SHERRY KEYT FINISHED 1ST AT KOMEN RACE FOR THE CURE

Two Union County residents took home 1st place medals at the Susan G. Komen North Jersey Race for the Cure on Sunday May 5, 2019, at Liberty State Park in Jersey City. Mountainside resident Ken Wigg, 50, crossed the finish line with the fastest time of 21 minutes and 39 seconds, taking 1st place overall, and winning the 1st place medal in the Men's Division for the USATF Certified Timed 5K Run.

Sherry Keyt, 53, of New Providence, a breast cancer survivor, took home the 1st place Gold Medal in the Survivor's Division after crossing the finish line in 24 minutes and 53 seconds. This was Keyt's 6th Komen North Jersey Race for the Cure medal; she took 1st place in the Survivor's Division in 2012, 2013, 2015, and 2018; and came in 2nd in 2014.

In spite of the heavy rain, an estimated 1,000 people braved the weather to come to Liberty State Park and participate in the annual event, which raises money for the fight against breast cancer.

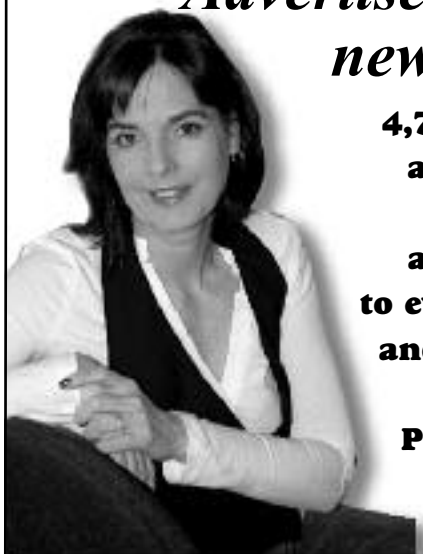

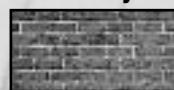

Ten year old Ethan Ocwieja, a 4th grader at the Allen W. Roberts Elementary School in New Providence, received 2nd place in the 2019 Little Mozarts Music Competition, part of the Crescendo International Competition, for his performance of Allegro by J.H. Fiocco. This earned him a spot to perform in the Winner's Recital at Weill Hall in Carnegie Hall in New York on May 17, 2019.

The Crescendo Competition is an annual music competition held throughout the New York Tri-State area, Pennsylvania, Massachusetts, California, Washington, Michigan, Minnesota, Canada, Italy, Russia, and South Korea. Junior, intermediate, and advanced levels for all instrumentalists, vocalists, and duet groups competed.

In 2018, more than 5000 applicants competed and only first and second place

winners of regional competitions are invited to perform at a recital at one of a few prestigious worldwide Winners Recital concert halls.

Ethan began studying violin at four years old with Halina Listopad from Wharton Institute for the Performing Arts and is currently studying with Jisun Kang, who has degrees from Manhattan School of Music and the Juilliard School.

JANET SMITH BECOMES A FOSTER CHILD ADVOCATE

New Providence resident Janet Smith is among the newest class of Court Appointed Special Advocate volunteers tasked with serving as extra eyes and ears for family law judges on cases of Union County youth removed from home due to abuse, neglect or abandonment and now living in foster homes or residential facilities.

"I've been involved in various aspects of community service through the years but full-time work and parenting restricted my ability to get more involved. With more time now, I'm looking forward to working with the dedicated

CASA staff and other volunteers to help determine the best environment where children will feel the safety and love they all deserve. If I can make a difference for just one child, becoming a CASA will have been the right choice for me!" said Smith.

After completion of approximately 30 hours' training with Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County, she and classmates assembled at the Union County Family Courthouse to take their oath as advocates and judicial volunteers from Superior Court Judges Marc Brown and Richard Wischusen.

The new advocate class ranges from ages 28 to 61, are both parents and nonparents, and lines of work that include education, legal, real estate pharmaceuticals and freelancing. Most had no prior knowledge of the foster system. Smith's classmates include David Bernot and Andrea

Dudley, both of Union, Rich Leahey of Cranford, Ona Ndupu of Hillside, Vicki Racelis of Rahway and Susan Ruszala of Scotch Plains.

After three hours' court observation to see seasoned CASA volunteers in action, each of the advocates will meet their assigned foster youth. With court-ordered access to foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers, CASA volunteers incorporate their findings into court reports and work to ensure each youth's needs are met and best interests protected. They are a constant during chaos and work to ensure the youth's trauma is not exacerbated in care.

There are approximately 500 Union County youth from birth to age 21 in foster care, and more than 200 still need their very own CASA volunteer, someone in their corner. Is that you?

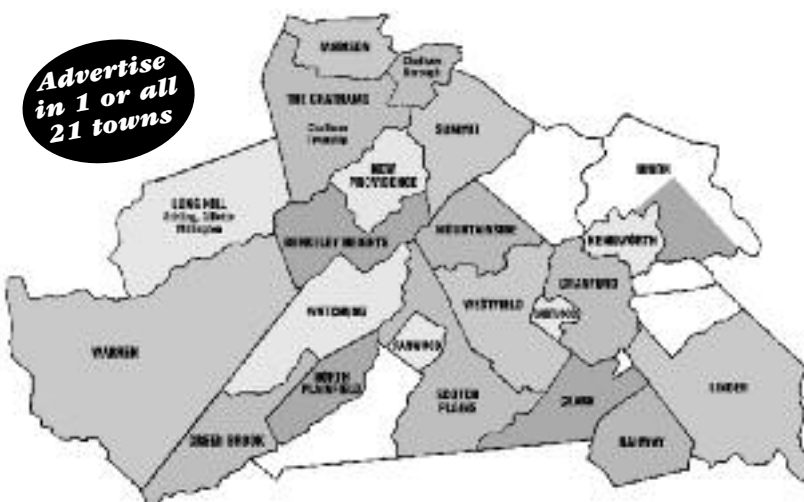
