#### **MUSIC PROGRAM RECEIVES NATIONAL RECOGNITION**

For a second consecutive year, the Westfield Public School District has been named one of the "Best Communities for Music Education" in the nation for its outstanding commitment to music education.

The 2019 Best Communities for Music Education designation is awarded by the National Association of Music Merchants (NAMM) Foundation to districts that demonstrate outstanding achievement in efforts to provide music access and education to all students. The award is based on music class participation, instruction time, facilities, support for the music program, funding, graduation requirements and community musicmaking programs.

"I'm very proud of the music department on receiving this honor for a second year," says Thomas Weber, Supervisor of Visual and Performing Arts for Westfield Public Schools. "It is the support of the Board of Education members, administration, teachers, staff, community and our talented students that make this national recognition possible."

Research into music education continues to demonstrate educational/cognitive and social skill benefits for children who make music.

"I congratulate Mr. Weber and all of our music instructors, conductors, directors and our student musicians for this prestigious recognition," says Superintendent of Schools Dr. Margaret Dolan. "Each year, many of our talented students are recognized for musical honors which is a testament to the hard work of both our student musicians and our dedicated music staff."

Recent recognition of the district's music program include an invitation to the Westfield High School Wind Ensemble to perform at the New Jersey State Band Gala on May 5 at Bridgewater-Raritan High School.

"Each region in the state selects four ensembles to represent them at the state gala event, totaling only 12 bands from all of New Jersey," says WHS band director Christopher Vitale. "This is only the second time in school history that WHS has been invited which is pretty exciting."

After rigorous auditions, 15 WHS choral students were accepted to the New Jersey All-State Chorus. Ninth grader Mia Johnson will perform with the New Jersey All-State Treble Chorus while the following singers will join the New Jersey All-State Mixed Chorus: Juniors Daniel Andrade, Vincent Mora, Lydia Nisita, Elisa Saint-Denis and Rachel Seiden (who scored 2nd in the state); sophomores Luke Barry, Olivia Ebel, Sam Horvath, Zaria Katz, Finn McGurn, Matthew Meixner, Aishik Palit, Elisa Saint-Denis; and freshmen Charles Garretson.

And the WHS Jazz Band recently was invited to play alongside world-renowned saxophonist Jaleel Shaw at the Trumpets Jazz Club in Montclair as part of "Students of Jazz Program," an educational initiative created by the professional jazz band, "One More Once Big Band."

The WHS jazz band played a 30-minute opening set for "One More Once Big Band." "It was a unique experience for our young students to perform in a professional environment," says band director Trevor Sindorf.

## A MAN OF SERVICE: DR. NELSON **NAMED HONORARY GRAND MARSHAL OF MEMORIAL DAY PARADE**

Respected leader. Dedicated service member. Beloved friend. Adored father. Dr. Derrick Nelson, principal of Westfield High School, was a hero—in every sense of the word. His courage, selflessness and integrity inspired the Westfield community and his legacy lives on in the countless lives he touched along the way.

Last month, Dr. Nelson unexpectedly passed away due to complications associated with a stem cell donation in late February. He dedicated his life to his country, to his family, to his students and to those in need. In memory of his service, Dr. Nelson was named Honorary Grand Marshal of Westfield's Memorial Day Parade.

Dr. Nelson's commitment to service began when he enlisted in the Army at 19 years old. He served as an officer in the Army Reserve for more than 20 years and was deployed with the 143rd Expeditionary Sustainment Command to Afghanistan in the summer of 2013. His service earned him the title of Chief Warrant Officer Nelson.

"Dr. Nelson was a true American hero," said WHS Counselor Paul Valenzano. "Whether it was the work he did in education or how he served his country and even the selflessness that led up to this tragedy—all things point to the fact that he was a real American hero."

Service came in all shapes and sizes for Dr. Nelson. Service was fighting for his country and trying to save the life of a young boy he didn't know with his stem cells. Service was also asking for donations to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital instead of gifts for his last birthday. It was calling students into his office simply to ask how they were doing or being there for his colleagues during difficult times. Service was hosting a barbecue for the entire WHS staff at the end of the summer, running with the track team during practices and bonding with students while breaking out his legendary dance moves at prom.

"A selfless gesture can make all the difference in the world to a person," Dr. Nelson said in a 2014 WHS graduation speech. "Most times, being kind to someone can cost you nothing, but it can pay in dividends."

Dr. Nelson's impact is still reverberating through the hallways where he would sing at the top of his lungs after school, through Kehler Stadium where he would ignite the crowd on game days and through his own home where he would make his 5-year-old daughter smile and laugh. Dr. Nelson showed the Westfield community what it means to be a true hero, inspiring others to strive to do the same.

The Westfield Memorial Day Parade is sponsored by the Town of Westfield and the American Legion.

#### REGISTER FOR SUMMER BASEBALL LEAGUE

The Union County Baseball Association invites baseball players between the ages of 8 and 15 to register for its 2019 Summer Youth Baseball League.

All games are played in Warinanco Park, on the border of Elizabeth and Roselle, Monday through Thursday between 9 a.m. and 12 p.m. The games are coached and supervised by Union County Baseball Association staff. The season will begin in late June and end the first week of August.











### PETER AND LISA MCNAMARA PRESENTED UNITY ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Nineteen individuals and four organizations were recognized by the Union County Human Relations Commission at the 18th annual Unity Achievement Award presentation held on Monday, May 6, 2019 at the Kean University STEM Center in Union Township.

The award recipients were nominated and selected for their philanthropic and volunteer efforts, and for fostering and promoting human rights and dignity among the people of Union County.

The mission of the Union County Human Relations Commission is to actively encourage, develop, promote, and strengthen respect for human rights and cultural diversity among the people of Union County.

The following is reprinted from the event's program.

Unity Award for Achievement by a NonProfit Organization -- Liam's Room / Peter and Lisa McNamara

Recognition for inspiring compassionate care and a comfortable environment for the child and family as they deal with difficult medical situations.

When their infant son Liam was dying from a terminal illness, Lisa and Peter McNamara spent countless hours listening to the blips of monitors as fluorescent lights flickered in a sterile hospital room. Bare, oatmeal-colored walls, tile floors and a hard wooden chair constantly reminded the McNamaras where they were and why they were there. The Westfield couple longed for a comfortable space to care for their son Liam, while attending to his fraternal twin, Nathaniel, and older brother, Trevor. As Liam's condition got worse, his visits to Overlook Hospital in Summit became longer and more frequent and the McNamaras talked about ways to carry on his legacy. Liam died in his mother's arms on March 9, 2007. He was 16-months-old.

Today, the room where Liam often stayed, newly outfitted with plush seating, a PlayStation console and murals of beaches and sea life, opened for families dealing with chronically ill

and dying children.

That was the first such room to be dedicated by Liam's Room Inc., a nonprofit initiative started by the McNamaras to increase the quality of life for terminally ill children and provide support to families whose child is faced with a chronic, potentially life-limiting illness. Liam's Room Inc. raised \$150,000 through donations, grants and fundraisers to convert Room 680 from an inpatient hospital room into a comforting space resembling a child's bedroom in a more home-like environment.

Since then, they have renovated two additional rooms -- one at the Goryeb Children's Hospital in Morristown, and one at the K. Hovnanian

Children's Hospital in Neptune. The rooms feature many amenities that could be found in a child's bedroom, as well as space for overnight guests.

These rooms, added to the education of hospital staff on pediatric palliative care, truly incorporate the total care of a child's body, mind, and spirit, and provide support to the entire family unit as they navigate through these uncharted and rough waters. A lovely tribute to Liam, his parents, and siblings.

An average of 3 women per day in the United States are killed as a result of domestic violence.

Thanks to Stephen Wells, Westfield was among 13 municipalities represented by the 15 newest court appointed special advocates tasked with serving as extra eyes and ears for family law judges on the cases of Union County youth removed from their home due to abuse, neglect or abandonment and placed in foster homes or residential facilities. The ceremony was held on April 9, 2019 at the Union County Family Courthouse.

Said Wells, "These children have been disadvantaged from the start; I became a CASA to help the innocent and defenseless, and want to make their world a better place if I can."

After completion of approximately 30 hours' training with Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County, Wells and his classmates took their oath and were sworn in as advocates and judicial volunteers by Superior Court Judge Richard Wischusen. After completion of three hours' court observation to see seasoned CASA volunteers in action, the new advocates will meet their assigned foster youth or siblings.

The new advocates range from age 23 to 66, are parents and nonparents, and work in such fields as education, nonprofit, and law enforcement, as well as homemakers. Most had no prior knowledge of the foster system.

With court-ordered access to foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers, CASA volunteers incorporate their findings into court reports and work to ensure each youth's needs are met and best interests protected. They are a constant during chaos and work to ensure the youth's trauma is not exacerbated in care.

There are approximately 500 Union County youth from birth to age 21 in foster care, and more than 200 are still waiting for their very own CASA volunteer in their corner. Could that be you?

#### **GREEN TEAM AWARDED SUSTAINABILITY GRANT**

Zero Single-Use Plastics Initiative Expanded Through PSEG Foundation Funds

The Westfield Green Team was awarded a \$2,000 Sustainable Jersey capacity-building grant funded by the PSEG Foundation for its recentlylaunched Zero Single Use Plastics initiative, which encourages residents and businesses to choose reusable bags and straws in an effort to help advance sustainability.

At the May 4, 2019 Earth Day event, The Green Team distributed 600 reusable bags and straws directly to residents to kick off this effort. The grant money now allows for the purchase of several hundred more reusable bags and straws to provide to Westfield businesses to distribute to their customers.

"Thanks to the innovative thinking of our Green Team and their partnership with the Downtown Westfield Corporation, this single use plastics reduction initiative in our Downtown businesses will be an important new step in reducing waste and promoting awareness among residents."

Thirty six grants totaling \$200,000 were distributed to municipalities in fifteen New Jersey counties. The grant awards will fund a range of projects including green infrastructure, park single-use plastic reduction restoration, campaigns, raingardens, environmental resource inventories, creative placemaking, green team

capacity building and more.

"From climate change, to water, waste and equity issues, so many of the big sustainability concerns are reaching a crisis point. This investment in sustainability projects will have lasting benefits to New Jersey," said Randall Solomon, executive director for Sustainable Jersey. He extended his congratulations to all of the towns that received grants. "We're seeing exciting results from previous grant projects, and we are looking forward to similarly productive, innovative progress from the current group of awardees," Solomon added.





#### **WESTFIELD TEACHER ANNA CARISSIMO AWARDED PHILHOWER FELLOWSHIP**

Anna Carissimo, a fourth grade teacher at Jefferson Elementary School in Westfield, is the 2019 recipient of the Rotary Club of Westfield's Philhower Fellowship in recognition of outstanding teaching at the elementary school level.

Carissimo received the award on May 7, 2019 as the guest of honor at the Rotary Club luncheon. That evening, she was presented with a resolution from the Westfield Board of Education at its meeting held at Jefferson School. Jefferson principal Dr. Susie Hung described Carissimo as "a positive role model" who is "highly positive and highly enthusiastic." Parents and colleagues sang her praises, while her students sang a song adapted specifically for Carissimo by Jefferson music teacher Wendy Woodfield.

Carissimo began her teaching career in 1997 after graduating from William Paterson University with a bachelor's degree in Sociology and Elementary Education. She taught for three years in California with "amazing teachers and administrators who nurtured my career early on." Homesick for her friends and family in New Jersey, however, Carissimo returned to the Garden State and began teaching at Jefferson School in September of 2000.

Carissimo earned her master's degree in Literacy Education from Montclair State University in 2005 and is currently working toward a second master's in Educational Leadership as part of The College of New Jersey's Regional Training Center (RTC)

program.

In nominating Carissimo, one parent noted the varied experiences, interests and learning styles of 4th graders and praised the fourth grade teacher for "differentiating on a level that is above and beyond, seeing her students as individuals, and insisting they become the best that they can possibly be."

Another nomination letter by fellow Jefferson teachers Tania Bizink and Patricia Merlo, who also spoke at the May 7 board meeting, called the 2019 Philhower recipient "undoubtedly the face, heart, and future of Jefferson" who is "well deserving of such an honor." Other letters noted her warm smile, dedicated work ethic, and her willingness to serve beyond the classroom in organizing an afterschool STEAM program and as Jefferson's Safety Patrol coordinator.

Carissimo also credits her Jefferson School family, including Bizink and Merlo who she called "strong, inspiring educators who are my lifelong friends." "The teachers and staff of Jefferson School, each and every one of them are truly amazing people. My recognition is a direct result of their constant support."

The Philhower Fellowship was established in 1993 by the Rotary Club to honor former Westfield Rotarian Charles Philhower and to recognize the importance of teaching in the elementary grades. An educator for more than 50 years, Charles Philhower, who died in 1962, was supervising principal (superintendent) of Westfield schools for three decades as well as cofounder and past president of the Rotary Club of Westfield.



#### **WESTFIELD MENTAL HEALTH COMMISSION DECLARES MUNICIPALITY A STIGMA-FREE ZONE**

According to the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI), stigma harms the 1 in 5 Americans affected by mental health conditions by shaming them into silence and preventing them from seeking help. At the May 7, 2019 Westfield Town Council meeting, Mayor Brindle issued a proclamation declaring Westfield a Stigma-Free Zone, which is intended to help pave the way for residents to get the mental health resources they need without judgment.

"Our goal here is to create an environment where residents will feel free to seek treatment for the disease of mental illness without the fear of being stigmatized," said Brindle. "I'm grateful to our Mental Health Commission for spearheading this effort as part of a larger conversation to shift the social and systemic barriers for those living with mental health conditions."

Formed in late 2018, the Mental Health Commission is tasked with the creation of a comprehensive mental health support system for the Westfield community that promotes lifelong mental wellness, educates the public, and ensures access to available resources. It is comprised of a Steering Committee and resident volunteers with a variety of backgrounds and a common interest in facilitating these goals.


