#### **MEET THE RESCUE SQUAD' CAROLYN SORGE**

Carolyn Sorge basically grew up at the Scotch rescue squad her second family. Plains Rescue Squad. Her father, Ercole Sorge, joined in 1973 after Carolyn suffered a febrile seizure in his arms. He served as president for 15 years and rode on the squad until his passing in 1988.

Carolyn officially joined the squad in July of 1988 at the age of 15. "I grew up seeing first hand my father's passion for this rescue squad and this community. It makes me proud to follow in his footsteps and continue his legacy," she says. Her brother, Ed, also rode on the squad for a number of years and is now a full-time paramedic. Another brother, Christian, was also a member of the Cadet Corps.

During her 31 years on the rescue squad, she has served as a first and second lieutenant, a deputy chief and today is the chief. Along with the myriad of responsibilities that go along with this position, she is also a mother to 2 1/2 year old Isabella and works full-time as a registered nurse.

Carolyn considers herself a true "townie." While attending nursing school, she worked as a secretary to the Mayor and Municipal Manager, and in the early 2000s, she was elected to the Scotch Plains Township Council where she served four years; the last year as Deputy Mayor.

She also joined the Scotch Plains Fire Department in 1997 and had the distinction of being the first female firefighter in the history of the department. She served eight years there.

"Being a member of the squad gives me a feeling of personal satisfaction that I'm helping my community," she said. She also loves being there for people at their most vulnerable times and, in addition, is thankful for the lifelong friendships she has developed throughout her years serving. #### **MEET JOAN LOZOWSKI OF THE SCOTCH PLAINS RESCUE SQUAD**

Joan Lozowski joined the Scotch Plains Rescue Squad in November of 1988 at the age of 26. At the time, she was a police dispatcher with the Scotch Plains Police Department (retiring in 2016) and knew how shorthanded the squad was during the day, so she decided to help out. Joan has now been riding for 31 years and has held several positions including captain, 1st and 2nd lieutenant and delegate.

"I like the camaraderie we have and the squad is a second family to me. We support each other through good calls as well as bad and are there for each other," says Joan.

One of her most unusual calls came on a

Sunday afternoon in the middle of summer about two years ago. She had just finished playing golf and went to meet up with a township police officer who needed an oxygen mask for her first aid kit. While together, the officer was dispatched to a house fire and Joan decided to head over as well to see if she could be of any assistance.

When she arrived, she saw a small dog being taken to an unmarked car by a lieutenant. The dog had been pulled out of the house, and when the officer saw Joan, he asked her to care for the dog, whose owners weren't home at the time.


The dog was hot and listless, so she gave him oxygen and, with the help of some residents who brought over water and ice, she slowly cooled the dog down. This went on for a while until the resident came home. Fortunately, by that time, the dog was starting to respond. Afterwards, the owner brought the dog to the vet and he was eventually deemed fine.

Squad members are never sure what they'll

find when arriving to calls and are trained to respond to all kinds of health crises. Although saving an animal is not something EMTs normally do, Joan stepped up and did the right thing.

Joan also volunteers with the Fanwood Rescue Squad and Friends of Valley Brook, an organization that assists 64 veterans living at Valley Brook Village on the grounds of the VA Hospital in Lyons, NJ. She helps with barbecues and other events and recently, with a friend's assistance, cooked a corned beef and cabbage dinner for St. Patrick's Day. She loves giving her time to the vets. "They served our country; it is my honor to help them," says Joan.





The theme of the event, "Sowing the Seeds of Literacy", reflected how tutors cultivate a positive learning environment in which students grow their skills and achieve important personal and professional goals. Literacy NJ tutors help adults improve their language skills, enabling them to find better jobs, advocate for their children at school, earn a high school diploma, and/or prepare for college.

ESL students Ioannis Petrou and Flor Barrera spoke about their increased confidence



communicating with customers, teachers, doctors, and friends. Charles Baldwin thanked his tutors for giving him his life back by teaching him to read, and HSE student Shawn Boatswain described his journey from a small Caribbean island to earning a Master's Degree from Kean University.

Literacy New Jersey offers tutoring to adult residents of Union County in three areas: basic

reading and writing, English as a Second Language, and preparation for the High School Equivalency exam. Tutors choose an area of interest and then typically volunteer two hours a week, working with a small group of students.

Jane Randall, an immigrant from Scotland who met her husband overseas then moved to the U.S after World War II to raise a family, celebrated her 100th birthday at her home at The Chelsea at Fanwood on Thursday, July 18th, 2019.

Mrs. Randall spent her childhood and young adult life in and around Edinburgh, raised by an aunt and uncle. After graduating high school she learned to use adding machines called comptometers, the first mechanical calculators that were actually invented in the U.S. in the late 19th century. She became experienced enough to teach young women how to use them. She later worked as an accountant at a brewery. She has

vivid memories of being on the roof of the building where they worked to wave at the royal family when they came to town, especially Queen Elizabeth II wearing her signature bonnet.

She met her husband Ronald, a U.S. soldier stationed in the UK, and they moved to the states, settling first in Chicago and eventually ending up in Cranford, NJ. She enjoyed living there and was active in the Episcopal church. She volunteered for 30 years at a local resale shop.

Mrs. Randall had four children. She has six grandchildren and two great grandchildren. Her family celebrated her birthday separately. Her Chelsea friends celebrated with a cake and music.


