RAHWAY'S FREDDIE RUSSO WAS AMONG BOXING ELITE IN 1940S

Freddie Russo, considered one of the classiest boxer-punchers of the era (1942-1951), was the only professional boxer from Rahway to take a shot at becoming a world boxing champion. In his outstanding career, Russo compiled a record of 102 wins, 14 losses, and four draws. After joining the professional ranks in 1943, he went undefeated in his first fifty-one bouts.

Born in Rahway on October 3, 1925, Freddie's introduction to fighting began at age four when his older brother, Danny, who himself would become a pretty good amateur boxer, bought him a pair of regulation boxing gloves. Almost immediately, the young boy thrust his hands in the gloves and began exchanging blows with his older sibling. Once in grammar school, it would become an all too common occurrence for Freddie to get into afterschool scrapes with his schoolmates. After having bested the boys of similar age who dared to take him on, he soon challenged older boys and trounced them in like manner. With his parents and teachers at their wits end on how to quell his aggressive spirit, his father enrolled him in the PAL Recreation Boxing Program held at the old firehouse/police station on Main Street. The training suited the

young boxer who in an early interview for Ring Magazine would state, "The truth is, I had fighting on my mind all the time. All I thought about ever since I could think was that I wanted to become a prizefighter."

In January, 1942, at age seventeen and still in his senior year of high school, Freddie joined the amateur ranks. During a fifteen-month stint on the amateur level, he fought a total of twelve bouts, winning all twelve. His success did not go unnoticed and he was soon touted as one of the best amateurs ever developed in New Jersey. He ended this first stage of his boxing career having won four Golden Gloves Championships and the N. J. 118 lb. Championship. He was also the recipient of the prestigious Diamond Belt.

Russo moved up to the professional ranks on April 7, 1943 and in his first bout, scored a TKO victory over Ike Roland. After this initial win, he would go undefeated in his next fifty bouts. In his fourteenth pro bout, he won the New Jersey Featherweight Championship with a second round KO over George Knox. Russo, who often gave the press good copy for their

articles, angered the Boxing Commission when he gave the belt that was presented to him in the ring to his opponent saying, "I don't want to be Featherweight Champion of New Jersey. It's the World Championship that I'm after." At the time, Freddie was managed by Irving Cohen, one of the best in the business, and trained by Whitey Bimstein and Dan Florio. Rocky Graziano, a popular middleweight, was a stablemate of Russo.

By the beginning of 1945, Russo was getting more and more attention from the boxing press. A Boxing News article from that year noted that Freddie was, "One of the most sought after scrappers in the ring today. Not only because of his undefeated record, but also because of his aggressive, two-fisted style of fighting. He is strongly and solidly built and is on the move all the time. He has a dangerous left hook and is willing to mix it with good ring opponents."

Russo finally got his chance at the World Title when he fought the reigning National Boxing Association Champ, Sal Bartolo on July 27, 1945 at Madison Square Garden. Although Russo lost the ten round decision, he impressed the crowd of over 15,000 Garden fans by giving Bartolo all he could handle. The loss was Freddie's first professional set back.

Freddie Russo would never win a world championship, a prize that eluded him on two separate occasions by the narrowest of margins, but he did defeat four world champions during his career. His proudest win was his fiftieth straight victory when he defeated Vince Del Orto, the European featherweight and lightweight champion. His notable ring achievements include N. J. 126 lb. Champion (1944-1949), being named the New York Journal's Fighter of the Year (1945), undefeated in 51 consecutive fights, defeated four world champs, member of the New Jersey Boxing Hall of Fame, the Italian American Hall of Fame, and the Veteran Boxer's Association of N.Y. and N.J.

Russo resided in Rahway for fifty-five years. He died in 1987.

PUMPKINS

Pumpkins are native to North America where seeds have been found in Mexican graves and temples dating back five to seven thousand years ago. Up north, pumpkins were grown by Native Americas for hundreds of years before the first European settlers arrived here.

The America Indians created a farming technique called "The three sisters". Corn was grown in the same plot as beans and squash. The corn would grow tall and the beans would use it as a trellis. The pumpkins and squash were planted at the base and would discourage raccoons and other critters from eating the corn and beans. The Natives later taught this practice to the Pilgrims. Without pumpkins it is doubtful any of the Pilgrims would have survived the first long winter.

In later years the Pilgrims would carve out pumpkins, fill them with milk and bake them until they turned in a rich, flavorful custard. This tradition later became today's pumpkin pies. Sugar pumpkins are the smaller orange pumpkins used to make pumpkin pie.

Pumpkins and other winter squash are easy to grow if you give them their basic requirements, warm rich soil, heavy but even moisture, lots of sun and most importantly, plenty of space to spread out and grow. If they outgrow their space your can turn the growing tips towards where you want them to grow. When harvesting leave at least one inch of stem attached and let your pumpkins sit in the sun for ten days to cure them before storing them.

Our modern Halloween tradition of carving out pumpkins began in ancient Ireland. The Celtic people believed the dead arose from their graves every year on October 31. To ward off evil, people carved faces into rutabaga or turnips, beets or potatoes and put them in windows and at their doors. Even the name Jack-O-Lantern is derived from Irish lore and folktales. When our Irish immigrants arrived in America, they brought these traditions with them and quickly learned pumpkins are much easier to carve out.

Today pumpkins can be found in a variety of sizes, from the massive orange pumpkins to jackbe-little, which can fit in the palm of your hand. Color choices now start at white, then orange, and blended. There are even pumpkins with warts for folks looking for something different.

Selecting a pumpkin is often a family event with everyone going to a local farm to make their selections. When choosing your pumpkin pay attention to the stem. Pumpkins with stems last longer; long or curved stems add character to the pumpkin.

A pumpkin placed by a door or in front of a house today has come to symbolize the autumn season, good fortune and prosperity.

Brooklyn creates cut-out complicated designs exhibit by two recent series' work: Fashion Warriors and Dancers. Nicholas Rosal, an owner of Atelier Rosal Gallery & Framing Shop on Cherry street in downtown Rahway, is represented by paintings that often combine visual elements to create compound and complex images with an allegorical focus. Jo-EL Lopez is a painter well known around Newark and points north whose colorful work frequently makes comments about or refers to social issues confronting us. Joe Velez' work is based on classical techniques producing images of people which have a profound and moving presence. Miguel Trelles, a New York artist, is often influenced by Mayan and Indo-Chinese art. Vazquez has created stunning paintings that at times are inspired by ancient and modern myths. Maria Mijares is represented in the exhibit by paintings of the ship, the SS United States. Her work uses her many voyages on ships to define her personal history through the images of on which she has sailed.

The Arc of Union County was founded in 1949 when a group of concerned parents of children with intellectual and developmental disabilities gathered by the collective desire for their children to lead fulfilling lives and thrive in their communities, instead of being subject to institutions with harsh living conditions. Seven decades ago, there was much to learn about intellectual and developmental disabilities (then referred to as 'mental retardation'), the people, their families and the causes. There were virtually no programs or services to assist people with disabilities in the community or to support their families. It was a common occurrence for doctors to tell parents that the best place for their child was in an institution. This group of parents was granted a temporary charter by the "New Jersey Parents' Group for Retarded Children", and what is now known as The Arc of Union County was designated the Union County Unit of that Organization. Seventy years later, The Arc has become a local pioneer within Union County and its surrounding areas.

To commemorate this major milestone, The Arc of Union County will hold their landmark event, "Celebrating 70 Years: Autumn & The Arc," on October 3, 2019 from 6-9 p.m. at the Stage House Tavern located at 1099 Route 22, Mountainside, NJ. The event will feature three hours of unlimited food, wine and beer, live music, and high value raffle items, including a cruise to Bermuda. Over 100 community partners and supporters are anticipated to join The Arc in their celebration of 70 years of service. All proceeds of this event will benefit the continuation of programs and services provided by The Arc. AT-RISK YOUTH HEAR STORY OF PERSONAL PERSEVERANCE

One evening El-Amin Jumuah mapped out his strategy for building his fledgling fashion business, including financing it with the salary from his job. The next day he was laid off.

Four years later, Jumuah's business, Passionate Rebel, is thriving and has been featured on News 12 New Jersey's Spotlight Edition and various New York Fashion Week media platforms.

Jumuah served as the keynote speaker at the 2019 Annual Youth Conference hosted by Community Access Unlimited (CAU) that drew more than 100 at-risk youth from more than a dozen youth services programs from throughout the state. CAU is a Union County-based, statewide nonprofit that strives to integrate people with disabilities and at-risk youth into the general community through comprehensive supports.

"The conference is designed to bring together youth from a number of programs, allow them to network and provide them with information and resources, thereby empowering them," said Carla Hollinger, a curriculum specialist at CAU. "It's a day of fun and education."

Jumuah's apparel is intended to create selfdirected leaders who, with their independent passion, will enhance their creative skills and rebel against not following their passion, according to the Passionate Rebel website.

"Be a passionate rebel," he told the youth. "Be someone who is dedicated to following your goals regardless of the obstacles. Be a dreamer. Understand dreams take you far but they depend on the time and effort you put into them."

Jumuah said to be successful they first must define their own success. For example, a single mother might define success as caring for her children while a college student might define success as working his way through college and graduating. Success is not defined by money and material belongings, he said.

Jumuah's message resonated with the youth in attendance, including Romance Morrison, 21, a CAU member.

"He really got through to me about how he started his own business out of nothing," Morrison said, adding that he has set his goals for success as going to college, getting a good job and starting a family.

The conference also featured a number of workshops designed to help the attendees better manage their lives and improve their life skills, according to Hollinger. Examples included goal setting, healthy relationships and living within the system.

"The workshops are intended to prepare them for life going forward," she said.
