The Chatham Township Volunteer Fire Department (CTVFD) is pleased to announce that Matthew Shockling, Michael Vintzel and Kyle Koehler recently obtained Junior Firefighter 1 Certifications from the Morris County Public Safety Training Academy this summer. The Junior Firefighter 1 Program is a nationally recognized, rigorous 5-week course that introduces participants to the basic skills of firefighting through both classroom sessions and hands-on training. This program is designed to allow members of the fire department under the age of 18 to obtain all the necessary training to become a certified firefighter in New Jersey. Once these members turn 18, they will each receive the official Firefighter 1 Certificates from the State of New Jersey and will be certified firefighters.

Chief Matthew Lemons explained, "the CTVFD is fortunate to have a strong junior firefighting program." Over the years, many junior members have continued their interest in public service by pursuing careers as firefighters and police officers, both within this state and

throughout the country. "We are proud that Matthew, Michael and Kyle have continued this strong tradition and we know they will be valuable members of our department," said Chief Lemons.

The junior program at the Chatham Township Volunteer Fire Department program is open to young men and women ages 16 and 17 years. 

CHATHAM TOWNSHIP BEGINS PHASE 2 OF ITS PILOT COMMUTER SHUTTLE PROGRAM

Following the overwhelming interest in its initial survey of residents on the possibility of establishing a park-and-ride commuter shuttle for Chatham Township residents, the Chatham Township Committee is taking the next step and launching a second survey to better understand the level of commitment among residents in actually utilizing the privately-run service.

Chatham Township Committeeman Curt Ritter said, "The Chatham Township Committee is launching Phase 2 of the proposed Chatham Township Pilot Commuter Shuttle Program that is designed to help address the perennial issue Chatham Township residents encounter every day when trying to park at the Chatham Borough train station.

"I encourage residents who are serious about utilizing this privately-run commuter service to complete the survey (https://bit.ly/30OLSNG), which was prepared in conjunction with TransOptions. We are interested in knowing how many residents will actually utilize the service and the frequency of their usage before formally launching the pilot program, which could begin as early as mid-November depending upon the responses we receive. This initiative, which offers approximately 72 parking spaces between Christ Church and Shunpike Field, will serve as a small step in addressing an issue that has confronted Township residents for years. The Chatham Historical Society is hosting a "Space Race" presentation by Kevin Woyce on Sunday, November 10, 2019 at 3 p.m. at the Library of the Chathams, 214 Main Street, Chatham. The event is free to the public and light refreshments will be served. Woyce is an author, photographer, and lecturer specializing in regional American history.

The event coincides with the celebration of the 50th anniversary of the Apollo 11 Moon landing in July 1969. Woyce's presentation is packed with historic photographs and vintage concept
