DOWNTOWN BLOCK PARTY SET FOR SUNDAY, JUNE 9TH

The Berkeley Heights Recreation Commission and the Berkeley Heights Business & Civic Association with the support of naming sponsor Primrose School of BH and many other local businesses are hosting the Downtown Summer Block Party. The event is scheduled for Sunday, June 9th, 2019, from 1 – 4 p.m., will be held on Springfield Ave. from Plainfield Ave to Lone Pine Drive and everyone is invited to join the "Free party"!

Local businesses, local restaurants, non-profit organizations, clubs, churches, scout and civic groups will all be providing free activities and an afternoon of fun for families where everyone is welcome.

Also available will be Kids arts & crafts, cartoon caricature booth, face painting, Theme Park characters, Block Party Balloon Man, Dog Adoptions by Home for Good Dog Rescue, free wine tastings, Union County SWAT, Hole-in-One putting contest, electric scooters supplied by Boxcar Inc., and much more. Co-chairman Paul Neuwirth of Taylor Rental says there will also be a special activity that is still under wraps, and Berkeley Heights' largest Water Balloon toss.

According to co-chairman Dr. Patrick Smith of Smith Chiropractic, the event is still looking for local businesses, organizations and clubs to participate and sponsor an activity, "we'll make room for everyone on the street to join the party!" Scout Troops, local businesses, clubs and organizations are all urged to contact Dr. Smith for an application. Local restaurants including DiMaio's, Delicious Heights (BBQ & Ice cream sundaes), Grain and Cane, Gastrotruck and Giovanni's will have a presence on the street, with a special BBQ grill manned by committee members raising money for the rebirth of Peppertown Park. Food trucks featuring Playa-Bowls and a Donut truck will also be present.

Many Local businesses have stepped forward to sponsor the free event. There is still time for local businesses to assist with ride sponsorship. According to the organizers, the event is not set up as a fundraiser, it's a way for local business and civic to give back so everyone is invited and welcome to enjoy some fun in beautiful downtown BH. June 4 - Overview of Tappan Zee Bridge Project

Rich Schrader will discuss the replacement of the old Tappan Zee Bridge covering the history of replacement discussions/actions, the procurement method selected by state, key political and private involvement, major features, design and construction parameters, and current status. Rich, a registered professional engineer, has almost 40 years of professional experience with some 35 years in engineering and construction. He spent 11 years with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and taught at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point.

June 11 - The Gateway Rail Project

Martin Robins will discuss the necessity of completing the entire Gateway rail because the project is vital to the economic well-being to northern and central New Jersey. Martin led a team responsible for drafting legislation creating NJ Transit, directed the planning for the Hudson-Bergen light rail line and helped found the Alan M. Voorhees Transportation Center at Rutgers University.

June 18 - Union County Traffic Signals

Since the early 2000's, Union County upgraded approximately 400 traffic signals on County or Local Roads in Union County. Gordon Meth was involved in the design of these traffic signals in Union County. His presentation will give an overview of some of the considerations facing the design of traffic signals and some of the future possibilities for smarter traffic signals. Gordon Meth is a professional engineer specializing in transportation planning and traffic engineering.

June 25 - Photographs from my travels

Stephan Barcan and his wife have traveled extensively over many years and photography is his hobby, particularly travel photography. He likes to take pictures of things unique to those places. 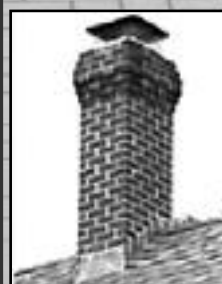

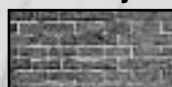

IMAGINE, A CENTER FOR COPING WITH LOSS, RECEIVES \$2,100 GRANT FROM THE JUNIOR LEAGUE OF SUMMIT

Imagine, A Center for coping with Loss, a grief support center for children and families, has received a \$2,100 grant from the Junior League of Summit (JLS). The grant will help further Imagine's mission of providing education and free peer grief support to children (aged 3-18) and their families coping with loss due to the death or life-altering illness of a parent or sibling by helping to underwrite a sixth Night of Support at its center located in Mountainside, NJ.

Childhood bereavement is a serious public health issue. The death of a parent or other important person in a child's life is one of the most commonly reported and disruptive Adverse Childhood Experiences. There are currently more than 109,000 New Jersey youth aged 18 and under who are bereaved due to the death of a parent. Imagine is currently serving over 330 children and adults from 55 New Jersey towns.

"We're extremely grateful for the Junior League of Summit's ongoing generous support to Imagine," said Mary Robinson, Founder and Executive Director of Imagine. "The League's commitment to children and families is invaluable in helping us build strong communities that support families during one of the most painful and difficult times in their lives. As an effective intervention and prevention program we are committed to helping children grow up emotionally healthy and able to lead meaningful and productive lives."

Imagine offers free year-round peer grief support at two New Jersey centers - one located

in Mountainside, and one in Newark. Concurrent support groups for parents or guardians are offered at the same time the children participate. The groups meet on weekday nights for one and a half hours, and a pizza dinner is provided prior to the group meeting.

IMAGINE SEEKS VOLUNTEERS TO PROVIDE GRIEF SUPPORT

Imagine, A Center for Coping with Loss currently seeks volunteers to serve as peer support group facilitators for children and families coping with loss due to death. Upcoming summer trainings will be held June 27-30th and July 26-29th, 2019.

Imagine groups are facilitated by trained adult volunteers who attend a 32-hour training and quarterly continuing education, and receive ongoing supervision. Volunteers come from all walks of life and need no special background other than a willingness to listen and the ability to be with children and adults in pain without trying to fix, solve problems, or give advice. Volunteers must be 21 years or older and attend

the Imagine four-day Facilitator Training. No prior experience is necessary.

"For the first time in our seven-year history we have a waiting list," said Mandi Zucker, Imagine Program Director. "As our programs continue to grow, so does our need for volunteers. We are currently serving over 380 participants every two weeks in our peer support programs and will be adding another night of support so we can serve an additional 60 people." People that complete the training leave feeling empowered to be a supportive person to people grieving any type of loss.

Imagine is a free year-round peer grief support center located in Mountainside and Newark New

Jersey, serving children age 3-18 who have had a parent or sibling die, with concurrent support groups for their parents or guardians. Support for children and teens living with a parent or sibling with a life-altering physical illness is also available. Free year-round support groups are also available for young adults who have had a friend, sibling, parent or other important person in their life die, or who have a parent, sibling or friend living with an illness.

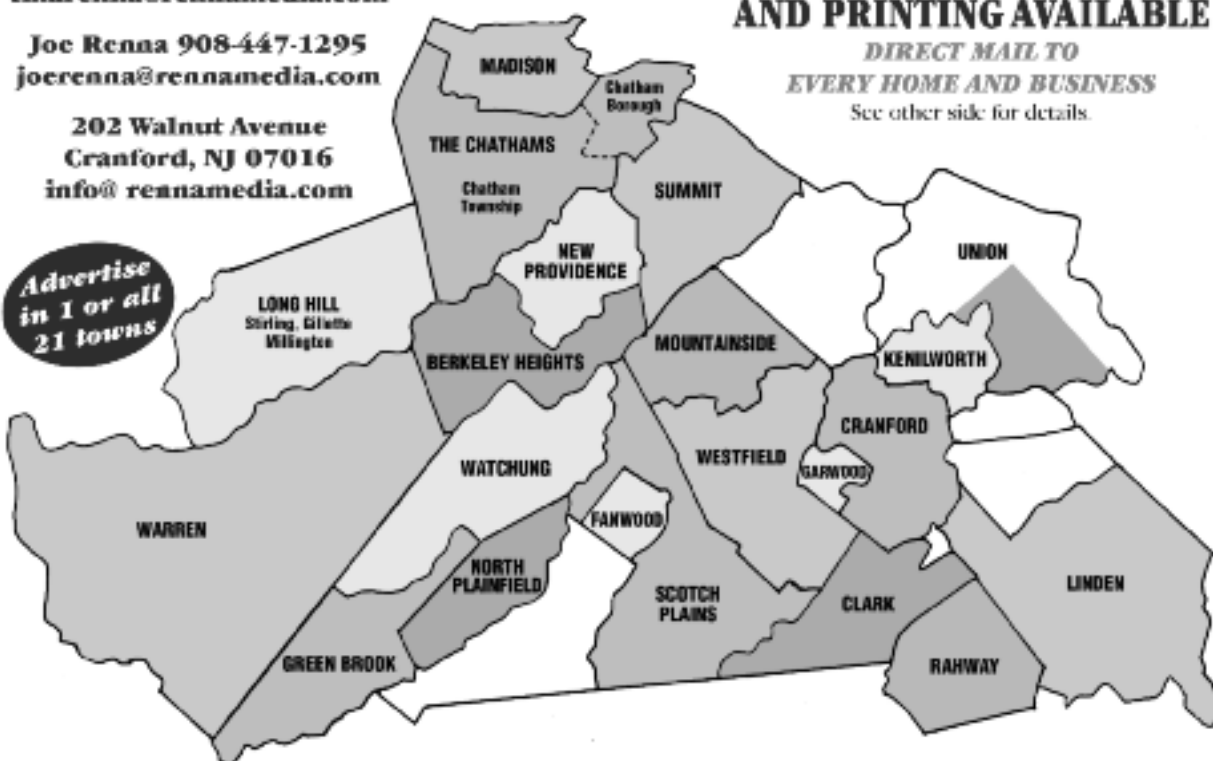
