# **SERGEANT DENNIS CAROVILLANO** PRESENTED WITH UNITY ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Nineteen individuals and four organizations were recognized by the Union County Human Relations Commission at the 18th annual Unity Achievement Award presentation held on Monday, May 6, 2019 at the Kean University STEM Center in Union Township.

The award recipients were nominated and selected for their philanthropic and volunteer efforts, and for fostering and promoting human rights and dignity among the people of Union County.

The mission of the Union County Human Relations Commission is to actively encourage, develop, promote, and strengthen respect for human rights and cultural diversity among the people of Union County.

Unity Award for Achievement in Law Enforcement -- Sergeant Dennis Carovillano, New Providence Police Department

Recognition for his steadfast belief in, and commitment to, the UCHRC's Police & Teens Together Program.

When the Union County Human Relations Commission launched its Police & Teens Together Program in Spring 2000 at Elizabeth High School, the vision was to introduce it to every high school in Union County, and offer it consistently year after

In 2003, the program was introduced at New Providence High School. Then Officer Dennis Carovillano got right on board, coordinated the program between the New Providence Police Department and New Providence High School, and presented the program to three of Mr. Byron's Criminology classes. The program was incredibly well received by the students, and it was a resounding success for all involved.

For each of the past sixteen years, Sgt. Carovillano has been responsible for ensuring the program has been consistently delivered to two-to-three Criminology classes. While other high schools have run the program multiple times, New Providence Police Department is the only Union County department to deliver the program as conceived and designed. For that, they have greatly benefitted from creating a school culture wherein teenagers and police officers can openly communicate with each other, respect each other, and, when an encounter occurs or is needed, does not evoke feelings of fear and anxiety on the part of the teenage students.

In addition, Sgt. Carovillano has served as a co-instructor with UCHRC Commissioner Karen Positan presenting a bi-annual inservice Train The Trainer course at the John H. Stamler Police Academy, to encourage other municipal departments throughout

the state to adopt this amazing and impactful program and implement it in their local high schools, and presentations at the New Jersey Juvenile Officers Association Annual Conference and at the Union County Juvenile Officers Association meetings.

New Providence American Legion Post 433 will conduct this year's Flag Retirement Ceremony on Flag Day, Friday, June 14, 2019 at 7:00 p.m. The Public is invited to attend this important event which will be held at the Legion Hall, 357 Elkwood Avenue in New Providence. next to the Veterans Memorial Library. American flags which have become faded, frayed, soiled or otherwise unserviceable will be retired by destroying with full respect and honor. These rites include burning on an appropriate pyre. The Legion expects to retire approximately 3,000 unserviceable flags this year.

Anyone desiring to retire an unserviceable flag in this ceremony is asked to place it in the flag receptacle in front of the Legion Hall or drop it off at the American Legion Post by 5:00 p.m. on

"Every citizen should recognize the flag's importance and understand how it should be displayed while in service and when it should be retired from service," said American Legion Post 433 officer Gerald Gross.

Since 1946, American Legion Post 433 has served veterans of New Providence, Summit and Berkeley Heights. 

#### June 4 - Overview of Tappan Zee Bridge Project

Rich Schrader will discuss the replacement of the old Tappan Zee Bridge covering the history of replacement discussions/actions, the procurement method selected by state, key political and private involvement, major features, design and construction parameters, and current status. Rich, a registered professional engineer, has almost 40 years of professional experience with some 35 years in engineering and construction. He spent 11 years with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and taught at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point.

#### June 11 - The Gateway Rail Project

Martin Robins will discuss the necessity of completing the entire Gateway rail because the project is vital to the economic well-being to northern and central New Jersey. Martin led a team responsible for drafting legislation creating NJ Transit, directed the planning for the Hudson-Bergen light rail line and helped found the Alan M. Voorhees Transportation Center at Rutgers University.

#### **June 18 - Union County Traffic Signals**

Since the early 2000's, Union County upgraded approximately 400 traffic signals on County or Local Roads in Union County. Gordon Meth was involved in the design of these traffic signals in Union County. His presentation will give an overview of some of the considerations facing the design of traffic signals and some of the future possibilities for smarter traffic signals. Gordon Meth is a professional engineer specializing in transportation planning and traffic engineering.











Childhood bereavement is a serious public

health issue. The death of a parent or other commitment to children and families is important person in a child's life is one of the most commonly reported and disruptive Adverse Childhood Experiences. There are currently more than 109,000 New Jersey youth aged 18 and under who are bereaved due to the death of a parent. Imagine is currently serving over 330 children and adults from 55 New Jersey towns.

"We're extremely grateful for the Junior League of Summit's ongoing generous support to Imagine," said Mary Robinson, Founder and Executive Director of Imagine. "The League's

invaluable in helping us build strong communities that support families during one of the most painful and difficult times in their lives. As an effective intervention and prevention program we are committed to helping children grow up emotionally healthy and able to lead meaningful and productive lives."

Imagine offers free year-round peer grief support at two New Jersey centers - one located in Mountainside, and one in Newark. Concurrent support groups for parents or guardians are offered at the same time the children participate. The groups meet on weekday nights for one and a half hours, and a pizza dinner is provided prior to the group meeting.




