

June 11 - The Gateway Rail Project



> The Summit schools that received donations were Wilson, Lincoln-Hubbard, Jefferson, Brayton and Summit High School.







The grant will help further Imagine's mission of providing education and free peer grief support to children (aged 3-18) and their families coping with loss due to the death or life-altering illness of a parent or sibling by helping to underwrite a sixth Night of Support at its center located in Mountainside, NJ.

Childhood bereavement is a serious public health issue. The death of a parent or other important person in a child's life is one of the most commonly reported and disruptive Adverse Childhood Experiences. There are currently more than 109,000 New Jersey youth aged 18 and under who are bereaved due to the death of a parent. Imagine is currently serving over 330 children and adults from 55 New Jersey towns.

"We're extremely grateful for the Junior League of Summit's ongoing generous support to Imagine," said Mary Robinson, Founder and Executive Director of Imagine. "The League's commitment to children and families is invaluable in helping us build strong communities that support families during one of the most painful and difficult times in their lives. As an effective intervention and prevention program we are committed to helping children grow up emotionally healthy and able to lead meaningful and productive lives."

Imagine offers free year-round peer grief support at two New Jersey centers - one located

Imagine, A Center for coping with Loss, a grief in Mountainside, and one in Newark. Concurrent support groups for parents or guardians are offered at the same time the children participate. The groups meet on weekday nights for one and a half hours, and a pizza dinner is provided prior to the group meeting.

About Imagine

Imagine, A Center for coping with Loss, a notfor-profit 501(c)3 organization, provides year-round grief support for children and young adults using a peer-support group model. Trained adult volunteers and professionals provide children and teens with comfort and the tools needed to process grief resulting from death or life-altering illness. Groups, which meet on weeknights, serve children and adults from more than 55 New Jersey towns.

IMAGINE SEEKS VOLUNTEERS TO PROVIDE GRIEF SUPPORT

Imagine, A Center for Coping with Loss currently seeks volunteers to serve as peer support group facilitators for children and families coping with loss due to death. Upcoming summer trainings will be held June 27-30th and July 26-29th, 2019.

Imagine groups are facilitated by trained adult volunteers who attend a 32-hour training and quarterly continuing education, and receive ongoing supervision. Volunteers come from all walks of life and need no special background other than a willingness to listen and the ability to be with children and adults in pain without trying to fix, solve problems, or give advice. Volunteers must be 21 years or older and attend


the Imagine four-day Facilitator Training. No Jersey, serving children age 3-18 who have had a prior experience is necessary.

"For the first time in our seven-year history we have a waiting list," said Mandi Zucker, Imagine Program Director. "As our programs continue to grow, so does our need for volunteers. We are currently serving over 380 participants every two weeks in our peer support programs and will be adding another night of support so we can serve an additional 60 people." People that complete the training leave feeling empowered to be a supportive person to people grieving any type of loss.

Imagine is a free year-round peer grief support center located in Mountainside and Newark New




