SUMMIT RECEIVES 16 FINAL NOMINATIONS FOR PIPPIN

CHATHAM BOROUGH TO HOLD 48TH ANNUAL FISHAWACK FESTIVAL JUNE 8TH

On Saturday, June 8th, 2019, Chatham Borough will be hosting its 48th Annual Fishawack Festival, jointly organized by the Chatham Borough Community Department Services and MyChathamNJ. Since 1971, the festival has celebrated the Borough's historical connection with the Lenape Native Americans. Chatham once acted as a welcoming stop for those traveling down the Passaic River, once referred to as "The Fishawack" by the Native Americans for its convenient traveling routes and easily accessible food supply. This annual cultural-heritage festival features live musical performers, local shops, a Kids Fun Zone, a Car Show, and much more to entertain the entire family!

To kick off the start of the festival day, you can relax at our new stage on Grand Lower Lum Field, with performances starting at 10am and ending at 6pm.

One of the most popular attractions for kids offered at Fishawack is the Kids Zone, which has been continuously sponsored by Chatham Asset Management and is open from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m., with giant slide, rock wall, mega obstacle course, water target, and many more!

The Fishawack Festival will be expanding our live acts this year by adding a second performance stage to Grand Lower Lum Field (10 a.m. -6p.m.), in addition to the Gazebo stage (10 a.m. -4 p.m.). The Gazebo stage, sponsored by Mary Weichert and Weichert Realtors, will have seating available surrounding the stage. .

LISA BETZ SWORN IN AS ADVOCATE FOR LOCAL FOSTER YOUTH

Thanks to Lisa Betz, Summit was among 13 municipalities represented by the 15 newest court appointed special advocates tasked with serving as extra eyes and ears for family law judges on the cases of Union County youth removed from their home due to abuse, neglect or abandonment and placed in foster homes or residential facilities. The ceremony was held on April 9, 2019 at the Union County Family Courthouse.

Said Betz, "My husband and I have tried to raise our children with the fundamental belief they are safe, valued and loved. I'm so excited to put my energy into securing that important foundation for other children. This is an opportunity for me to have a positive impact on our wider community by doing something really personal."

After completion of approximately 30 hours' training with Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County, Betz and her classmates took their oath and were sworn in as advocates and judicial volunteers by Superior Court Judge Richard Wischusen. After completion of three hours' court observation to see seasoned CASA volunteers in action, the new advocates will meet their assigned foster youth or siblings.

The new advocates range from age 23 to 66, are parents and nonparents, and work in such fields as education, nonprofit, and law enforcement, as well as homemakers. Most had no prior knowledge of the foster system.

With court-ordered access to foster parents,

doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers, CASA volunteers incorporate their findings into court reports and work to ensure each youth's needs are met and best interests protected. They are a constant during chaos and work to ensure the youth's trauma is not exacerbated in care.

There are approximately 500 Union County youth from birth to age 21 in foster care, and more than 200 are still waiting for their very own CASA volunteer in their corner. Could that be you?

The American Cancer Society Relay For Life of Berkeley Heights, Mountainside, New Providence and Summit will be held on June 15, 2019 at Governor Livingston High School in Berkeley Heights. All are invited to attend the event and participate in the battle against cancer. Join the group to celebrate those who have battled and who continue to battle, remember those lost to this dreadful disease, and fight back to create a world without cancer.

The event begins at 4:30 p.m. with a Survivor Celebration dinner. According to the American Cancer Society, a cancer survivor is born as soon as a person hears the words, "you have cancer." Throughout the night, there are after-hour activities, games, and continuous walking of the track. At sunrise, 6 a.m., the participants will come together for a final moment of reflection at the Closing Ceremony. Local clergy will help close the event and organizers will reveal the amount of money that was earned throughout the night. \$2K SUSTAINABILITY GRANT AWARDED TO THE CITY OF SUMMIT

On May 7, 2019, the City of Summit was awarded a \$2,000 capacity-building grant through the Sustainable Jersey Grants Program funded by the PSEG Foundation. Summit is one of 36 municipalities in New Jersey that has received funding to implement a variety of sustainability projects focused on green infrastructure, park restoration, single-use plastic reduction campaigns, raingardens, environmental resource inventories, green team capacity building and more.

"This grant will enable our municipality to enhance our efforts to track and reduce Summit's carbon footprint and energy use, and better maintain our local parks and hiking trails. Unity Award for Achievement by a NonProfit Organization -- Family Promise/Karen Olson, Founder/President.

Recognition for turning a moment into a national movement.

Karen Olson was rushing to a business meeting when she passed a homeless woman on the street. On impulse, Karen bought her a sandwich. The woman, Millie, accepted the sandwich but asked for Karen for more — a chance to be heard. Karen stayed with Millie and listened. What she heard made her understand that homelessness brought profound feelings of diminished self-worth and disconnection from society. Soon after, Karen and her two sons began delivering lunches to homeless people on the streets of New York.

When Karen learned that homelessness was affecting families right in her own community in New Jersey, she knew she had to do something. But this was much more than giving sandwiches. She brought together people in need and people who wanted to help. Existing community resources could provide shelter, meals, and housing. Volunteers could use their skills, knowledge, and compassion to help their homeless neighbors find employment, reconnect with society, and restore their dignity. Congregations offered hospitality space within their buildings. The YMCA provided showers and a family day center. A car dealer discounted a van.

In 1986, Karen Olson, a single mom in the suburbs, gave up her job at a pharmaceutical

More New Jersey congregations formed a second network. Other congregations joined in. In 1988, Karen formed the National Interfaith Hospitality Network to bring the program nationwide. In addition to shelter, meals, housing, and job-seeking support, the affiliates began developing programs for transitional housing, childcare, and homelessness prevention.

In 2003, they adopted the name Family Promise to reflect their broad range of programs and their vision of ending family homelessness. The name refers to the promise, in the sense of commitment, which communities make to families in need. But it also refers to the promise, the potential, inherent in every family. Family Promise represents a national movement that believes we can address family homelessness right here in our own communities. Today, Family Promise comprises more than 20 affiliates in 43 states and engages 180,000 volunteers nationwide, aiding more than 60,000 family members annually.

Founder Karen Olson's story demonstrates the power of one person to make a difference in the lives of thousands of others. We applaud Karen for taking that first moment to stop and listen, and for turning a local solution to family homelessness into a national movement.
