





Research from mentor.org shows that mentors



SUMMIT POLICE DEPARTMENT OFFERING WOMEN'S SELF —DEFENSE CLASS ON AUGUST 8

The Summit Police Department is offering a Fight Back self-defense class for women in grades nine and older on Thursday, August 8, 2019 from 6 to 8:30 p.m. at Lawton C. Johnson Summit Middle School.

Led by Summit Police Officer and John H. Stamler Police Academy physical training instructor Donald DeFilippis, the free course is appropriate for all ability levels and will focus on useful defense techniques, and situational awareness skills.

"The Fight Back course is an excellent opportunity for women in our community high school age and older to gain practical and important defense skills to help avoid situations where assaults can occur," explains Summit Police Chief Robert Weck. "It is not just about the best way to fight off an attacker—although we teach ways to respond when physically attacked—it is about learning how to effectively handle things that happen in everyday life."

Lessons will focus on assessing risk from acquaintances, overcoming emotional barriers in acknowledging danger, and engaging in effective verbal and physical self-defense when necessary.

Chief Weck continues: "The goal of the course is for participants to come away with an awareness and confidence that will keep them safe. If you are in town and available on August 8, I strongly encourage you to bring a friend or family member and take this course."

There is a plan to hold a self-defense class for middle school-age girls during the next school year.

COMMAND PERFORMANCE: IAN DRAKE RETURNS TO THE SUMMIT LIBRARY FOR A NEW EXPLORE YOUR WORLD PROGRAM

The Summit Free Public Library is thrilled to welcome back Professor Ian Drake, an Associate Professor at Montclair University, for a new sixweek course in the popular Explore Your World series covering Western Political Thinkers from the Ancients to the Moderns. Covering Plato, Machiavelli, Hobbes, Locke, Rousseau, Mill, and Marx, the six-week minicourse highlights some of the most important political thinkers and writers in history.

The first week of the course will examine Plato's concept of state using his The Republic as a jumping off point for the lesson and class discussion. The second week will examine Machiavelli's Rules for Living. The third week transitions into a review of Hobbes and Locke and their views on human nature. The following week will cover Rousseau and his return to the ancients, looking at his Discourse on the Origin of Inequality. In week five, John Stuart Mill and the concept of utilitarianism and liberty will be examined. The course wraps up with a look at Marx's 'withering away of the state' aka Marx's 'Endstate', with a nod to Lenin's speech on "Democracy" and Dictatorship.

The free course will be held from 10 a.m. – 12 p.m. and runs on consecutive Fridays from September 13 - October 18. Professor Ian Drake is an Associate Professor of Political Science and Law. His course last fall on the Supreme Court drew rave reviews from participants and kicked off the library's successful Explore Your World program. Seating is limited. For those looking for less than a six week commitment, the library is offering a single session class with instructor Bruce Tucker of Rutgers Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI) on American's Foreign Intervention: Afghanistan. The 9/11 attacks, which precipitated the US invasion of Afghanistan, has resulted in 18 years of undeclared war with what appears to be no clear end in sight. While the class may not provide any clear solutions and certainly no easy answers to this nearly two decades long foreign intervention, the class will provide background and context and provide an opportunity for



SUMMIT STUDENT STUDIES IN CHINA ON U.S. DEPARTMENT OF STATE NSLI-Y SCHOLARSHIP

Jack Quinn, a high school student in Summit, New Jersey, is studying Mandarin in China for the summer through a National Security Language Initiative for Youth (NSLI-Y) scholarship. NSLI-Y is a program of the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs.

Jack, competitively selected out of over 3,300 applications from across the United States, is one of approximately 660 students who will study Arabic, Chinese, Hindi, Indonesian, Korean, Persian, Russian, or Turkish overseas this coming year. While in China, Jack is receiving formal language instruction, living with a host family, and experiencing the local culture as part of an immersion environment.

Jack went to Nanjing, China on June 27 and will return mid-August. Prior to leaving, Jack expressed his excitement to participate in the program, "I was very fortunate to discover the program. I will be living with a Chinese family, taking classes at Nanjing University, volunteering at a local orphanage and much more. I expect to materially improve my Mandarin Chinese and aspire to become fluent."

NSLI-Y is part of a multi-agency U.S.

Government initiative launched in 2006 to improve Americans' ability to communicate in select critical languages, to advance international dialogue, and increase American economic global competitiveness. Many NSLI-Y alumni go on to pursue education and careers vital to U.S. national security and credit the program experience with helping them improve their academic, leadership, and cross-cultural communication skills.

NSLI-Y is administered by American Councils for International Education in cooperation with AFS-USA, American Cultural Exchange Service, AMIDEAST, iEARN-USA, the Russian American Foundation, Stony Brook University, the University of Delaware, and the University of Wisconsin.

Applications for 2020-21 NSLI-Y programs are expected to be available at nsliforyouth.org in the late summer. The U.S. Department of State conducts study abroad programs for over 1,000 American high school students and approximately 3,000 foreign high school students each year.
