial event. Keira Arnold a 7th grade Girl Scout said, "I really liked it, the last time they had this we were Daisies and I'm glad we did it again."

dry). You can also donate healthy, low-sodium,
low-sugar items such as beans, oatmeal, and
other whole grains, and canola or olive oil.

The Food Drive is primarily a people food drive, but if you also want to give pet food in addition to your regular donation, food banks may be able to distribute or direct it to pet shelters and organizations in the area that have a need.

Please do not donate any form of individual baby food products, including formula, jarred vegetables and fruits, meals, snacks, infant cereal. Baby food may be donated by the case or pallet, but single item donations present potential contamination risks and special handling

if you also want to give personal care items (such as diapers, laundry detergent, soap, toilet paper, and household cleaning items) in addition to your regular donation, food banks may be able to distribute or put them to good use with organizations that also provide help to those in need. Please note that not all food banks will be able to accept these items.

If you would like to volunteer with food distribution and sorting, or in any other capacity, call your local post office and ask to speak to the local food drive person there. Many food banks have a great need for volunteers on Food Drive Day, as well as all throughout the year.

All donations to the Letter Carriers' Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive are tax-deductible because all the food collected on Food Drive Day is given directly to non-profit charity food agencies in the

community the food was collected. Though the National Association of Letter Carriers plans the Food Drive's logistics and letter carriers provide the transportation for each donor's generous donation, the National Association of Letter Carriers is not the agency that gets listed on tax forms for claiming deductions. There are more than 10,000 food agencies throughout the country that receive these donations, so if you itemize your taxes and want to provide proper credit for your Food Drive donations, you will need to determine the name of the agency (food pantry or other charity) that received your food, as well as the agency's address and tax I.D. number for proper reporting on your tax-filing forms. The Food Drive Coordinator at your local post office should be able to give you the name of the receiving agency, and that agency will likely have tax information handy.

All New Providence residents, 55 years or older, are invited to attend the Health Fair which will host a comprehensive list of health screenings and medical information at no cost to participants. Pre-registration is required for some screenings.

The focus for the Health Fair is to provide screenings relevant to senior health and wellbeing. One of the free central Health Fair screenings offered is a Stroke Health Risk Assessment conducted by the Community Health

The New Providence Health Department and Department of Atlantic Health System's Overlook Medical Center. This screening is an assessment of significant stroke risk factors with follow-up counseling and is available to the first 30 registrants. Although the aging process alone is not a risk factor for Stroke, contributing risk factors such as the development of Hypertension, Diabetes, and Heart Disease can increase the incidence of Stroke and other related illnesses. Pre-registration for this screening is required.
