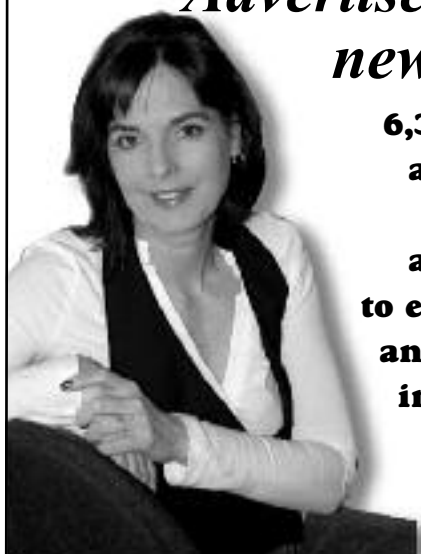

CHATHAM BOROUGH TO HOLD 48TH ANNUAL FISHAWACK FESTIVAL JUNE 8TH

On Saturday, June 8th, 2019, Chatham Borough will be hosting its 48th Annual Fishawack Festival, jointly organized by the Chatham Borough Community Services Department and MyChathamNJ. Since 1971, the festival has celebrated the Borough's historical connection with the Lenape Native Americans. Chatham once acted as a welcoming stop for those traveling down the Passaic River, once referred to as "The Fishawack" by the Native Americans for its convenient traveling routes and easily accessible food supply. This annual cultural-heritage festival features live musical performers, local shops, a Kids Fun Zone, a Car Show, and much more to entertain the entire family!

To kick off the start of the festival day, you can relax at our new stage on Grand Lower Lum Field, with performances starting at 10am and ending at 6pm.

One of the most popular attractions for kids offered at Fishawack is the Kids Zone, which has been continuously sponsored by Chatham Asset Management and is open from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m., with giant slide, rock wall, mega obstacle course, water target, and many more!

The Fishawack Festival will be expanding our live acts this year by adding a second performance stage to Grand Lower Lum Field (10 a.m. – 6 p.m.), in addition to the Gazebo stage (10 a.m. – 4 p.m.). The Gazebo stage, sponsored by Mary Weichert and

Weichert Realtors, will have seating available surrounding the stage. .

A majority of the dining options offered can be found in the Railroad South Lot, featuring ice cream, fresh-squeezed lemonade, ethnic diverse food offerings, pretzels, and much more. 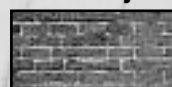

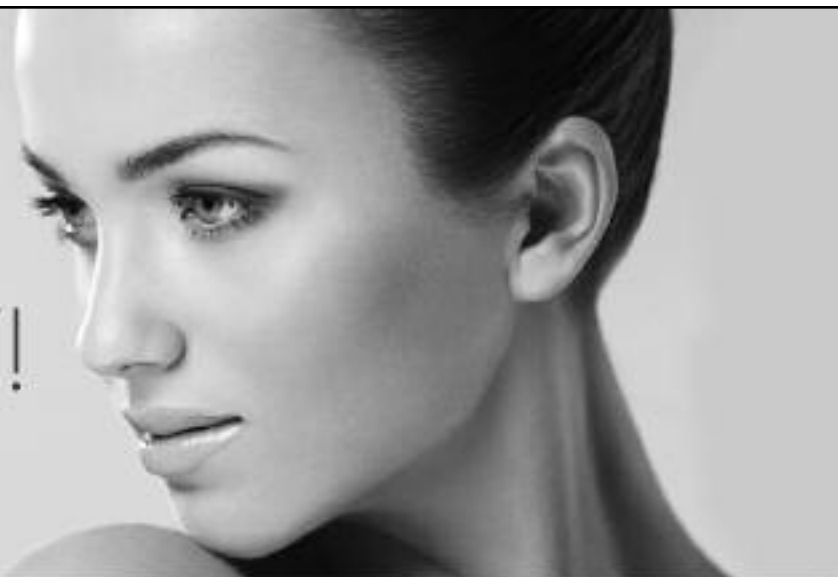

"Bag It" - Film Screening and Discussion

Americans use 60,000 plastic bags every five minutes -- single-use disposable bags that we mindlessly throw away. But where is "away?" Where do the bags and other plastics end up, and at what cost to our environment, marine life and human health? Bag It follows "everyman" Jeb Berrier as he navigates our plastic world. Jeb is not a radical environmentalist, but an average American who decides to take a closer look at our cultural love affair with plastics. Jeb's journey in this documentary film starts with simple questions: Are plastic bags really necessary? What are plastic bags made from? What happens to plastic bags after they are discarded? Jeb looks beyond plastic bags and discovers that virtually everything in modern society-from baby bottles, to sports equipment, to dental sealants, to personal care products-is made with plastic or contains potentially harmful chemical additives used in the plastic-making process. When Jeb's journey takes a personal twist, we see how our crazy-for-plastic world has finally

caught up with us and what we can do about it. Today. Right now.

Basics of Butterfly Gardening

Whether you are a gardener who wants to see more butterflies in your garden, a butterfly enthusiast who wants to bring that passion to the garden, or someone who simply wants to make their garden or yard friendlier to Monarchs or other butterflies, Jane Hurwitz, butterfly expert, will provide ideas about protecting the entire life cycle of butterflies that visit our gardens, plant selection, and creative ideas on how to make our yards and gardens an oasis for butterflies and other creatures.

Jane is the editor of Butterfly Gardener magazine and former director of the Butterfly Garden and Habitat Program for the North American Butterfly Association. She has spent decades observing and writing about the interface of butterflies and gardens. 2019 MEMORIAL DAY PARADE GRAND MARSHALL DR. ROBERT NEWHOUSE

Dr. Robert Newhouse is a veteran of the World War II, having served in the European Theater. After graduating from West Orange High School in 1942, he enlisted in the Army Signal Corps and was enrolled on an inactive basis at the communication school in Newark. Following graduation and induction at Fort Dix, he was offered a transfer to the Army Air Corps for pilot training at Gettysburg College. Six months later training stopped. He and many of his classmates were transferred to other assignments. His was assigned to the 78th infantry division at Camp Pickett Virginia for training as one of many replacements for soldiers who lost their lives during the invasion of Europe. In 1944 the division was deployed overseas as part of the 369th Regiment Headquarters Company.

Following advances through France and Belgium, the 78th saw its first combat at the Siegfried Line. After two days of heavy

fighting, the German army mounted their last serious offensive of the war, the so-called Battle of the Bulge. When the German breakthrough occurred, the members of the entire 78th Division were ordered to hold their positions at all costs. They contained the German offensive at the northern sector of the Bulge.

The division continued its advance to the Rhine River. Doctor Newhouse was wounded during combat and spent two months recovering in a hospital in Paris, France. He was awarded the Purple Heart and the Bronze Star among other decorations.

Doctor Newhouse's 58 years in education included leadership positions ranging from pre-school through elementary, junior high, college and graduate levels in Florham Park, Madison, Kean College, Fairleigh Dickinson University and the College of St. Elizabeth. His career in Madison included teaching in the Junior School as well as principal of the Green Village School,

the Lucy D. Anthony School, the Tory J. Sabatini School, and the Madison Junior School. Dr. Newhouse also enjoyed officiating high school football, basketball and baseball as well as playing golf and tennis.

A long time resident of neighboring Florham Park, Dr. Newhouse and his wife Michele are active members of the Madison Historical Society. Dr. Newhouse has also served as President and member of the Madison Scholarship Committee for over forty years.
