Recent visitors to Linden's Academy of Excellence got a hearty breakfast that included eggs, bacon, fruit, pancakes and plenty more. Afterward, they were given a card that tallied up the calories they had just consumed.

But their hosts and hostesses may have gotten even more out of the day.

Students at Linden's alternative high school presented their second annual "Count the Calories Breakfast" as a way to integrate what they've learned in science and math classes into a real-life work experience.

"This event not only enhanced math and science skills, it also prepared the students with real-life skills that they can take into any workplace," said Abdelmonem Zeidan, a science teacher at the school who was the driving force behind the event.

Special guests at the two breakfast sessions included administrators and staff from throughout the district, Board of Education members and other elected officials, and families. Students met them as they came in the door of the school, which is housed in the former St. Elizabeth's School. Other students showed them to their seats and took their orders.

"For the second year, the Academy of Excellence students have done a wonderful job putting together the 'Count the Calories Breakfast," said Superintendent Danny A. Robertozzi. "They should all be proud of the work they did, and I commend Mr. Zeidan for organizing the event and inspiring the students to be their best. All the guests had a great time and the food was delicious!"

Behind the scenes, the kitchen bustled with a host of workers who cooked, prepared and plated the meals, and others who cleaned up and washed dishes. Others tallied up the calories from each order and presented the total to each guest.

"These students worked tirelessly under the guidance of Mr. Zeidan," Kcyronne Zahir, director of the Academy of Excellence, said during opening remarks at the breakfast. "Today is just one day; I am proud of what our students do day in and day out. They come to school and they come to do work. So as much as this is something for all of you, it's really something for us to take a look at them and say, 'Wow! You're more than capable.""

The breakfast, which was funded through a grant from the Linden Education Association, also took on the added significance of falling on Administrative Professionals Day. Many of the district's secretaries and administrative

assistants were in attendance and honored during opening remarks by student Ania Williams.

The work for the breakfast began long before that day. Using district-issued MacBook Air laptops, students developed menus, and created table assignment cards, fliers, and formal invitations to promote the event.

Art students helped to create a welcoming ambiance by adding paintings around the cafeteria, as well as flowers on each table.

Guests were also able to buy gift baskets that included decorative plants as well as soaps and candles made by students in science class.

"I tell students all the time that they can become anything that they want," Zahir said. "We push them and push them, and sometime they get tired of us, but we want to see them succeed.

"When the seniors walk across that field in June to receive their diploma, I want them to know that they earned it when they came in each and every day to put the work in."

### REGISTER FOR SUMMER YOUTH BASEBALL LEAGUE

The Union County Baseball Association invites baseball players between the ages of 8 and 15 to register for its Summer Youth Baseball League.

All games are played in Warinanco Park, on the border of Elizabeth and Roselle, Monday through Thursday between 9 a.m. and 12 p.m. The games are coached and supervised by Union County Baseball Association staff. The season will begin in late June and end the first week of August.

Players are divided into three age groups: Minor League 8-10 year olds, Major League 11-12 year olds, and Teen League 13-15 year olds.

The Union County Baseball Association has added indoor clinics to the Summer League program. UCBA staff will utilize the new stateof-the-art Warinanco Park Skating Center, which is equipped with artificial turf and indoor batting cages, to provide players weekly clinics focused on hitting, fielding, pitching, and catching. This added benefit is included with the player registration fee.

The registration fee for the Summer Baseball League is \$50 and players can register online at ucba-nj.org. In-person registration will also be held on June 15th and June 22nd from 9 a.m. - 1 p.m. at the Warinanco Park Boathouse.

### **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO PROVIDE GRIEF SUPPORT**

Imagine, A Center for Coping with Loss currently seeks volunteers to serve as peer support group facilitators for children and families coping with loss due to death. Upcoming summer trainings will be held June 27-30th and July 26-29th, 2019.

Imagine groups are facilitated by trained adult volunteers who attend a 32-hour training and quarterly continuing education, and receive ongoing supervision. Volunteers come from all walks of life and need no special background other than a willingness to listen and the ability to be with children and adults in pain without trying to fix, solve problems, or give advice. Volunteers must be 21 years or older and attend the Imagine four-day Facilitator Training. No prior experience is necessary.

"For the first time in our seven-year history we have a waiting list," said Mandi Zucker, Imagine Program Director. "As our programs continue to grow, so does our need for volunteers. We are currently serving over 380 participants every two weeks in our peer support programs and will be adding another night of support so we can serve an additional 60 people." Volunteers say the training is "life-changing" and a wonderful opportunity for learning about themselves and how their own losses have affected the way they grieve and how they support others. People that complete the training leave feeling empowered to be a supportive person to people grieving any type of loss.

Imagine is a free year-round peer grief support center located in Mountainside and Newark New Jersey, serving children age 3-18 who have had a parent or sibling die, with concurrent support groups for their parents or guardians. Support for children and teens living with a parent or sibling with a life-altering physical illness is also available. Free yearround support groups are also available for young adults who have had a friend, sibling, parent or other important person in their life die, or who have a parent, sibling or friend living with an illness.

### LINDEN POLICE OPEN NEWLY RENOVATED FITNESS CENTER

The Linden Police Department officially opened the doors to the newly renovated Fitness Center on Monday, April 29, 2019. Mayor Armstead joined Chief Hart, community partners, and other city officials to tour the completed project, which included the overhaul of the Department's IT Department and Muster Room.

"The space was effectively unusable in its previous state, and these renovations were desperately needed," said Police Chief David Hart.

One of the most significant improvements to the fitness center is the addition of a separate women's locker room. "Women comprise nearly 10% of the department, so the fact that there weren't separate facilities before now is pretty astonishing," said Chief Hart.

A majority of the work on the four-month

The YWCA's mission is eliminating racism, empowering women, and promoting peace, justice, freedom and dignity for all. Locally, the YWCA Union County is on a mission to empower survivors of domestic violence to become safe and free from abuse through comprehensive, client-centered services, and through education, collaboration and advocacy that builds safe, informed and supportive communities.

Domestic violence crosses all barriers of race, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, gender and socioeconomic status and it is a crime that impacts our entire community. It is estimated that 1 in every 4 women will be affected by domestic violence in her life- more than breast cancer, lung cancer, and ovarian cancer combined. The monetary cost of domestic violence in the United States in dollars has been estimated to exceed 9.3 billion a year in medical and mental health services, loss of productivity, and loss of paid earnings. An average of 3 women per day in the United States are killed as a result of domestic violence.

### SAMIYYAH MUHAMMAD OF LINDEN NAMED ADVOCATE FOR FOSTER YOUTH

Thanks to Samiyyah Muhammad, Linden was among 13 municipalities represented by the 15 newest court appointed special advocates tasked with serving as extra eyes and ears for family law judges on the cases of Union County youth removed from their home due to abuse, neglect or abandonment and placed in foster homes or residential facilities. The ceremony was held on April 9, 2019 at the Union County Family Courthouse.

Said Muhammad, "I wanted to become a CASA volunteer so I can give children an opportunity to be heard. If I do not stand for our children, then I am standing for nothing at all."

After completion of approximately 30 hours' training with Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County, Muhammad and her classmates took their oath and were sworn in as advocates and judicial volunteers by Superior Court Judge Richard Wischusen. After completion of three hours' court observation to

see seasoned CASA volunteers in action, the new advocates will meet their assigned foster youth or siblings.

The new advocates range from age 23 to 66, are parents and nonparents, and work in such fields as education, nonprofit, and law enforcement, as well as homemakers. Most had no prior knowledge of the foster system.

With court-ordered access to foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers, CASA volunteers incorporate their findings into court reports and work to ensure each youth's needs are met and best interests protected. They are a constant during chaos and work to ensure the youth's trauma is not exacerbated in care.

There are approximately 500 Union County youth from birth to age 21 in foster care, and more than 200 are still waiting for their very own CASA volunteer in their corner.

### SCHOOL DEDICATES MEMORIAL TO 'LOVING, SWEET' KINDERGARTNER

School No. 4 in Linden lost a young student to tragedy last November, but Sofia Thomas left a lasting impression on the hearts of students, staff and community.

Now there is a visible memorial that will be reminder of her impact on the school for years to come.

School No. 4 held a moving dedication ceremony on Monday, May 6, 2019, for a new electronic display board in the front of the school, with an inscription reading "In Loving Memory of Sofia K. Thomas, Kindergartener 2018. She Loved People and Learning."

The sign was purchased with donations gathered through a GoFundMe page in Sofia's memory after she died tragically along with her grandmother, Mariamma Thomas, in a motor vehicle accident in Chester Township on November 8, 2018.

Dozens of friends, family, school staff, and community members gathered in front of the school for the dedication ceremony. They heard memories of Sofia as an outgoing, happy, and intelligent girl who loved School No. 4.

"I look out and see so many people who Sofia loved," Sofia's mother, Tini Thomas, said during the ceremony. "She loved her community, she loved her school, she loved her teachers, she loved her friends. And so we decided to put all of our energies toward getting that sign board. And within a matter of days, pennies came in from heaven. They became hundreds and thousands of dollars. And the sign board went up."

The GoFundMe page raised \$13,000, which was used to buy the sign. The School No. 4 Parent Teacher Organization purchased the memorial engraving and landscaping. The Linden Public Schools Maintenance Department helped with the installation and creation of a flower bed.

"Sofia and her family have left a lasting impression on me personally and professionally," said Principal Anthony Cataline. "I know how much she was loved. Together we share fond memories of Sofia, which are etched in our hearts and our minds forever. I and the entire School 4 community are appreciative of Sofia's family and friends, who donated this electronic message

Dozens of friends, family, school staff, and board in her memory. She will never be mmunity members gathered in front of the forgotten."

> Also speaking at the ceremony were Vice Principal Suzanne Olivero, Mayor Derek Armstead, Pre-K teacher Christine Principato, and Pastor Peter J. Hegel and Karin J. Rumbauskas of the Oasis Christian Centre in Rahway, where Sofia and her family are members.

> "I am honored and privileged to have been Sofia's Pre-K teacher," Principato told the gathering. "She touched many people around her, her classmates, administrators and other teachers here at School 4. She had quite an impact on her class and on me. Sofia is not physically here today, but her memory lives on in our hearts forever. We will miss you Sofia."

> School No. 4 music teachers Lisa Mallick and Katherine Thode performed a moving version of "Somewhere Over the Rainbow" on keyboard and flute.

> Several other family members and friends – including young children – spoke about what a wonderful girl Sofia was and the impact she left on them.

> Superintendent of Schools Danny A. Robertozzi was in attendance at the ceremony and was moved by the testimonials.

"This was such a nice way to remember Sofia," he said. "It's obvious from those who knew her best what an amazing young lady she was. I'm happy that the family and our district were able to work together to install the memorial, which will ensure that students will know of her impact for years to come."

Pastor Hegel said the inscription on the sign is a perfect fit for Sofia.

"She was such a loving, sweet girl who always had a smile. She loved people," he said. "This is truly the legacy that Sofia leaves behind. And it's a challenge to all of us. Many of us need to smile more. Many of us need to love more. Many of us need to hug our kids more. To be mindful if someone lacks and ask, 'Can I help?' That's was what Sofia would do. This is what Sofia was all about. "And because of her, I'm a better person today."
