LETTER CARRIERS' STAMP OUT HUNGER FOOD DRIVE - MAY 11

The 27th annual Letter Carriers' Stamp Out Hunger® Food Drive is on Saturday, May 11, 2019.

The Letter Carriers' Stamp Out Hunger® Food Drive is happening on Saturday, May 11, 2019. On this day, you can set out your non-perishable food before your letter carrier's regular pick up time. The top requested non-perishable food items are: cereal, pasta, pasta sauce, rice, canned fruits and vegetables, canned meals (such as soups, chili, and/or pasta), 100 percent juice, peanut butter, macaroni & cheese, canned protein (tuna, chicken, and/or turkey), beans (canned or dry). You can also donate healthy, low-sodium, low-sugar items such as beans, oatmeal, and other whole grains, and canola or olive oil.

Please do not donate frozen food, homemade food, or home-canned items. Please do not donate items that have expired or are in glass containers. In keeping with good food-handling and food-safety procedures, food that is opened, damaged, out of code or does not have the official ingredients will be discarded by the food bank in the sorting process.

The Food Drive is primarily a people food drive, but if you also want to give pet food in addition to your regular donation, food banks may be able to distribute or direct it to pet shelters and organizations in the area that have a need.

Please do not donate any form of individual baby food products, including formula, jarred vegetables and fruits, meals, snacks, infant cereal. Baby food may be donated by the case or pallet, but single item donations present potential contamination risks and special handling requirements.

The Food Drive is primarily a food drive, but if you also want to give personal care items (such as diapers, laundry detergent, soap, toilet paper, and household cleaning items) in addition to your regular donation, food banks may be able to distribute or put them to good use with organizations that also provide help to those in need. Please note that not all food banks will be able to accept these items.

If you would like to volunteer with food distribution and sorting, or in any other capacity, call your local post office and ask to speak to the local food drive person there. Many food banks have a great need for volunteers on Food Drive Day, as well as all throughout the year.

All donations to the Letter Carriers' Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive are tax-deductible because all the food collected on Food Drive Day is given directly to non-profit charity food agencies in the community the food was



collected. Though the National Association of Letter Carriers plans the Food Drive's logistics and letter carriers provide the transportation for each donor's generous donation, the National Association of Letter Carriers is not the agency that gets listed on tax forms for claiming deductions. There are more than 10,000 food agencies throughout the country that receive these donations, so if you itemize your taxes and want to provide proper credit for your Food Drive donations, you will need to determine the name of the agency (food pantry or other charity) that received your food, as well as the agency's address and tax I.D. number for proper reporting on your tax-filing forms. The Food Drive Coordinator at your local post office should be able to give you the name of the receiving agency, and that agency will likely have tax information handy.



TOMATOES NEW JERSEY'S FAVORITE LAST FROST: MAY 12*

Now that Spring has finally arrived gardeners are itching to get busy planting. For many of us in New Jersey that means TOMATOES. The tomato is native to Central & South America. While its culture is ancient it has only reached its present prominence since the mid-1800s.

Unfortunately, tomatoes can host many diseases that can devastate your harvest just when you are looking forward to it. There are a few things you can do at planting time to help limit the chances that will happen to you.

Egg shells added to the soil can help prevent "Blossom End Rot." Soak, clean and dry the egg shells. Then grind them in a food processer and add to soil. Dirty egg shells will attract critters to your plot.

Rotate your crops. Plant your tomatoes in a different spot than you planted them last year. This practice prevents diseases that can go into the soil, which can contaminate it for years into the future. If last year you had a tomato problem don't replant in the same area.


Disease resistant varieties are available. These are marked on the label and your local greenhouse personnel will be able to help you locate them.

Plant several different varieties. Not only will this help prevent disease from infecting all of your plants, it will also give you more flavor and most likely a longer and more bountiful harvest.

Proper and consistent watering will greatly improve your harvest. Tomatoes require less water than you might think. Over-watered tomatoes can lack flavor and meatiness. Although we cannot control rainfall, we should take it into

consideration when hand watering. A rain meter, either bought or home-made, can be very helpful. It can be as simple as dipping a ruler into a bucket. Keep it clean to prevent mosquitoes.

Pruning tomatoes and removing suckers will focus plant growth on vegetables rather than unproductive stems and leaves.

Staking up your plants makes it easier to detect problems, harvest your crop and will keep fruit from touching the ground where it can rot. Staking also improves air circulation.

Mulching with black plastic or chopped leaves will control weeds and maintain moisture. This will help keep the soil cool during the heat of summer. Although we know tomatoes like it hot, they stop producing fruit when temperatures reach over 90 degrees. That will greatly diminish your late harvest.

Container gardening is a good choice if you have had disease problems in the past. A simple five-gallon bucket with holes drilled in the bottom can be a good choice for this. This system works best with medium size tomatoes.



NEW TREES PLANTED AND NAMED AT RAHWAY PARK MEMORIAL GROVE

The trees that were planted at Rahway County Park seventy-two years ago as a symbolic gesture to memorialize the fifty-eight Rahway servicemen who died during World War II are no longer forgotten. This past December, name markers were placed next to the original trees representing each fallen soldier and also placed next to saplings which were planted last spring to replace the trees that were lost to disease, storm damage, or removal. The commemorative stone that was laid during the 1947 ceremony has been refurbished and placed in a more prominent setting. With much of the revitalization work complete, a brief program, conducted by the Union County Department of Veterans' Affairs, was held on Thursday, December 20, 2018 to rededicate the grove.

At the conclusion of World War II, the Rahway American War Dads, Chapter 6, initiated a project to create some method of honoring the local servicemen who died during the war. Their project evolved into the creation of a Memorial Tree Grove that would surround a monument to be placed in the Rahway County Park.

The dedication service, which took place on Memorial Day, 1947, was impressive. The observance began with a long parade that started in the business district and ended in the park where several thousand people, young and old, had gathered. A bronze plaque, set on a large boulder, was unveiled which listed the names of the fifty-eight servicemen. The dedication continued with the reading of the names of the soldiers. A Boy Scout stood next to each tree and saluted as the designated name was announced. Following the roll call, speeches were given by local, county, and state officials. After a gun salute was fired by an honor guard from Camp Kilmer, the ceremony closed with an Army bugler playing "Taps." It was later reported that the Memorial Tree Grove was the first and most suitable method to honor the war heroes.

In the years following the dedication service and tree plantings, the ceremonial program faded with the passage of time, and before long, the tribute to Rahway's war dead was all but forgotten. Few if any would take notice of the boulder that had become surrounded by hedge growth or the trees which as years passed bore no more significance than any others that filled the park's acreage. All this would change, however, in January, 2015, when a map was discovered which showed the position of each tree and included a key that matched trees with soldiers.

With the newly found map, the Memorial Trees that were still standing were located

Fisher was a resident of Essex County, and was employed by the Purolater Corp. which in 1943 was headquartered in Newark. The stone was gifted by the EUPP (Employees' Union Purolater Products) and was unveiled on June 29,1943 and placed on the factory grounds. The names of eighteen other Purolater employees who were in the armed forces at the time are also inscribed. When Purolater moved to Rahway in 1949, the company brought the monument and placed it next to an entrance on the Hazelwood Avenue side of the plant where it stood for 37 years. Purolater left Rahway in 1986. Here's the mystery- who transported the Fisher stone to Rahway Park to be placed next to the Memorial Grove marker?


through the efforts of the staff of the Merchants and Drovers Tavern Museum Association and an observance was held on May 12, 2015 to renew interest in the grove. Members of the Merchants and Drovers, Rahway Post 5 American Legion, the Rahway High School ROTC, and representatives from the Union County Parks Commission gathered in the park to place American flags next to each tree.

More work, however, needed to be done. First, trees had to be planted to replace those that had not survived. Secondly, identification markers were needed to draw attention to the trees so their significance might be more readily noted. Divisions of the Union County Parks Commission and the Veterans' Affairs Department took on the project. During the county's next cycle of tree plantings, saplings

were planted and name markers were put in place for most of the soldiers (about a dozen names still need to be posted and some markers need to be repositioned).

The Rahway News-Record editorial from June 5, 1947 commented, the grove will be "a memorial which will grow as the years pass to keep generations aware of the sacrifice which these men made to permit the continuation of our way of life." When finally completed, the Memorial Grove will again be a suitable memorial that will continue to honor Rahway's World War II heroes for a new generation.

Union County municipalities as well as towns in Bergen, Essex and Monmouth counties have been sworn in by Superior Court Judge Richard Wischusen to advocate for Union County vouth removed from home due to abuse, neglect or abandonment and placed in foster homes or residential facilities.

After completion of training with Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County and taking their oath, the new CASA

More than two dozen volunteers from 10 volunteers — or advocates — attended three hours of family court hearings to observe other CASA volunteers in action, and then were matched to their assigned foster youth or sibling






