DAVID CONE HUMANITARIAN AWARDED TO GIOVANNA PSOLKA

A Westfield resident for almost 20 years, Giovanna Psolka is being honored with the David Cone 2019 Humanitarian Award for her years of service and dedication at The David Cone Celebrity Charity Golf Classic to benefit the Ed Lucas Foundation on Monday, August 19, 2019, at Brooklake Country Club in Florham Park, NJ.

Giovanna moved to Westfield in 2000 and immediately immersed herself in the community. She joined the Westfield Welcome Club which is "dedicated to providing an inviting, friendly, and diverse environment in which to enjoy our beautiful community," and eventually served as the fundraising chairwoman to help raise \$2,600 for the Westfield Volunteer Rescue Squad in 2003. Giovanna's three children went through the Westfield school system where she volunteered to help the elementary students create art projects on various occasions. She even served as the fundraising co-chair of the Westfield High School Marching Band for a couple of years and raised money to buy new uniforms.

While working at Ernst & Young, Giovanna volunteered for 12 years as the AccessAbilities Employee Professional Resource Network Leader, developing programs to raise awareness and provide guidance on workplace issues for the special needs community. Each year she led efforts for Disability Employment Awareness Month in October, running a student shadowing program during which she met Emmy-winning sports reporter Ed Lucas. Lucas is blind, and founded the Ed Lucas Foundation, a 501 (C) (3) non-profit organization that offers financial support to the blind/visually impaired and others living with a disability.

"Giovanna has been my "go to" person and is an invaluable asset to the Ed Lucas Foundation," said Ed Lucas. "Her dedication and work ethic in assisting me is truly remarkable. I can think of no one more deserving of this award."

Giovanna currently serves as the Director of Development, Marketing, Social Media and Website Manager of the Ed Lucas Foundation. She is also an Executive Committee Member of the annual David Cone Celebrity Charity Golf

The Greater Westfield Chapter of UNICO National invited Cranford resident Will DeGregorio and his mother Kara Shields to their June meeting. In April, Westfield UNICO hosted a flapjack breakfast fundraiser at Clark Applebee's to help cover some of the medical expenses associated with Will's cancer diagnosis. In 2012, a 3 year old Will was diagnosed with Adrenal Cancer and survived, only to learn in 2018 of a new tumor on his pelvis called Osteosarcoma. He recently endured intensive chemotherapy before and after his major surgery, where the team resected a large portion of his hip bone.

After testing it was discovered that Will has Li-Fraumeni Syndrome. This syndrome is a rare hereditary disorder that predisposes carriers to

cancer development. This means Will is susceptible to tumor growth, which is why every year for the rest of his life he will endure a full body scan.

Happily Will returned into his 4th grade classroom and is an avid sports enthusiast. He likes to play basketball and baseball and his favorite teams are the New York Yankees, Giants and Rangers.

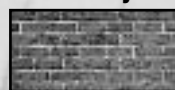

ANDY SKIBITSKY, CHRIS RYAN NAMED TO CASA OF UNION COUNTY BOARD

Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County welcomed former Westfield Mayor Andy Skibitsky and Chris Ryan, also of

CASA of Union County is a nonprofit organization that recruits, trains, supervises and supports community volunteers to advocate for abused, neglected and abandoned Union County children removed from home and placed in foster care or residential facilities. There are more than 500 Union County children in foster care, and the organization currently serves just over half. Its mission is to be able to provide an advocate for every youth in care.

Skibitsky has spent his career in the animal health industry, with more than 30 years at Merck Animal Health in sales management, operations and marketing, and he currently heads a team focused on solutions for nonprofit animal welfare organizations nationwide. Skibitsky's public service posts include 15 years as an elected official in Westfield — with more than 12 of those as mayor, more than any other in the colonial town's 225-year history. He has chaired its Public Safety, Transportation and Parking Committee and Public Works Committee. He was inducted into the New Jersey Mayors Hall of Fame in 2015. A graduate of Rider College with a Bachelor's of Science, Skibitsky and his wife have four children.

"Friends who have volunteered for CASA," said Skibitsky, "have said it was a very rewarding experience. Really, what could be more fulfilling than protecting our most vulnerable children?"

Ryan, an adjunct professor at Seton Hall University, teaches international marketing to business school students. Prior to academia, Ryan spent more than two decades with international wine importer Dreyfus, Ashby & Co., ultimately serving as president and chief executive officer. He has helped create several successful brands and adjusted the marketing of others to meet market trends and the evolving taste profile of the American consumer. Ryan earned a Bachelor's degree and a Master's degree in Business Administration from Manhattan College. He and his wife have two grown daughters and have called Westfield home more than 35 years.

Of his appointment to the board, Ryan noted, "At the end of the day it is all about our children — each and every one deserves the opportunity to be happy and content. CASA strives to make that happen every day with children who, unfortunately and through no fault of their own, have the odds stacked against them."

CASA volunteers have court-ordered access to foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers, and work to ensure a child's best interests remain a priority while in care, and working toward a safe, stable and permanent home for each child. More community volunteers are needed to step up as advocates for children waiting for their own CASA volunteer. 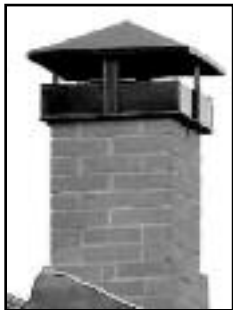

In July, a night of celebration and recognition was held for Literacy New Jersey’s volunteer tutors at the Westfield Presbyterian Church. Over sixty tutors were recognized for years of service working with adults in Union County who struggle with reading, writing, and speaking English.

The theme of the event, “Sowing the Seeds of Literacy”, reflected how tutors cultivate a positive learning environment in which students grow their skills and achieve important personal and professional goals. Literacy NJ tutors help adults improve their language skills, enabling them to find better jobs, advocate for their children at school, earn a high school diploma, and/or prepare for college.

ESL students Ioannis Petrou and Flor Barrera spoke about their increased confidence

communicating with customers, teachers, doctors, and friends. Charles Baldwin thanked his tutors for giving him his life back by teaching him to read, and HSE student Shawn Boatwain described his journey from a small Caribbean island to earning a Master’s Degree from Kean University.

Literacy New Jersey offers tutoring to adult residents of Union County in three areas: basic reading and writing, English as a Second Language, and preparation for the High School Equivalency exam. Tutors choose an area of interest and then typically volunteer two hours a week, working with a small group of students.

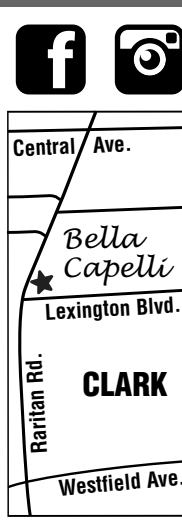

ANTHONY TILLER APPOINTED FIRE CHIEF

Anthony Tiller has been named Westfield Fire Chief, effective July 1, 2019. Town Administrator Jim Gildea made the recommendation, which received the consent of the Mayor and the unanimous approval of the Town Council.

“Chief Tiller is a superb public servant whose exceptional character, experience and commitment are tremendous assets to Westfield,” said Brindle. “I am thrilled to announce this well-deserved appointment of one of Westfield’s own, and am confident his values reflect those of our outstanding Fire Department and the community at large.”

“It’s an honor to accept this role and to be entrusted by the Mayor and Town Council to lead the dedicated public servants in our Fire Department,” said Tiller. “I remain committed to upholding the highest standards of performance and integrity, and continuing to build upon our community engagement with the residents of Westfield.”

Chief Tiller joined the Westfield Fire

Department as a volunteer in 1993, and was appointed as a paid firefighter in 1997. He was subsequently promoted to the rank of Lieutenant in 2004, Battalion Chief in 2015, and Deputy Chief in 2016 prior to being named Acting Fire Chief in March 2019. During his three years as Deputy Chief, Tiller was involved in every aspect of fire department operations for both emergency and non-emergency events. Previously, Tiller also worked for the Westfield Department of Public Works as a Laborer from 1994 through 1997.

Chief Tiller also currently holds the position of Fire Official for the Town of Westfield, responsible for supervision of the Fire Prevention Bureau, as well as scheduling and conducting inspections in accordance with the Uniform Fire Safety Act of New Jersey.

In addition to his duties with the Town of Westfield, Chief Tiller had been an Instructor in the Union County Fire Academy from 2007 to 2016. He is a 1986 graduate of Westfield High School and resides in Town.

BICYCLE PATROLS IMPLEMENTED

Westfield Police Chief Christopher Battiloro has announced the implementation of bicycle patrols on Wednesday, July 2, 2019 – the opening night of Westfield’s Sweet Sounds Downtown Music Festival.

Bicycle patrol officers will be now deployed for large public events in Westfield’s Central Business District, such as the music festival, streets fairs, and road races. They will also be deployed at other times of peak activity, such as nights and weekends during the summer months.

The bicycle patrol officers will be charged with enforcing parking statutes and municipal ordinances, keeping the peace, and ensuring the safe passage of pedestrians, as well as interacting with the members of the community.

“Since assuming the position of Chief of Police, it has been my foremost priority to improve police/community relations,” stated Chief Battiloro. “The intent of the bicycle patrol is to do just that,” he added.

ROTARY HONORS DR. NELSON AND AWARDS SCHOLARSHIPS

The Rotary Club of Westfield, NJ hosted their annual Scholarship Luncheon in June. This year \$99,000 was awarded to 18 students, which included awards ranging from \$2,000 to \$15,000. This is the largest scholarship program in Westfield. The Rotary Club interviews and selects students for their scholarships plus other programs in town which include funds administered by The Westfield Foundation. Several benefactors have created funds to help students achieve their goals. Every student who applies is interviewed. The Chairman of the Rotary Club Foundation is Phil Salerno and the chair of the Foundation Scholarship committee is Carl Peer, Esq.

Members of the scholarship committee include: Jayson Astel, Tony LaPorta, Mary Ellen O'Boyle, and Deidre Gelinne. The Executive Director for the Westfield Foundation, Betsy Chance, awarded the Chester Gerdes Scholarship, The Robert and Winifred Read Law Scholarship and Health Scholarships. Don and Kate Maxwell presented the Don Maxwell Scholarship; Jayson Astel presented the

Georgianna Pollack Scholarship; Tony LaPorta presented the Harry Sturcke Scholarship; and Mary Ellen O'Boyle presented the Charles and Florence Wallace Scholarships. The two Wallace scholarships are 4 year scholarships for \$3,750 per year, totaling \$15,000 each.

The Rotary Club of Westfield was founded in 1921, 98 years ago. The next year, a young educator named Mabel Douglas spoke to the club about the value of educating women. Douglass College was named after her, and is now part of Rutgers University. In 1922 the Rotary Club started a loan program to students including women. When World War II came, the program stopped because everyone was going to war instead of college. After the War, College loans were not needed because of the GI bill. In 1967 the Rotary started the scholarship program and has given out approximately \$3.5 million. Over the past decades, benefactors have donated funds to either the Rotary Club Foundation to the Westfield Foundation for the purpose of creating scholarships as a legacy.

The Rotary Club of Westfield bestowed a Paul Harris Fellow as a posthumous honor on Dr. Derrick Nelson. Dr. Nelson was a veteran in the

Army Reserves and served in Kuwait. He was the Westfield High School Principal and died on April 8 from surgical complications after donating his bone marrow to a student he did not know. He was 44 years old. The Rotary Motto is "Service Above Self" and Dr. Nelson exemplified this principal of Service Above Self in his life and career. The presentation was made by Past District Governor Dr. D. Michael Hart, President elect Liz Ensslin and Rotary Club President Clark Lagemann. Paul Harris was the man who founded Rotary in 1905 in Chicago. It is now a worldwide service organization of 1.2 million business men and women in 166 countries.

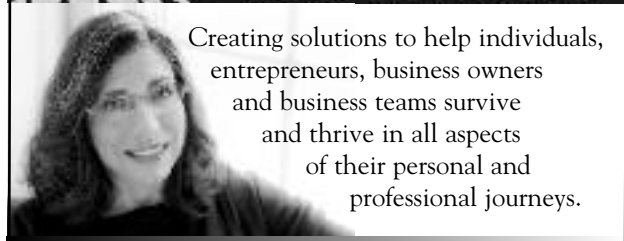

A SPECIAL HAIRCUT AT ROOSEVELT

Seven students, two teachers, and four hair stylists recently came together to donate more than 70 inches of hair to Maggie's Wigs 4 Kids, a Michigan-based non-profit organization that provides wigs and support services at no charge to children and young adults experiencing hair loss due to cancer, burns, and other disorders. 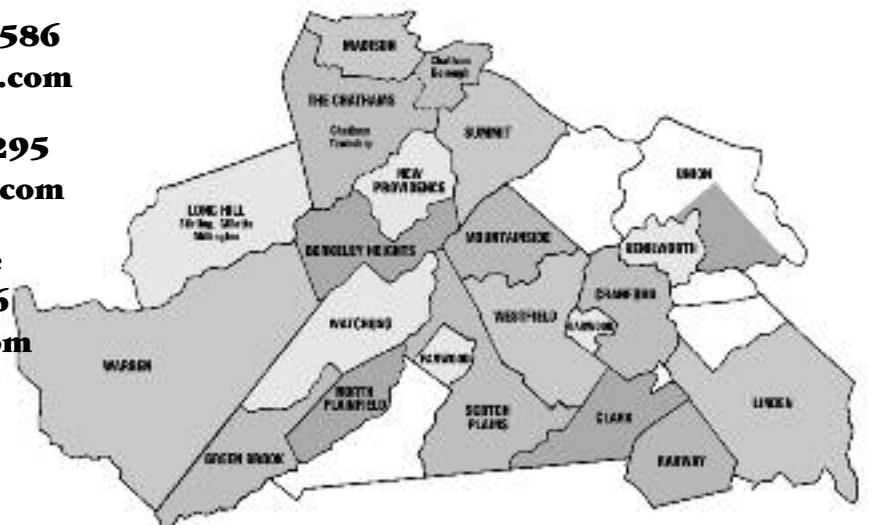
