NJ DEPT OF ED HONORS LINDEN AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAM

The New Jersey Department of Education has awarded a Certificate of Appreciation to the 21st Century Community Learning Center, an after-school and summer program serving the students of Soehl Middle School.

The award recognizes the 21st Century program and Director Isabella Scocozza for completing five years of successful grants management. The program is funded through a grant from the New Jersey Department of Education for \$425,000 a year, which covers the costs of staff and supplies, as well as a daily snack of a sandwich, juice and fruit for the students. Soehl just completed its 14th year in the program and its most recent five-year grant award.

"I am honored that our after-school program received the acknowledgement from the New Jersey Department of Education," Scocozza said. "Our program at Soehl Middle School services over one-third of the entire student population and provides a variety of extended enrichment opportunities for both students and families."

The after-school program runs until 6 p.m. each school day and includes an hour of tutoring and help with school work; an hour of enrichment in technology, the arts, and other areas; and an hour of recreation. The program also offers monthly family events and class trips.

In addition, the 21st Century program offers a summer STEM academy that provides enrichment programs and character education for about 60 students. The summer program runs four mornings a week for four weeks and is funded through the state's 21st Century grant as well as an additional IDEA Supplemental Grant Award of \$35,000.

"Congratulations to Miss Scocozza and the 21st Century program for this well-deserved honor from the Department of Education," said Acting Superintendent Denise Cleary. "The program is such a positive influence on students throughout the school year and into the summer. It boosts student achievement and enhances the family atmosphere at Soehl Middle School in so many ways. We are thankful to have this program."

Scocozza said the honor is a recognition for everyone who helps to support the program each year.

"This award represents the hard work and dedication of our staff and stakeholders in order to ensure a high-quality and well-rounded after-school program," she said.



BACCALAUREATE DIPLOMA GIVES TOP LINDEN GRADS A HEAD-START

Recent Linden High School graduates Piotr Zelazny and Muhsin Khan were honored on Tuesday, July 30, for attaining the prestigious International Baccalaureate (IB) diploma.

The IB diploma is the pinnacle of achievement in the high school's most rigorous course of study, offering those who achieve it up to a semester's worth of college credits.

This year's two winners are Muhsin Khan and Piotr Zelazny, who were also the valedictorian and salutatorian, respectively, of the Class of 2019. Zelazny was recognized at the monthly meeting of the Board of Education. Khan was unable to attend.

"This is an incredibly demanding course load and Piotr and Muhsin deserve to be commended on this wonderful achievement," said Acting Superintendent Denise Cleary. "They each have a great head-start on their studies in college because of the credits they have earned, as well as the experience they have gained in the program."

Each was given a certificate of excellence and an engraved desk clock with a globe design, symbolizing the global reach of the IB program. Zelazny was joined at the meeting by IB teacher Anthony Fischetti.

Students in the IB program take two years of high-level classes in six subject areas. They must also complete a university-level Theory of Knowledge class; a Creativity, Activity and Service community service project; and an extended essay. To attain an IB diploma, a student must pass challenging assessments in all six subject areas, which are graded by IB instructors from around the world.

Several hundred students have benefited from the IB program over the 17 years it has been offered at LHS.

"Students who go through the IB program say they are better prepared than many of their classmates in college because of the hard work they have to put in over their final two years at Linden High School," Cleary said.

Zelazny is attending Steven Institute of Technology in Hoboken and studying electrical engineering.

Khan will attend Rutgers University to study bioengineering with the goal of becoming an oral surgeon. He starts with 17 credits thanks to his IB diploma.



This year, the program was expanded to include an additional 15 participants, thanks to a generous donation by the Columbia Bank Foundation.





PRINCIPAL RETIRING AFTER 48 YEARS WITH LINDEN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

In 1971, Anthony Cataline had just graduated from Newark State College and was a student teacher at Roosevelt School in Rahway. Then he got a phone call that would change his life – and the lives of thousands of students in the Linden Public Schools.

It was A.R. Taranto, who had just taken the helm as superintendent in Cataline's hometown of Linden, calling with an offer for the young teacher.

"He said, 'I've got a job for you at Soehl Junior High School. Take it or leave it," Cataline recalled. "I needed a job, so I said, 'I'll take it."

Forty-eight years later, Newark State is Kean University, Soehl Junior High is Soehl Middle School, and Cataline is just wrapping up a career in Linden in which he worked at four different schools under six superintendents. He has been principal at School No. 10, McManus Middle School, and most recently at School No. 4, from which he retired at the end of this school year.

Acting Superintendent Denise Cleary said Linden Public Schools won't be the same without Cataline.

Cataline spoke with love for the students and staff of School No. 4, as well as the staff and residents of the Linden Housing Authority, which is just across the street on Dill Avenue. He especially praised the parents, who he said have become more participatory since he became principal in 2005. Cataline created a Fathers Club to help ensure the dads get more involved.

Cataline couldn't have guessed what lie ahead when he walked into Soehl on that first day in 1971

Cataline taught several core subjects at Soehl over the next 15 years, and was known by students as "Wolfman Jack," because his thick head of hair and full beard gave him a resemblance to the legendary radio DJ of the '70s.

He earned his master's degree in educational administration from Kean College in 1978, and in 1986 worked with school psychologist Tom Nappa on developing an alternative program for disaffected eighth-graders.

In 1986, he began a run where he worked at two schools he had attended as a student. He became at administrative aide at McManus in 1986, then in 1988, he became principal at School No. 10, where he stayed for 11 years.

While at School No. 10, Cataline introduced calculators and computers to the classrooms, was the first recipient of a family science grant, and supported the arts and the first social work program in Linden Public Schools. He was the first Linden principal to be appointed to the initial advisory committee for the Merck Institute for Science Education.

He returned to McManus as principal in 1999 and stayed there for six years.

In 2005, Cataline was named principal of School No. 4. While there, he established community partnerships with the Linden Housing Authority and Infineum in Linden. In addition,

he developed the Kiwanis K-Kids program, Safety Patrol, and Student of the Month recognition program. He also revamped the school's holiday shop, giving all students the opportunity to experience the magic of the holidays without the need for money.

Cataline credits his faculty and staff for implementing many of the advancements he has led. The feeling from the staff is mutual.

After 48 years of coming to work day after day, retirement is a big change. But after turning 70 in May, Cataline says it is clear to him that it's time to explore other adventures. And he says he never thought about trying to make it to 50 years.

He doesn't have a lot of plans, but he has a lot of options for his new free time. He's thinking of taking a class to learn Spanish, maybe getting his motorcycle license, or "just spending time on the beach with the binoculars and watching the dolphins.

But the outpouring of love and good wishes as he approached retirement helps to make the answer to that question clear.

There's the teacher from North Carolina who sent Cataline a card saying how much the time she spent with him when she was a student then as a teacher meant to her. "If it weren't for you, I wouldn't be the teacher I am today," she wrote.

There's the Linden police officer who told him that after being disciplined by Cataline at McManus, he never got in trouble again.

There's the 140 staff members, family, and friends who turned out for his retirement party.

There's the seventh-grader from Pennsylvania – a former School No. 4 student – who took the time to send him a card to thank him.

"So I guess I can look in the mirror and say I did some good along the way," Cataline said. "I guess how I lived my life meant something to somebody. So I guess I can leave head held high, feeling good about what I did for the last 48 years.

"It's been a nice career. A very nice career. I don't have one regret."




THE ROCK OPERA CHESS WILL OPEN CDC THEATRE'S 102ND SEASON
