The Madison Area Chamber of Commerce and Madison P.B.A. #92 are hosting their 27th Annual Madison Car Show on Saturday, October 5, 2019. This popular event runs in conjunction with Madison's Bottle Hill Day street festival. Madison Tire & Auto Repair, 285 Main St., is the event's main sponsor.

The Madison Car Show is held in the parking lot of the Madison Volunteer Ambulance Corps headquarters at the corner of Kings Road and Prospect Street. The event site is a short walk from the Bottle Hill Day festivities, which are centered in Madison's business district.

One of the most prestigious automotive events in New Jersey, the Madison Car Show features many vehicles in several classes, including hot rods, trucks, customs, antiques, classics and street machines. There is no set price for fan admission, but donations are encouraged and generously accepted at the gate.

Peter Daniele, the proprietor of Rose City Collision, 291 Main Street, is the long-time chair of the Madison Car Show committee. Daniele is also a vice president of the Madison Area Chamber of Commerce, an independent, non-profit business league.

"We have organized this car show for 27 years and we're expecting several hundred car enthusiasts to enjoy the sparkle, shine and spectacle of dozens and dozens of unique automobiles and trucks right here in our hometown, the Rose City, for one day only," said Daniele. "The site of the car show is located between the Madison's Borough Hall and the Madison Public Safety Building on the corner of Prospect St."

"Along with attracting great cars and producing a very festive atmosphere the day of the event, the Madison Car Show showcases the businesses of our local automotive industry and helps to raise the prestige of the community," said John Morris, co-owner of Stewart-Morris Awards, Gifts & Flags, of 71 Kings Road. Morris is also the president of the Madison Area Chamber of Commerce.

The Madison Car Show begins at 9 a.m. The awards ceremony starts at 3:00 p.m. To be eligible for judging and prizes, all cars must arrive at the show no later than 11:00 a.m.

DJ Jimmy Givens, aka "The Oldies Maven," will spin the music of the 50's, 60's and 70's. A volunteer cooking crew from the Madison Fire Department will provide refreshments. On-street parking is free in Madison.

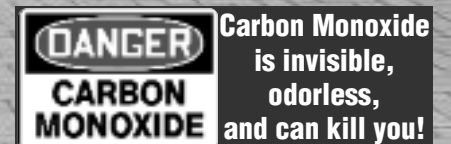

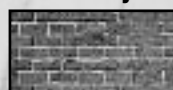

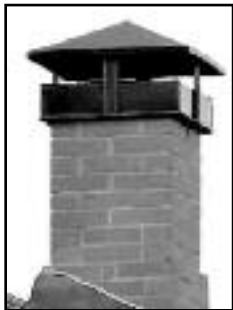

MORRIS COUNTY PARK COMMISSION RECEIVES PRESTIGIOUS GRANT

The National Endowment for the Humanities announced its award to the Morris County Park Commission of the prestigious Preservation Assistance Grant for their project, 'Sustainable Management of Collections Environments with Limited Controls.'

This \$10,000 award will support the assessment and monitoring of storage environments for collections maintained in three Morris County Park Commission sites. Maintaining optimal collections environments is important to the long-term preservation of Morris County's valuable artifacts, but for many historic structures with limited controls, there have not been many options to intervene.

Working in partnership with the Image Permanence Institute, Rochester Institute of Technology, the Morris County Park Commission can now explore sustainable and low-cost solutions for maintaining appropriate temperature and humidity conditions for artifacts in buildings without HVAC, and in some cases, no electricity. The grant funds will support a three-day site visit to assess and survey 10 buildings with varying environmental controls. It will also support the purchase of e-Climate Notebook monitoring equipment, and the training of staff in using this data analysis software.

According to Melanie Bump, Curator of Collections and Exhibits of the Morris County Park Commission, "This award is important to the people of Morris County as valuable assets, which include a collection of artifacts relating to the 300 years of Morris County history, will be preserved."

She added, "It will also inform new sustainable practices in environmental management of collections storage, impacting collections stewardship around the world."

Dave Helmer, Executive Director of the Morris County Park Commission, added, "We

should celebrate that Morris County received this most competitive and sought-after grant as it demonstrates the critical importance of this project and the Park Commission's stewardship responsibility of local, regional and even national historical and cultural artifacts."

The National Endowment for the Humanities received 102 eligible applications, and 45 Preservation Assistance Grants were awarded across the country. The Morris County Park Commission is one of only two institutions in New Jersey this year to receive this grant, and were funded at the full amount. The Endowment awards grants to top rated proposals examined by panels of independent, external reviewers. There are four levels of review before a grant is officially supported, including a final review by the NEH chairman.

Cultural institutions, such as museums, archives, libraries, colleges and universities, public television, and individual scholars are all eligible for grant funding through the NEH.

Created in 1965 as an independent federal agency, the National Endowment for the Humanities supports research and learning in history, literature, philosophy, and other areas of the humanities by funding selected, peer-reviewed proposals from around the nation. 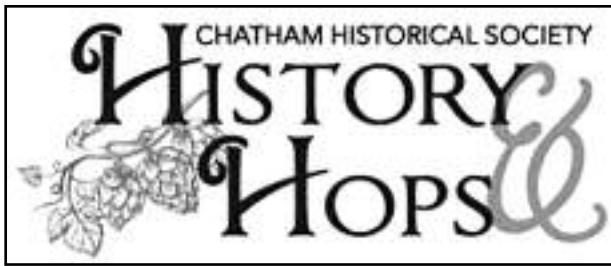

CHATHAM HISTORICAL SOCIETY'S 4TH ANNUAL HISTORY & HOPS EVENT

Everyone is welcome to attend the Chatham Historical Society's 4th Annual History & Hops event to celebrate Chatham's Main Street. This casual event will take place on Friday, October 25, 2019 at 7:30 p.m. at the Fish & Game Club on Fairmount Avenue.

Chatham's first Main Street was carved by the Lenni Lenapi tribe as they made their yearly journey from the mountains to the shore and back again. The path they followed was called the Minisink Trail and the river they crossed they called Fishawack. The first known settlers in Chatham were John and Daniel Day. They were farmers, but because of the location of their property near the river, they became merchants. They built Day's Tavern, which was a stopping place for people coming from the east and west. This was the first establishment on Main Street.

In 1868, Chathamites were still mainly farmers and the town had a population of about 700



citizens. But the railroad was starting to change things. Trains stopped in Chatham to uncouple cars carrying coal so they could make it up the steep incline to Summit. The trains also brought vacationers to Chatham for its "salubrious air". Other trades and businesses became necessary. Hotels and boarding houses were built. Liverymen were needed to take visitors from the depot to the hotels and boarding houses. Horses and wagons were needed to carry freight from the depot to local businesses. Masons, carpenters and plumbers were needed for the new homes being

built. By the end of the nineteenth century, Chatham's Main Street had changed from a dirt path to a bustling small town center.

If this story piqued your interest, the Chatham Historical Society invites you to attend the 4th annual History & Hops where the story of Main Street will continue. Along with vintage Chatham photos and more historic information about Main Street, there will be delicious food, wine and, of course, beer. Live entertainment will be provided by "Unplugged," the band of Chatham's own Mike McLaughlin, Sal Arnuk, and Chris Tomaino. See old friends, make new ones and raise your glass to Chatham's history.

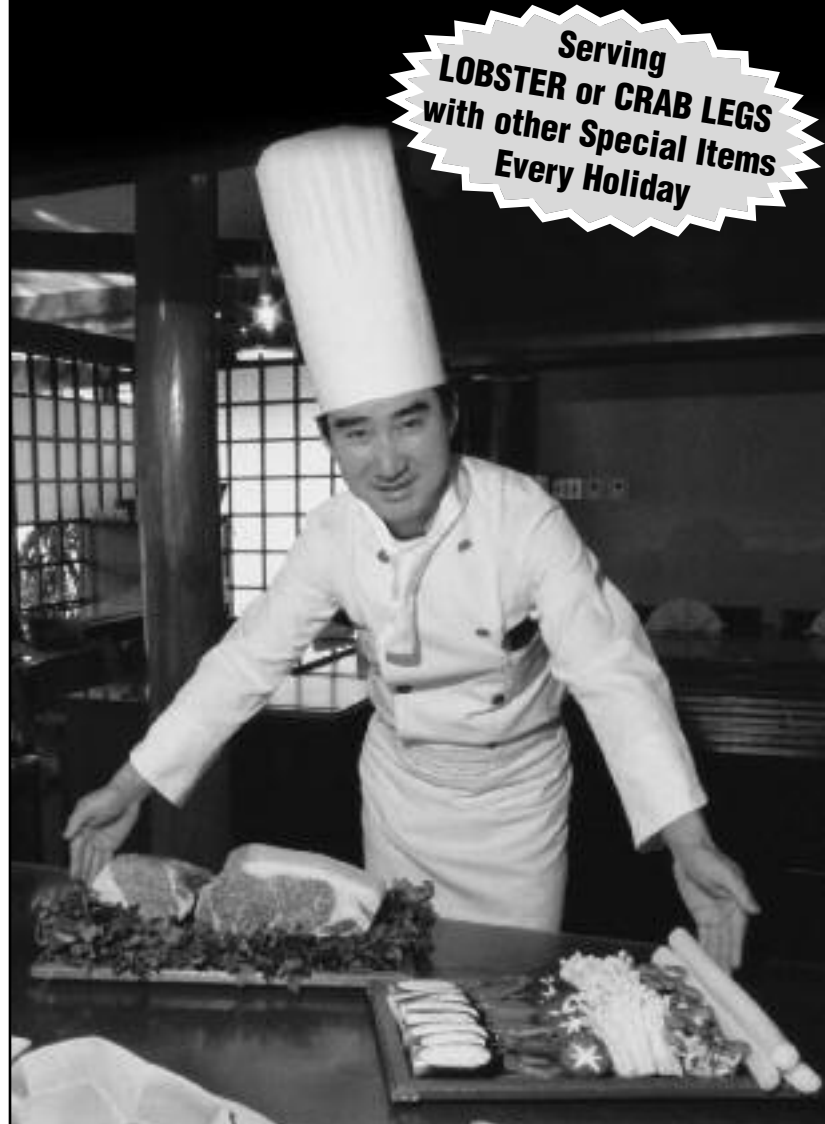

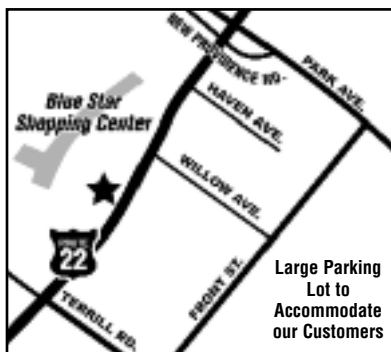
