





On May 23, 2019, the Berkeley Heights Communities Council (NJCCC) at the 16th management efforts, including litter clean ups. Annual Clean Communities Conference held at the Nassau Inn in Princeton, NJ.

The Volunteer Award is one of NJCCC's Stewardship of Public Lands Awards that recognizes outstanding efforts to promote clean communities by engaging volunteers in clean ups of public lands. Most of the members never had a chance to go to prom because people think it's not important to us. But it is."






