THE MASON'S MEMORIAL DAY PARADE FLOAT RENOVATED TO HONOR CRANFORD HEROES OF THE PAST AND PRESENT

For over 50 years, the Craftsman's Club at the Masonic Temple in Cranford showed respect to Cranford's war dead by having a float in our Memorial Day Parade. In recent years, the float trailer had been unused and had fallen into a state of disrepair. As a result of the temple property being sold, the float was to be discarded. It was literally on its way to the scrap yard when I stepped in front of the tow truck and stopped the junk man. Mayor Giblin got involved and made a connection with the Cranford Jaycees and the V.F.W. and the rejuvenation plans began.

Temple members built the float from scratch in the 1960's and it has had a few different identities in our parade. For a while, each year it carried mannequins portraying the U.S. Presidents that were Masons (Washington, Monroe, Jackson, Polk, Buchanan, Johnson, Garfield, McKinley, Roosevelt, Taft, Harding, FDR, Truman and Ford). Later, their display was updated to inverted military rifles with helmets on top, commonly recognized as a Soldier's Cross.

Giving new life to the Masons' float, the Jaycees offered to provide some funds and manpower to renovate and modernize it. This gave the V.F.W. a rolling stage to allow the older heroes that formerly marched proudly in our 100-year-old parade, to continue to safely participate.

A team of Cranford Jaycees, under the leadership of Geoffrey Semler, worked feverishly to extensively renovate the float to get it parade-ready in just four short weeks. A new plywood floor with carpeting, new railings, and bench seating were installed for comfortable transport of the Cranford veterans.

Introducing the faces behind the engraved names that we honor each year in Cranford on Memorial Day is the ongoing mission of the Cranford 86 group. In support of this mission, the float features a full-color, 45-foot skirt, featuring portraits of 28 of the Cranford 86 Hometown Heroes. The float was placed in the first division of the parade following the 86

Gold Star flags that bear the names of every Cranford hero that fell during American wars since World War One.

The project has been partially funded by the Cranford Jaycees, Cranford Knights of Columbus Council #6226, and the Cranford 86 Project. O'Connor Construction provided the benches, Dreyer Farms donated the patriotic floral decoration to complete the look and Cranford Auto Repair replaced the wiring to make it roadworthy.

To the applause of friends and relatives, nine children recited poems from memory by the authors Robert Louis Stevenson, Shel Silverstein and Jack Prelutsky and two children recited poems which they had written.

The program included a word game in which the children listened to limericks with missing words and tried to find rhyming words to replace them. Then there was a raffle in which everyone won a game or a poetry book.

Afterward, the children were divided into pairs for "Back and Forth" which is a way to read poetry aloud. For this activity, each pair received a different poem and the partners took turns reading individual lines until the poem was finished. This provoked much laughter and was enjoyed by both the children and the audience. After the last poem was read, the participants were rewarded for their efforts with pizza and lemonade.

The Friends of the Cranford Public Library believe that programs like "Poetry by Heart" can help to instill in children a lifelong love of poetry. They look forward to sponsoring the program for many years to come.



HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR RECEIVES NATIONAL DAR GOOD CITIZEN AWARD

The National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution recently announced their National Good Citizen Award and Scholarship would be presented to Bridget Dineen, a senior at Cranford High School. The high school senior selected must have the qualities of dependability, service, leadership and patriotism. The scholarship portion of the program consists of two parts. The student describes how they have tried to manifest the qualities of a good citizen and secondly writes an essay on a topic chosen by the National Society. This year the topic was titled "Our American Heritage and Our Responsibility for Preserving It".

Ms. Dineen was sponsored by the Crane's Ford DAR chapter in Cranford and won the chapter award. She will be receiving the chapter award at Cranford High School Senior Award Program in

June. She was subsequently awarded 1st place among 46 New Jersey DAR chapters at a banquet held in Princeton. Attending were her parents along with Mark Cantagallo, principal of Cranford High School and Mary Leonard, Crane's Ford chapter Regent and chair of the Good Citizen committee. She was next judged at the NSDAR Eastern Division which included 6 states and again won 1st place. Having won the Division, Bridget was entered into the National level, which consisted of 8 Divisional winners from across the United States and she was chosen as the National winner. She will be invited to attend the NSDAR 128th Continental Congress at Constitution Hall in Washington DC in late June to be recognized for her achievement and accept her award. The New Jersey DAR will host a luncheon at the Willard Hotel in Washington DC which she will also be invited to attend.

The Crane's Ford chapter has been sponsoring

the Good Citizen Award since 1950 and this is the first time the chapter has had a National winner. The National Society has been awarding the Good Citizen Scholarship for 85 years and this is only the second time a New Jersey DAR chapter has had a National winner.

The DAR, founded in 1890 and headquartered in Washington, D.C., is a non-profit, non-political volunteer women's service organization dedicated to promoting patriotism, preserving American history, and securing America's future through better education for children. Currently there are 185,000 members and 3,000 chapters. There are chapters in all 50 states, the District of Columbia and other countries. The Crane's Ford chapter, founded in 1944, is currently celebrating its 75th Anniversary. DAR membership is open to any woman 18 years or older who can prove lineal, bloodline descent from an ancestor who aided in achieving American Independence.





CRANFORD POLICE LAUNCH VIRTUAL NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH PROGRAM

The Cranford Police Department is proud to announce a new Community/Police Partnership Program. The Police Department has launched a virtual neighborhood watch program by creating a voluntary registry of business' and homeowners' surveillance cameras systems, utilized to catch criminals.

The Cranford Civilian Cam (CCC) Program maps out the locations of the cameras so officers can find possible evidence faster. The directory does NOT allow officers to tap into private cameras, and would only indicate where the cameras are located. By registering your camera with us, the Department can quickly identify nearby cameras that may have captured criminal activity. After registering your camera, you would only be contacted by the Cranford Police Department if there was a law enforcement related need in the vicinity of your security camera. Police personnel, if necessary, may request to view your camera footage in order to assist in the investigation. The directory will be confidential and only accessible to law enforcement.

Many business owners and residents currently operate surveillance systems at their businesses and/or homes. As crimes occur nearby, they are not always aware that their system may have captured information that could help solve the crime, thus keeping our community safer. In turn, the police are also not always aware who may or

may not have this potentially vital information. The Police Department is requesting residents and businesses across town to register their privately-owned surveillance camera systems.

Using the geographic locations of the registered cameras, the Cranford Police Department will be able to directly e-mail or call citizens in an area in which a crime occurred. A standard e-mail may ask the citizen to check their video surveillance system for a specific date and time for video capturing a suspect, getaway car or a crime. If the citizen finds any video evidence, they can contact the Police Department to make arrangements for video retrieval. Installing video surveillance is a great example of community-police partnerships and is something we highly value as a police agency serving our community.

Interested citizens can register their cameras by filling out a short application that is located on our website cranfordnj.org/police-department. The applications can also be picked up at the police department. The Cranford Police Department is committed to our partnership with the community and believes this is yet another powerful solution in fighting crime.






REGISTER FOR SUMMER YOUTH BASEBALL LEAGUE

CRANFORD VETERAN LEE BLOWE IS 2019 GRAND MARSHAL OF MEMORIAL DAY PARADE

VFW Post #335, and Steve Robertazzi, Director of the Cranford Parks and Recreation Department, to be the 2019 Grand Marshal of Cranford's Memorial Day Parade. Blowe, a former sergeant, was a combat squadron leader with Charlie Company of the 1st Marine Division in and around Chu Li, Viet Nam during 1966.

He and his wife Karen have lived in Cranford for 22 years residing with their 17 year old twin children, Patrick and Catherine, who attend the Technology Academy and Allied Science Programs respectively, at Union County Vocational-Technical High School in Scotch Plains.

"Memorial Day is a very special day for me," Blowe explained, "it's a day I sadly remember all my buddies who didn't come home from Viet Nam, like I did. For that reason alone, I am truly honored to be our Grand Marshall this year."

Blowe, a recent retiree, spent 35 years as a chief operational manager in the Walgreen Drug Store chain. His primary function with Walgreens was establishing and setting up new store locations for the company and getting them up and running as working, profitable entities.

Volunteers say the training is "life-changing" and a wonderful opportunity for learning about themselves and how their own losses have affected the way they grieve and how they support others. People that complete the training leave feeling empowered to be a supportive person to people grieving.

Imagine is a free year-round peer grief support center located in Mountainside and Newark New Jersey, serving children age 3-18 who have had a parent or sibling die, with concurrent support groups for their parents or guardians. Support for children and teens living with a parent or sibling with a life-altering physical illness is also available. Free year-round support groups are also available for young adults who have had a friend, sibling, parent or other important person in their life die, or who have a parent, sibling or friend living with an illness.





The YWCA's mission is eliminating racism, empowering women, and promoting peace, justice, freedom and dignity for all. Locally, the YWCA Union County is on a mission to empower survivors of domestic violence to become safe and free from abuse through comprehensive, client-centered services, and

Domestic violence crosses all barriers of race, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, gender and socioeconomic status and it is a crime that impacts our entire community. It is estimated that 1 in every 4 women will be affected by domestic violence in her life- more than breast cancer, lung cancer, and ovarian cancer combined. The monetary cost of domestic violence in the United States in dollars has been estimated to exceed 9.3 billion a year in medical and mental health services, loss of productivity, and loss of paid earnings. An average of 3 women per day in the United States are killed as a result of domestic violence.



LOCKEY MAISSONNEUVE, AUTHOR

Recognition for her willingness to share her personal story and add her voice to eradicate human trafficking in our state, our country, and

Lockey Maisonneuve was born to alcoholic parents, and sold into sex trafficking by her father as an adolescent. Years later, she was diagnosed with breast cancer and underwent chemotherapy and two mastechtomies. During that time, her mother, to whom she was estranged, was murdered.

Any one of these traumatic scenarios could wear a person down. But not Lockey.

An author and presenter -- including as the keynote speaker at Union County's 2018 Human Trafficking Symposium, Lockey always says "it didn't break me" as she speaks about her traumatic past and journey into healing. She will say she has her moments, but knows if she handled that, she can handle anything.

Her debut memoir, "A Girl Raised By Wolves," details her journey, and inspires others to know that healing is possible. The book is about her childhood, the things she went through, and how she stepped through it all and healed from the trauma. She noted she still has flashbacks and triggers, but she has learned to manage them, and that "there is life after trauma."

In her search for healing, Maisonneuve found yoga. She now instructs yoga at Newark Public Schools, Trinitas Hospital, drug and alcohol rehab facilities, and prisons.

Lockey has said that everything she does is a direct result of what she got out of healing from everything she has been through, and from confronting her own feelings about herself and

reconciling the things that happened to her."

In addition to promoting her book and public speaking engagements, Lockey said she is inspired by her two teenaged children, and her husband, Jean-Albert, a Cranford Township Committeeman.

We applaud Lockey not only for finding the strength and courage to heal herself and journey on, but for sharing her incredible story with us to inspire us all.

Recognition for incredible life-altering service to our country, and for inspirational example-setting since he has come back home.

Jim Silkensen is a very humble and unassuming man, who does his job quietly, not asking for anything in return. Jim credits his parents with teaching him from an early age the importance of serving others, which became even more heightened witnessing the terrible impact of the war on the Vietnamese people.

He graduated in August 1968 with an MBA from Oregon State University, and married his sweetheart Candy. Job prospects were limited as employers did not want to hire anyone who might be drafted into the Army. He was hired as a management trainee by the Freightliner Corporation in Portland, Oregon. Four months after graduating and getting married, he was called to serve our country. Inducted into the U.S. Army in February 1970, he went to Fort Lewis Washington for basic infantry training before being sent to Viet Nam. To help pay the rent, Candy dropped out of college in her senior year to work.

Jim was awarded the Bronz Star, and came home in December 1971 to pick up his career. The family moved to Cranford in 1984 from Washington D.C. so Jim could join what would become the New Jersey Bankers Association. A husband and a father, he and Candy raised their two sons, and served in the community.

He currently is a member of the staff at the Cranford Post 335 of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, worked through the posts, and has served as Chaplain for the past two years. He has never refused the opportunity to help a comrade, whether providing support, or a helping hand. He and Candy are also active members of the Cranford United Methodist Church, where Jim sings in the chancel choir.

In addition to honoring him for his service to our country as a veteran, we would also like to honor him for his steadfast community service.

Jim is an inspirational sight to park visitors, and surely sets a great example for adults and children alike. Jim could be seen every day in the park picking up trash for no other reason than to make the park more beautiful. He has said, "I like to get across that one person can make a difference if they put their mind to it." For 25 years, he would simply walk along and pick up trash in Nomahegan and Lenape Parks, and, after retiring, added Black Brook Park. For five years, he also picked up trash along the trails of the Watchung and South Mountain Reservations. Since moving to Somerset, he continues to pick up trash there. He truly has made a difference, and made our world -- and our County -- a more beautiful place.



CRANFORD POLICE COMPLETE ROLLOUT OF BODY-WORN CAMERAS

The Cranford Police Department recently announced that a limited number of officers will now be equipped with body-worn cameras. This initiative is part of a county-wide effort by the Union County Prosecutor's Office aimed at equipping all Union County police agencies with body- worn cameras. The public will see the new cameras being worn by police officers working in the Patrol Division.

Body-worn cameras have been effective in memorializing important information during critical incidents. Cranford Police Officers are required to activate the body cameras when conducting investigative and enforcement actions such as making an arrest, issuing a summons, searches or stopping a person on the street in the course of an investigation. All officers equipped with body-worn cameras have received training on the devices. The body-worn cameras supplement our existing in-car digital video systems which currently record motor vehicle traffic stops.




