



BOY SCOUTS GO FISHING TO EARN MERIT BADGES Submitted by John Cistaro were caught were big enough to allow the Scou

During the weekend of May 17 through May 19, 2019, the Scouts of Troop 145 in Clark, NJ traveled to Parvin State Park in Pittsgrove Township, NJ for a fishing trip to complete the requirements for their fishing merit badges. Scoutmaster Ted McKeown, along with fellow Scout leaders and dads, gave the boys a memorable trip full of camping, non-stop fishing and some friendly competition during a fishing derby.

Seven boys and six dads and Scout leaders were able to make the long drive to Parvin State Park. The Scouts set up camp at night on Friday and the dads cooked dinner for the boys. On Saturday, the Scouts got their fishing equipment and they set up on a floating dock on the lake near the campsite. During the fishing derby, which ran from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., Scout Nick Merola caught the first catch of the day, a small sunny. Scout Jack Costello caught a total of 8 fish, which was the most fish reeled in by a single boy that day. Scout Colin Pitta caught the biggest fish of the day, which was a 7 7/8 inch bass. Scout Xander Cistaro caught the smallest fish, a 4 inch sunny. Alexander Mirek caught the last fish of the day. The older Scouts, Kevin Quain and Sean Mirek, Jr., helped the younger Scouts rig their lines and, at times, bait their hooks and find fish. After the derby, it was hard to get the kids away from the lake as they continued to fish for the rest of the day. All fishing was catch and release.

Part of the requirements of the fishing merit badge involve having the Scouts clean, gut, cook and taste a fish that was caught during the day. Unfortunately, none of the fish that were caught were big enough to allow the Scouts to fulfill these requirements, so the boys received a partial completion of the merit badge work. Another trip would be needed to fully complete the merit badge requirements; however, the boys did not go home empty handed! Each of the boys who won in the derby received a small gift card.

Also, Union Sportsmen's Alliance, a non-profit organization with a mission to unite the Union community through conservation to preserve North America's outdoor heritage, generously donated Shakespeare fishing poles and drawstring bags full of gear including turkey calls, deer calls and other fun outdoor accessories, enough for the entire troop. U.S.A.'s contributions made the trip a real treat for the Scouts and Troop 145 appreciates their help in making the fishing trip a big success. Union members such as Scoutmaster Ted Mckeown, who represents Carpenters Local 254 of NJ, as well as Marty Costello, who represents PBA Local 76 of Springfield, NJ, were strong contributors to the trip, as were Scout Leaders Ed Merola and Sean Mirek, Sr. as well as volunteer dads John Cistaro and Tim Pitta.

The Union County chapter of NAMI/National Alliance on Mental Illness will once again be offering the Family to Family Education program beginning on Thursday, September 12, 2019. This is a free 11-week course structured to support caretakers of a loved one with a mental health illness. The F2F course is offered specifically to parents, siblings, spouses, teenage and adult children and significant others of individuals with a mental health diagnosis. The course is taught by a team of trained NAMI family members who themselves have taken the course to support a family member.

In a confidential setting, participants will learn how to understand and support their ill relative while maintaining their own well-being. Over an 11-week period, class participants will learn about the clinical treatment of mental illnesses, the biology of the brain, medications,

This Fall, The Gateway Family YMCA is launching the second session of Healthy Weight and Your Child, a family program designed to combat childhood obesity. Healthy Weight and Your Child is based on Mind, Exercise, Nutrition...Do It! (MEND), the most widely disseminated and extensively evaluated child weight-management program in the world. Research on the program model has shown statistically significant reductions in body mass index, waist circumference, and sedentary activities, and improvements in physical activity and self-esteem at six months-results that were sustained at 12 months. The program is designed to support youth and families as they seek to achieve positive change including the following goals: a reduction in the child's body mass index (BMI); the adoption of healthier eating habits by the family; an increase in daily physical activity; and improved self-esteem for participants.

"In response to this critical health care issue, Healthy Weight and Your Child (HWYC) is an evidence-based, weight-management program that seeks to empower children and families through education, healthy eating, and physical activity," stated Krystal R. Canady, CEO, The Gateway Family YMCA. "The program's goal is to elicit positive change and help families learn skills and behaviors that enable them to live a healthier lifestyle so that children enter adulthood at a healthy weight," stated Melynda A. Mileski, EVP/COO, The Gateway Family YMCA.

Childhood Obesity is a growing problem in the United States. More than one third of children and teenagers ages two to 19 are obese or overweight, and that rate has tripled in the past 30 years. Childhood obesity can have a harmful effect on the body in several ways, putting children at high risk to develop cardiovascular disease, diabetes, sleep apnea, asthma, joint problems, heartburn, and social and psychological problems. Obese children are more likely to become obese adults, leading to more serious health conditions including heart disease, diabetes and some cancers.

Through the leadership of trained Y staff, Healthy Weight and Your Child engages a child and adult as a pair so that, together, they can understand how the home environment and other factors influence choices that lead to a healthy weight. 

TEN VOLUNTEERS TRAIN TO SERVE AS ADVOCATES FOR FOSTER YOUTH

Submitted by Gretchen Boger-O'Bryan Eight municipalities are represented in the latest class of 10 volunteers to successfully train as advocates for Union County youth removed from home due to abuse or neglect, and now living in foster care. Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County is the only organization serving as extra eyes and ears for family law judges in an effort to protect best interests and ensure needs are met.

As the soon-to-be advocates arrived at the courthouse, Judge Richard Wischusen continued his practice of exiting his courtroom to greet and speak with the waiting volunteers. Later, while on the bench during the ceremony, he commended each for their commitment to the community's fragile child victims, and discussed the value of the CASA program to those children and case stakeholders, noting he always reads the CASA report and seeks their input during hearings.

Volunteers with varied backgrounds make successful advocates and this class, ages 24 to

71, is no exception. Each brings diverse experiences, including an adoptee, an adoptive parent, former military, immigrants, nonparents and parents, retirees, full- and part-time employees, and undergraduate and graduate students. Professional backgrounds include education, retail, nonprofit, information technology and academia. Most had no prior knowledge of the foster system.

The final step before meeting their assigned foster youth is observation of seasoned CASA volunteers in court. Once assigned to the case, a court order grants access to the child, foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers, enabling advocates to make informed recommendations in the child's best interests.

There are approximately 500 Union County youth from birth to age 21 in foster care, and more than 200 are waiting for a CASA volunteer. Is that you?
