EDUCATION FOUNDATION ANNUAL APPRECIATION DINNER

On April 25, 2019, the Education Foundation of Garwood (EFG) held its 15th Annual Appreciation Dinner at The Westwood. Mrs. Crystal Spagnuolo was honored as Lincoln School's Educator of the Year and Mrs. Adele Lewis was honored as Garwood's Person Making a Difference.

Mrs. Spagnuolo is currently in her 20th year in the district teaching 7th and 8th Grade Mathematics as well as 7th Grade English Language Arts. She grew up in Garwood and has shared that she, "always felt a special connection with the school and the students in it."

Mrs. Lewis is the founder of the EFG and continues to serve as a member, which she has done each year in its 15 year existence. Additionally, she spent twelve years serving on Garwood's Board of Education, eight of those years as President. Currently, she is on the Westfield YMCA Board of Trustees, the Garwood Historical Committee, and is a shelter volunteer at the Jersey Animal Coalition (JAC) in South Orange.

With over 140 in attendance to enjoy the awards ceremony, dinner, tricky tray, and 50/50 raffles, this signature event raised more than \$4,700 for the EFG. The generosity of local business contributes greatly to the ability of this event to be a very successful fundraiser. The Foundation raises funds in order to provide scholarships for graduating Garwood 8th Grade students and high school seniors. In addition, the Foundation awards grants to Garwood educators to enhance the curriculum. To date, the EFG has distributed over \$56,000 in scholarships and grants.

Candace Kilmer, President of the EFG, expressed, "Thank you to all those who attended the dinner, sponsored a table, or donated an item for the tricky tray. With your help, we were able to make this year's Appreciation Dinner one of the most successful in recent history and a memorable celebration for the honorees."

The EFG is a nonprofit, tax-exempt 501(c)3 organization. It was founded in 2004 to work with the Garwood School District "in pursuit of


POLICE TO HOST 2ND ANNUAL YOUTH ACADEMY





WHAT, WHERE, AND WHEN IN OLD KENILWORTH – GREATEST GENERATION

Part I of a tribute saluting ten living Kenilworth veterans who fought in World War II appeared in the May edition of this newspaper. Since that publication one has passed away.

Technical Sergeant Alex "Kelsy" Kuriawa, of the US Army, 99, passed away suddenly on May 5, 2019. TSgt. Kuriawa served from 1943-1945. He was part of the Normandy Invasion (D-Day)

and fought in the Battle of the Bulge under immense enemy shelling and gun fire. Born in Elizabeth, he and his late wife of 66 years, Helen, moved to Kenilworth in 1953. Their four sons are: Kevin, Christopher, John, and Michael. Known by his nickname, Kelsy, he served in the Kenilworth public works department for 34 years, most of the time as superintendent.

Motor Machinists Mate 2nd Class James F. Lucadema, 93, served in the US Navy, 1944-1946. Headquartered at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, he was on anti-submarine patrols off the South American coast. Among the ships he sailed was the USS Marlboro (APB 38). His future wife, Lucille Sodano, enlisted in the WAVES in 1945. She passed away this April at age 95. Married in 1949, they moved to Kenilworth in 1956. Their children are Kenneth and Donna (Masucci).

Seaman First Class Robert Moldenhauer, 92, served in the US Navy, 1944-1946. Stationed aboard the destroyer, USS Hyman, his ship was hit by a kamikaze plane at the Battle of Okinawa, causing fire and death. At the Battle of Iwo Jima, he witnessed the flag raised on Mt. Suribachi. Married in 1949 to Marie DeStefano, they moved that year to Kenilworth. They are the parents of three: Robert, Lynn, and Brian. VFW Post 2230 honored him, and fellow navy veteran John Beninati, in 2015. Moldenhauer served 23 years as a special police officer.

Private 1st Class John A. Rembish, 95, served in the US Army, 1943-1946. In the artillery battery, he saw action in southern France during


the invasion of Anzio and later in Germany. At war's end he was in Austria. He and his late wife, Ann Sickle, both born in Pennsylvania, married in 1955 and moved to Kenilworth in1963. They have four sons: John, Jr., Michael, Peter, and James.

Private 1st Class Robert D. Sammons, 97, served in the Army Air Corps, 1943-1946. Pfc Sammons was primarily stationed at Guam while serving in the Asiatic-Pacific Theater. His duties included special vehicle operator, and training with the Thompson submarine gun. He was a second-class gunner. Born in Bayonne and married in 1949, he and his late wife of 63 years, Dorine Faircloth, moved to Kenilworth in 1955. They have a son, Richard.

Another surviving veteran, a corporal, age 95, served in the US Army, 1943-1946. He wishes to remain anonymous at this time. Mainly stationed in India he also was stationed in Africa. When on board ship in the Mediterranean, it and another ship sailing behind his, were attacked for two days by German aircraft. The second ship was sunk with great loss of life. Married in 1949, he and his late wife moved to Kenilworth in 1951. They have three sons.



He and his wife Karen have lived in Cranford for 22 years residing with their 17 year old twin children, Patrick and Catherine, who attend the Technology Academy and Allied Science Programs respectively, at Union County Vocational-Technical High School in Scotch Plains.

"Memorial Day is a very special day for me," Blowe explained, "it's a day I sadly remember

all my buddies who didn't come home from Viet Nam, like I did. For that reason alone, I am truly honored to be our Grand Marshall this year."

Blowe, a recent retiree, spent 35 years as a chief operational manager in the Walgreen Drug Store chain. His primary function with Walgreens was establishing and setting up new store locations for the company and getting them up and running as working, profitable entities.

Born and raised in rural Murfreesboro, North Carolina, Blowe has become a well known and active part of the greater Cranford community. He currently serves as a director on the Cranford Area Chamber of Commerce. He also serves on the Memorial Day Parade Committee. At the Cranford VFW he is a Senior Vice Commander, Buddy Poppy Chairman, and a member of its Post #335 Centennial Celebration Committee.


Over 131 varsity athletic letters were handed out throughout the evening, as participation in athletics at ALJ continues to grow.


