

TOWNSHIP BREAKS GROUND ON NEW ARTHUR LEWIS PARK

Green Brook Township celebrated the groundbreaking of end and it is so fitting that this park will bear his name. The its new Arthur Lewis Park on May 22, 2019 with representatives from the Township Committee, the Somerset County Board of Chosen Freeholders, Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital Somerset and members of the Arthur Lewis Family. The park is on the 11-acre site of the former Green Brook Swim Club. The new park will include playgrounds for all ages, a large spray park, fitness court, renovated basketball and handball courts, a new sand volleyball court and pavilion and is expected to be open this

The Somerset County Board of Chosen Freeholders recently approved special open space funding of \$1.5 million for the creation of Arthur Lewis Park. In addition to the park development funding, the Board of Chosen Freeholders contributed funding for the purchase of the property in 2017.

Freeholder Deputy Director Patricia Walsh, former Green Brook Mayor and long time resident, spoke about the park's namesake, Arthur Lewis, who was one of the founding members of the former Green Brook Swim Club, was a former Mayor of Green Brook and was involved in and served in leadership positions for many local organizations such as the Green Brook Lions Club and Green Brook Seniors. "He was a true gentleman and one of the most giving and enthusiastic members of our community, right up to the

park will be a true gem in Green Brook and will serve County residents well with active recreational opportunities."

Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital Somerset, an RWJBarnabas Health facility, has donated \$70,000 to the Township of Green Brook to sponsor the National Fitness Campaign's Fitness CourtTM in the new park. The Fitness Court is a free outdoor gym that features exercise equipment for circuit training and digital fitness challenges. In addition to sponsoring the Fitness Court, the hospital plans to hold exercise classes and healthy food demonstrations throughout the year.

"We are committed to promoting the health of our communities and are proud to sponsor this new Fitness Court to make it easier for people to exercise and lead a healthy, active lifestyle," said Tony Cava, president and chief executive officer of Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital Somerset.

Mayor Patrick Boccio, on behalf of the Green Brook Township Committee, thanked those attending the groundbreaking ceremony and expressed gratitude to the Freeholders and the Hospital for their generous support. "Arthur Lewis Park will be a one-of-a kind recreational destination for Green Brook, the County and beyond."


GIRL SCOUTS HOST ANNUAL DANCE

REGISTER NOW FOR TEEN CERT TRAINING

The county Office of Emergency Management is accepting applications for the 2019 Teen CERT course to be held at the Somerset County Emergency Services Training Academy, July 8 through 12, 2019.

Teen CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) is a national Homeland Security initiative directed at making schools and communities safer by having educated and trained youth capable of preparing and responding to disasters and emergencies. Teen CERT is an integral part of the Citizen Corps Program, which emphasizes making our communities and our nation safer, stronger and better prepared.

It takes about 30 hours to complete the Somerset County Teen CERT program, but the critical skills you learn will last your entire life. During the training you will learn to:

• Extinguish small fires.

- Identify and anticipate hazards.
- Reduce fire hazards in the home and workplace.
- Help reduce survivor stress.
- Assist emergency responders.
- Assist those who are injured.
- Set up medical treatment areas.
- Conduct light search and rescue.

Teens entering grades 9 through 12 are welcome to apply. Participants must attend all classes to receive a certificate of completion. Registration is first come, first served, with a maximum of 25 students.

VR/AR GOGGLES AT FELDKIRCHNER SCHOOL

Thanks to a generous grant from Green Brook Education and Athletic association, technology students from Mrs. Jennifer Collett's technology class can now experience the world through Virtual Reality/Augmented Reality goggles. VR allows students to explore the world virtually while AR brings abstract concepts to life.

Mrs. Collett can now take students on over 700 virtual reality field trips everywhere from the International Space Station to the Galapagos Islands. The expeditions are a collection of linked virtual reality content and supporting materials that can be used alongside of existing curriculum.

VR and AR technology allows Mrs. Collett to guide her students through a collection of 360-degree scenes and 3D objects, pointing out interesting sites and artifacts along the way. The goggles help students visualize information in a new way, and this will positively impact their ability to retain information.

Along with the goggles, she also received a 360-degree camera. Along with the application, she can have her students build their own virtual-reality field trip and empower her students to create their own immersive tour.



CASA SHAW SEEKING **ADVOCATES FOR FOSTER YOUTH**

Court Appointed Special Advocates of Somerset, Hunterdon and Warren Counties (CASA SHaW) has announced Information Sessions in July for individuals in our community who are interested in learning more about becoming a CASA volunteer advocate.

CASA SHaW is part of a statewide network of community-based, non-profit programs that recruit, screen, train and supervise volunteers to "Speak Up for a Child" removed from home due to abuse or neglect. CASA is the only program in New Jersey that uses trained volunteers to work one-on-one with children, ensuring that each one gets the services needed and achieves permanency in a safe, nurturing home.

"Attending an information session is the first step in becoming a CASA volunteer advocate for a foster child who has been abused and neglected. This is where individuals learn about what it takes to become volunteer," said Tracey Heisler, Executive Director of CASA SHaW. Attending an Information Session is required for anyone interested in applying to become a CASA.



WHRHS DOES FETCHING PERFORMANCE OF 'FIDDLER ON THE ROOF'

When audiences attended the four MacKrell as Avram, The Merchant; Summer performances of the Watchung Hills Regional High School (WHRHS) Spring Musical, "Fiddler on the Roof," they were treated to a fetching performance in which the actors, actresses, singers and dancers personified the characters of a poor, largely Jewish neighborhood of a farming village in 1905 Russia.

The Fiddler Cast, Orchestra, And Crew
