



The regular monthly Fanwood Borough Council meeting on May 20, 2019 was highlighted by tributes to many causes and public servants including our police and EMS.

Police Week was marked by awards by Police Chief Richard Trigo to these officers:

- Off. Michael Rusin for cracking a check fraud scheme that led to multiple arrests in Paterson of suspects including one wanted for murder
- Off. Michael Rusin and Elliot Bernard for their work in our local schools in anti-bullying and safe driving programs and in a program instructing young people how to respond to police during traffic stops so everyone stays safe
- Off. Dan Kranz and Dan Piccola for participating in a County drug enforcement effort that steered drug offenders directly to treatment instead of jail
- Sgt. Marc Gottlick for keeping the information kiosk at the Quik Check stocked

with pamphlets and educational information

National EMS Week recognized the Fanwood Rescue Squad for their volunteer work since 1948. Squad president Ed Winsor made remarks.

Citizens of the Month were Memorial Day Parade Grand Marshalls Joe Schott and Joe Murano, both Fanwood residents and WWII veterans. Joe Schott received the traditional print of the historic Fanwood Train station at the meeting. Joe Murano, unable to make the meeting, received his earlier in the day at his home at the Chelsea independent living residence. It was presented by Mayor Colleen Mahr and Councilwoman Kathy Mitchell.

Mayor Mahr also recognized representatives from Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense for National Gun Violence Awareness Day and welcomed a cancer survivor who spoke about support for metastatic cancer research for National Cancer Research Month.




#### SCOTCH PLAINS-FANWOOD HIGH SCHOOL GOLF **TEAM WINS UNION COUNTY TOURNAMENT**

#### SOCIAL JUSTICE MATTERS PRESENTED WITH UNITY ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Nineteen individuals and four organizations were recognized by the Union County Human Relations Commission at the 18th annual Unity Achievement Award presentation held on Monday, May 6, 2019 at the Kean University STEM Center in Union Township.

The award recipients were nominated and selected for their philanthropic and volunteer efforts, and for fostering and promoting human rights and dignity among the people of Union County.

The mission of the Union County Human Relations Commission is to actively encourage, develop, promote, and strengthen respect for human rights and cultural diversity among the people of Union County.

The following is reprinted from the event's program.

Social Justice Matters -- Judge Leland McGee and Rabbi Joel Abraham - Recognition for its outstanding and extensive outreach to improve communication and relationships within the community.

Social Justice Matters (SJM) is a local grassroots organization in the Scotch Plains/Fanwood communities that was inspired in 2009 when an offensive and potentially inflammatory flyer was distributed on the lawns and driveways of local residents. Members of the community engaged in small group discussions about individual backgrounds and feelings about race. Following a group discussion, they decided the discussion should continue. SJF was born to ensure that this ugly seed would not have fertile

soil in which to grow.

Social Justice Matters is committed to exploring the values and opportunities arising from these diverse communities, and to work together to foster equity, challenge racism, and achieve greater social justice.

Led by Judge Leland McGee and Rabbi Joel Abraham, the organization works to bring Scotch Plains and Fanwood residents of various races and religious backgrounds together, to actively inquire into matters of race in our society, to communicate in a way that promotes tolerance and heals injustice, and to work toward an equitable community.

Social Justice Matters provides a public forum for residents to hold these vital conversations, voice community concerns, and facilitate truthful and meaningful discussions and actions about race and related topics.


One of the organization's most visible contributions can be witnessed in the aftermath of offensive graffiti at the Scotch Plains Fanwood High School in October 2018. Both Judge McGee and Rabbi Abraham worked to address the issue, calm the community, and bring the community together to prevent this from happening in the future. They outreached with mayors, other local clergy, and worked closely with local and county law enforcement officials. High school students also invited them to speak at a student-organized rally against hate presentation.

Through the years, during and after unfortunate local and national events that threaten

to polarize us and pull our community apart, Social Justice Matters, through the ongoing dedication, commitment, and tireless efforts of Judge McGee and Rabbi Abraham, have pulled the community together and provided a safe haven for difficult talk and forthright action.



#### YWCA UNION COUNTY HONORS EIGHT ALLIES

The YWCA Union County honored eight individuals and organizations for their committed effort on behalf of domestic violence survivors during their Annual Meeting held at the Clark Public Library on April 25, 2019.

Each honoree received a certificate and resolution in their name for their partnership in empowering survivors of domestic violence throughout the county. The honorees were Theresa Cosmas; Sgt. Mahasin El-Amin; Ryan & Dana Felmet; First Presbyterian Church of Cranford; Garden State Bank: A division of New York Community Bank; Annette Ferrigno, Kids For Kids: A Mindfulness Movement; Gail Veltre, Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital, Rahway – Barnabas Health; and Lauren Thorne.

The YWCA's mission is eliminating racism, empowering women, and promoting peace, justice, freedom and dignity for all. Locally, the YWCA Union County is on a mission to

empower survivors of domestic violence to become safe and free from abuse through comprehensive, client-centered services, and through education, collaboration and advocacy that builds safe, informed and supportive communities.

It is estimated that 1 in every 4 women will be affected by domestic violence in her life- more than breast cancer, lung cancer, and ovarian cancer combined. The monetary cost of domestic violence in the United States in dollars has been estimated to exceed 9.3 billion a year in medical and mental health services, loss of productivity, and loss of paid earnings. An average of 3 women per day in the United States are killed as a result of domestic violence.
